From The Rectory

So how did it go?... again

This me last year I gave over my "From the Rectory" page to repor ng back on a selec on of the numerous events that had occurred across our community in Spring 2016. "So how did it go?" the ar cle was called, because it's the ques on I get asked all the me. I've been asked it again many a time over the last few weeks. So it seemed fitting to answer the ques on, "so how did it go?..." again, and also to take the opportunity to flag up a few important summer events coming up.

Firstly, what is coming up? Answer... lots of things around the community, but here are a few... This issue might just land on your doormat in me to men on the Friends of North Tawton School June Jamboree (Saturday 24th June 11am-2pm at the primary school). It is the school's largest fund raising and social event of the year. The next day (Sunday 25th June) there is the Patronal Service at St. Peter's Church North Tawton at 11am, and the Sampford Courtenay Open Gardens day (11am – 6pm). It will cost you £5 to view all the beau ful gardens that will be open all over the village, with proceeds being shared between the Village Hall and St. Andrew's Church. At the end of that week there is the Grand Summer Ball in the newly extended Sampford Courtenay Village Hall (7pm Friday 30th June). Then the next weekend St. Andrew's Church will hold it's annual Summer Fete in the village centre and Church Rooms (Saturday 8th July 2-4pm). Later in July, St. Peter's Church North Tawton will hold it's summer fete here in the our garden (Saturday 15th July 2.30pm-5pm at the Rectory). Then, as the school term draws to a close, life quietens down a touch in terms of local events, at least, although many in our community will be very busy with the harvest throughout the rest of the summer. There is a wedding in North Tawton on Saturday 22nd July (Daryl Clark and Jess Kno), and the Patronal Service at St. James' Church Bondleigh will take place on Sunday 30th July at 11am. For that service we will be welcoming back a former Rector of these parishes, the Venerable Mark Butchers. Mark and his family le here in 1999 but came back to Exeter Diocese in 2015 as he took up his post as Archdeacon of Barnstaple. As I flick through my dairy into August there is, mercifully, a reassuring lack of scribbles on some pages, and one scribble says "holiday". Bring it on! I dare not turn over to look at September.

"So how did it go?" Let's tackle that ques on now. The Bondleigh Plant Sale on 27th May was a great success. Lots of the village turned up, and not a few from elsewhere too. Many a tomato plant was bought, and lots of other more exo c things as well. I stuck with the tomato plants... quite hard to go wrong with them, but that won't stop me trying. Over £800 was raised for the church hea ng and ligh ng project. North Tawton Bowling Club has o cially opened

their new club house. Unfortunately, the opening fell on the same day as the next event I shall men on, so I have yet to see inside the new facility. However, I have enjoyed watching it being built from across the fence at the end of our garden. I'm sure the club house will be a great asset to the town as well as the bowling club itself.

On the 8th, 9th and 10th June just fewer than 500 people came to see the musical "Oliver", which was staged in spectacular style in St. Peter's Church. It was a great success, and all involved must be congratulated on such a wonderful show. I wrote about it last month in an cipa on of the four performances, saying how much the 100 or so cast and crew were looking forward to pu ng it on (75 adults and 25 children). The audiences and we were not disappointed. The posi ve comments have flooded in since about the quality of the produc on and about how much local talent we have in our area, adults and children alike. One audience member commented to me how impressed he was with the way the church had been adapted to stage the show, and how much he enjoyed seeing the crew at work throughout the show as well as the cast. I had the privilege of being in the show myself, playing the nasty Bill Sikes. I can't tell you how much I enjoyed playing "the bad guy!" I just hope that I didn't scare too many children in the process. My two year old daughter is now just about happy to be in the same room as me.

One spin off from Oliver was that in the week running up to the shows, when I was "unavailable" to do my usual weekly Vicar's assembly at North Tawton Primary School, Bill Sikes took assembly for me. I am very grateful to him. He really has changed since that unfortunate incident with Nancy! Miraculously, he had come back to life too. At assembly, he taught the children about the 6th Commandment, "Do not murder." Apparently he was "quite good, but a bit scary" according to the children. I dare not ask what the head teacher thought.

The four Oliver shows also raised a total of £940 for each of the two designated charies, Children's Relief Bethlehem (which runs the Caritas Baby Hospital in Bethlehem) and St Petrocks (which works with the homeless and vulnerably housed in Exeter). Thank you to everyone involved in such a great church, school and community project. Thank you so much to the audiences who came to see our show.

Lots to look back on. Lots to give thanks for. Lots to look forward to.





