

#### **Reviewing the situation**

Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2017... an important day for two reasons. As we know, there is to be a general election, and all over again many of us will gladly exercise our democratic right to vote for the person whom we wish to represent us here in the constituency of Central Devon. What a privilege! I say gladly, but perhaps this time round, like me, you've got a touch of voter fatigue. I sense there is quite a bit of it around, for good or for ill. It really doesn't seem very long ago since the last time. Nevertheless, after some "considering" and "reviewing" I will cast my vote on June 8<sup>th</sup> in thankfulness for the relative prosperity, stability and peace that we enjoy here in the UK, resolving again to pray for those in authority over us, as the Bible says.

But as you can probably tell, there is something else happening that day. As I cast my vote I will also be psyching myself up to yet again take the stage with the St. Peter's Troupers for the opening night of the show "Oliver!" In fact, it's a very good thing Oliver is being staged in St. Peter's Church and not the Town Hall as one might expect, or else as the final voters of the day review their ballot cards so will Fagin be taking the stage to "review the situation."

Oliver has been months in the planning. It involves some 50 adults or so, and about 25 children from North Tawton Community Primary School. Cast and crew are a mixture of regular church members from across our four churches, and those for whom this is their first involvement in something that the church is doing. We are really glad that the idea has captured the imagination of so many, as Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat and Another Story Begins did in previous years. As I write, I know that the Friday and Saturday evening performances are almost sold out. So do get your tickets ASAP from North Tawton Post Office. Performances are on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> June (7.30pm), Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June (7.30pm), and Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> June (2.30pm and 7.30pm), £5 adults and £3 under 16's. It promises to be a great show.

You might ask, "Why is a church doing a musical like "Oliver?" Good question. I've asked it myself a few times, not least when trying to learn my lines. I think there are three main reasons. The first is the same as it would be for any drama group putting on a show: it's great fun to be creative, to express talents and to do something together, and Oliver is a particularly fun show. "Food Glorious Food", "Consider Yourself", "Oom-Pah-Pah!" Fagin, the Artful Dodger and bad Bill Sikes... what's not to like? The second reason is that we have found that putting on shows has really had a positive effect on the ministry of our churches in the community. Indeed, it really wouldn't be worth all the Rev'd Nick Weldon (Vicar) time and effort had they not had such an impact. For example, the shows have deepened the church's

relationship with the primary school; we have been able to welcome lots of people into St. Peter's who never usually come; friendships have been made, and in some cases cast and crew have found the shows to have made life-changing differences in some other area of their lives. It has helped some cope with loneliness, shyness or a long-term illness. The third reason we do these shows is the chance to make ourselves, and hopefully our audience, think about some of the major themes of life in this world. For in most stories there is life, death, love, hate, regret, and redemption.

In June, we have again the opportunity to "review the situation" and cast our vote. "Reviewing the situation" is a theme in the show. It's Fagin's signature tune - the lovable, father-like, rogue who leads the gang of pickpocketing boys that Oliver joins for a while. In Charles Dicken's Oliver Twist, from which the musical is derived, Fagin is a far less lovable character. There's real menace about him as he manipulates young homeless boys to steal for him. In Oliver Twist he ends up paying for his crimes rather than walking off into the sunset, as he does in the musical. But the musical version of Fagin is perhaps a little easier to relate to. He's closer, I think, to the likes of you and me.

In the song "reviewing the situation", Fagin imagines going straight and leaving behind his life of crime. He longs to settle down with a wife. He longs for redemption, wishing to make an honest man of himself. But, aged seventy, he worries that it might be too late for him and that no one cares for him. His only consolation is the money he's (illegitimately) put aside. It's a bittersweet moment in the show. In actual fact, Fagin is not really "reviewing the situation" at all. He's reviewing himself, and as he does so he faces up to his regrets, his old age, and his loneliness. This is where the fun musical chimes with the harsh realities of life today. For the world of Dickensian London – petty crime, prostitution and poverty - may seem a long way away to us, but in the end, the story is merely about a set of very different people each trying to find their way in life. Oliver himself asks the question at the heart of the story, as he sings, "Where is love?" He longs for a mother and a family, but one can't help but feel that these can fail too. Perhaps then it is only beyond this life where true love and full redemption can be found. It might be too late for Fagin to redeem himself on earth but it is never too late for heavenly redemption, if reviewing would lead on to repenting. For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16).