Vacancy on North Tawton Town Council

Any persons willing to fill this vacancy should apply to the PLEASE NOTE- clean plastic food & household Clerk, in writing, on or before Monday 3rd July 2017.

The applicants must be qualified for election and must. All plastic bottles should be left for West Devon Council's not be disqualified from being a Councillor (see below)

The Town Council will decide the filling of this vacancy by co-option at its forthcoming meeting on Tuesday 4th July 2017.

Qualifications to be a Councillor

A person is qualified to be elected and to be a councillor if they are a British, Commonwealth, Irish or European Union citizen and on the relevant day (that is, the day of nomination or election) they are 18 or over. In addition, the person must meet at least one of the following criteria (1) on the relevant day and thereafter they continue to be on the electoral register for the parish, or (2) during the whole of the twelve months before that day they have owned or tenanted land or premises in the parish, or (3) during the whole of the twelve months before that day their principal or only place of work has been in the parish, or (4) during the whole of the twelve months before that day they have resided in the parish or within three miles of it. Except for qualification (1), these qualifications then continue for the full term of office, until the next ordinary elections. Certain people are disqualified from standing, and these include paid officers (including the Clerks) of the council, bankrupts and those subject to recent sentences of imprisonment.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

At our A.G.M. last meeting the following were elected to the Committee.

Sue Parkes, **President**; Jan Gray, **Vice-President**; Jane Hunt-Webb, **Secretary**; Pat Richardson, **Treasurer**; Carolyn Knapman, Jo Fear, Celia Boughton and Sandy Eakers

The Speaker this month was our own Jan Gray, a specialist in weight management, who gave a talk about the problems of working with obesity and how to steer those who came within a high body mass index (b.m.i.) range towards healthier eating and, more importantly, to maintain a more healthy diet.

Jan is a psychotherapist and gave an interesting talk on the various methods which have been tried to tackle obesity, especially for people with morbid obesity, which is extremely difficult to address. She spoke also about educating people away from the lifestyles they have previously followed and which are the cause obesity.

In 2001 the Government identified the obesity crisis in certain areas and funding was set aside to address the problem. This ranged from educating people to adopt healthier eating plans and more exercise, besides helping people on a 1:1 basis, as this was more likely to give them encouragement to start dieting than if they were surrounded by other people and feeling "judged". The Councillors also used a method of identifying something good about the person—their eyes for instance. Our speaker told us about a client she had encouraged to concentrate on her very beautiful eyes and to use them as a starting point for making her feel good about herself.

There is no easy fix regarding exceptional weight gain and our speaker said that Councillors could only encourage healthier lifestyles through eating, exercise and walking and encouraging people as they began their weight loss journey.

In the absence of Sue Parkes, Carolyn Knapman chaired the meeting and welcomed members and visitors.

There are trips planned to Dartmoor Zoo on the 13th September and Otter Nurseries on the 31st July.

Cothelstone House is also being looked into as a possible trip.

Sandy's Book Sale will be held on Saturday 16th September from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

A working party has been put together to work on our entry for the Okehampton Show and we heard a report from our delegate to the Devon Federation Spring Council Meeting.

A list of the usual groups: walking group, book club, supper club, lunch club, scrabble was given out to members. The film club and craft club are not operating during the summer.

The visit to the Cheese factory in North Tawton had been enjoyed by all who attended and thanks to Sue Knott for organising it.

WHAT CAN OUR WEST DEVON COMMUNITY DO TO HELP SYRIAN REFUGEES?

We first asked this question at the public meeting held at Tavistock Community College in February 2017. The immediate result was to form the group which is now called WEST DEVON SAFE HAVEN. The group is working towards helping a small number of refugee families to settle in West Devon and become members of our community. This is all part of the Government's Syrian Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Scheme. This scheme supports and funds a small number of refugees who are considered most vulnerable to move directly to the UK, from UNHCR camps in Lebanon and Turkey.

WEST DEVON SAFE HAVEN is working with West Devon Borough Council to find suitable accommodation and then to help the families settle into their new home and so make their first months in West Devon as easy and welcoming as possible – not forgetting that most of our new families will have been through the horrifying experiences that we have all seen in the media.

Two families will arrive in West Devon over the next two months, and a few more in the following months. We recognise that we can't affect the overall crisis, but we can at least offer a place of safety and new hope to a few families who have neither. Our aim is to support the families to be become independent members of our community.

Central Government provides much of the basic requirements for these new families when they arrive and we hope to provide some of the other things that are required to help their move as successful as possible and which may help make a new start less of a trauma, perhaps a television, children's bikes, toys, and toiletries. We will subsequently support the families with learning English, understanding our culture and community and helping to resolve the practical problems arising from moving to a totally new environment with only the clothes they stand up in. The aim is to support these refugees to become independent members of our community during their 5 year stay in the UK.

Our new families may arrive with next to nothing and we can't guess what they will need before they arrive and so we have established a "Welcome Fund" to help provide the things they might need.

West Devon Safe Haven is in the process of becoming formally registered as a charity.



There is to be a meeting on June 15th in the village hall of the committee and members to form a sub-committee to put together the programme of speakers for next year.







Slippering on....

There was a time when the family breadwinner might be described as a "pipe and slippers man". It conjured up a homely picture of the honest father returned from his day's work to be part of the family circle, regaled by a meal prepared by his wife, seated by the fireside in his slippers, exhaling fumes of his favourite tobacco, probably from behind the newspaper, until, eventually laying it aside, he was ready for the social responsibilities of being a father to his children and a husband to his wife. The family might have listened together to the radio or, a few years on, watched the television together.

Alas, how the picture has changed.

Nowadays, not everyone can count on a regular day's work. Many wives go from home and work to support the family. The fireside itself has become rarer and in many cases disappeared as central heating has become more popular.

The pipe has been in decline since the unhealthy effects of tobacco smoking have been made public. (How many older readers are in a state of wonder at having spent their early days inhaling at home the tobacco fumes of their parents and are yet alive and untroubled by respiratory disorders which they might have expected to follow? What good fortune!)

The newspaper still exists, but will not be used tomorrow as kindling in a fire place which is no longer there. Nowadays, the newspaper has an honoured place (like much of the news it carries) in the recycling bin.

In "From the Rectory" in April, Nick Weldon outlined a partnership scheme St. Peter's Church is undertaking to support five different organisations over the next three years. For each organisation a member of St. Peter's congregation is acting as its local "champion". Here Janet May gives more detail about the organisation "Connect" for which she is acting as "champion":

Connect

Connect began in 1996 with the aim of building connections between the schools, churches, and local communities in Chulmleigh, Crediton and Okehampton through Trainee Youth Workers.

Many Trainees have passed through Connect since 1996, many joining for one or two years whilst they complete their training with South West Youth Ministries, before continuing their journey of faith in another position.

Previous Trainees have gone on to do a variety of things; some continuing their study by attending Bible Colleges (in the UK and abroad), some going on to become teachers, some now head up Christian Youth Work charities, whilst others have been led in a completely different direction.

Connect is about providing a learning opportunity for youth workers just starting on their journey, and providing support and a sense of community to the young people in schools who may be struggling with their faith, or wanting to grow it further in those tough teenage years.

A vital part of Connect is reaching out to young people who are so spread out because of the landscape of rural Mid & West Devon. The Connect Team spends a great deal of time travelling to as many Youth Clubs and Churches as practicable, which helps the young people feel supported both in their college and in their own communities.

Historically, the Connect Team has operated under a variety of structures, firstly with Trainee Youth Workers working alone, and more recently with local church-based qualified Youth Workers (Associate Workers) becoming a part of the team, giving a sense of stability from year to year. Until August 2015, Connect only worked in Chulmleigh, Crediton & Okehampton. From September 2015 the Connect Team expanded into Holsworthy Community College. The Connect workers are supported by a Local Support Group (LSG) in each of the four areas. Each LSG meets bi-monthly, to hear about what the Connect team is doing and to guide and support them. The role of the LSG in praying and raising funds for Connect is vital, and they always appreciate more support.

LSG representatives are Connect's link to the area's Churches. They feed back information to their congregations, so that Churches can pray effectively for Connect, and get involved with events, either by organising them themselves or taking part in Connect's own events. If you are interested in supporting Connect in this way, please email info@connectdevon.org, and someone will get back to you regarding your local LSG.

At St. Peter's Church, we have been actively involved with the work of Connect for a couple of years now, getting involved with organising youth events in Okehampton for young people from around the area. A number of the local churches in Okehampton and the surrounding areas are involved with the Okehampton branch of Connect. Our most recent event was held at New Life Church in Okehampton at the end of March, where we were also joined by the Bishop of Plymouth, Bishop Nick McKinnel.

The events have games and food, but also have music and a good message for the young people. We try to host these events at least once a year.

The more they are worn, the more like old friends they become, offering instant comfort whenever you meet them.