#### North Devon Biosphere



If you live in North Tawton, you will surely be aware that you are not in a National Park, or even an official Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Some of you will feel that you could not afford that, as nowadays property in Dartmoor is considerably more expensive than outside. However, you may not be aware that you do live within a designated area that in one sense 'outranks' either of these, because it is an international designation by UNESCO and is the North Devon World Biosphere Reserve, which includes all the land that drains to either the River Taw or the River Torridge, plus the sea area out to include Lundy. World-wide there are 669 World Biosphere Reserves and North Devon was the first in England.

The original focus of nature conservation here was the fine set of sand-dunes at Braunton Burrows, to the north of the mouth of the Taw, but experts in the Man and the Biosphere programme came to realise that nature reserves with tight boundaries were of limited value. Birds, insects and animals cross boundaries only too easily, and it became all too easy for ecologists to keep people out (and in the end they depend upon people to fund nature conservation). Even more important the reserves are part of systems ....... water and air flow into the area and out again. So, for example, serious pollution up the Taw will impact quite quickly on the wildlife of the Burrows, while sand may be blowing the other way.

The solution is to make the Biosphere reserves much bigger and in Devon they took the decision, which is obviously the best scientifically, to include all the land that drains to the two rivers. Of course, politics and science do not always meet, and the District Council boundaries do not recognise the watershed. Consequently North Devon and Torridge District Councils are almost all within the area, and the Biosphere is most grateful for their support over a decade and more. But a good deal of the area lies within West Devon (including of course Okehampton and a triangle of Dartmoor up towards Cranmere Pool) and a smaller amount within Mid-Devon. Braunton Burrows is the Core Zone, the coastal AONBs form a Buffer Zone, while the rest of us are within a Transition Zone. It has taken a long time to fund signs saying 'You are now entering / leaving the UNESCO North Devon World Biosphere Reserve' but we will get there soon.

How can this help places such as North Tawton? Obviously as West Devon does not contribute to Biosphere funds there is no pot of money to dip into. In fact there is scarcely a pot for anyone; the funding covers only our small staff. The old system where both funds and official powers were given to a team (as with a National park) who could then direct how things must be done has been abandoned. The new technique is for local people to decide what needs to be done, and use Biosphere expertise to seek funding and experience. But being within the zone should help to 'leverage' other funds. If you have a project of environmental concern (not just wildlife but perhaps energy conservation) then it certainly does no harm to have our letterhead as a banner. Usually we are trying to link our superb environment to make it work for our economy.

There have been many projects, including improving some of our roadside verges, trying to breed the Freshwater Pearl Mussel (which inhabits our streams but does not breed because of water quality), establishing Marine Conservation Zones, restoring Culm grassland and supporting sustainable tourism. We are very happy to arrange a meeting with local people (possibly Parish Councillors, but probably better as open meetings) but please be warned: because we try very hard to make this the opposite of a top down process, it means that we are likely to turn up with a notebook and listen to your environmental concerns, not stand out in front telling you what you ought to be doing.



#### Concert at Fairplace Church on Saturday 1st July at 7:30pm

English Music from the end of the 17th century and Italian music from the early 18th century will be performed by the Okehampton Choral Society and the Two Rivers Orchestra (leader Mark Dicken) conducted by Richard Edwards.

Settings will be heard by Henry Purcell of the Te Deum and Jubilate, first heard in 1694 to celebrate the feast day of St. Cecilia, the patron saint of music. There will also be a setting of words taken from Psalm 3 and the closing scene of Purcell's opera "Dido and Aeneas". The Italian contribution to the evening will be "Gloria" by Antonio Vivaldi.

The choir and orchestra will be joined by soloists Emily Owen, and Rebecca Hardwick from London, Laurence Blyth and Andrew Henley from Exeter and Paul Bright and Jacob Dennison from Truro Cathedral.


