

Transgender?

Looking at my diary a moment ago, I thought to myself, this is going to be an interesting week. Tuesday - interviews for a new teaching assistant at North Tawton Primary School. Thursday – local clergy debate about "gender dysphoria and the church" (I'll explain in a moment!) Saturday – St Peter's Church Fete in the Rectory garden. By the time this is read, all of the above will have happened. I wonder how they will go? You'll have to ask me. At the moment I'm not quite sure which one I am looking forward to the least or the most. Trying to pick a winner from a very strong field of candidates for the teaching assistant job; policing a debate about how the church should respond to people who seek to change their sex (that's the gender dysphoria one); having wet sponges thrown at me whilst eating a cream tea at the church fete ... welcome to my world! Maybe I should have been a train driver.

Actually, I love it really. It is a great privilege to support the school in the education of our children here in this community. And I relish healthy, honest, theological debate about the ethical issues of our day and how they affect people's lives. It's also great to open our home and garden to the parish for fun in the sun (we hope). Just an average week? Thankfully not, but not unprecedented.

The "gender dysphoria" one has really taken me by surprise in the last few months. I don't think I had even heard that phrase a year ago, let alone knew what it meant. Now it appears everywhere. It means the distress a person feels when there is a miss-match between their sex given at birth and their perceived gender identity. I did know a year ago that there were people who identify themselves as "transgender", meaning... a person whose present gender identity does not correspond with their gender at birth, but I had never really thought about the distress it could cause someone if they feel they have been born in the wrong body. I think I also knew what it meant to "transition;" meaning, to undergo gender reassignment by medical intervention so that a person born male is now considered female, or vice-versa. I knew of the high profile celebrity cases like Bruce, now Caitlin Jenner, and I knew that it was a growing phenomenon in the western world. But over the last year the concept of gender fluidity seems to have gone viral. When we had a discussion about it at Thirsty (St. Peter's Church youth group) it was not only a concept that the teenagers were very familiar with from school, there were also young people they knew for whom gender dysphoria was an issue. As one commentator has wryly put it, "when I was at school the biggest decision I had to make was which GCSE's to take, now you have decide which gender you want to be as well."

As you can probably tell, this concerns me. I guess it

concerns quite a few of you also. The pace of change in the area of what is acceptable in society has never been so rapid. It worries me, as I look into the eyes of my own children, realising that what my wife and I are teaching them seems increasingly at odds with the society in which they are growing up. At least, that is how it feels quite a lot of time. I suppose every parent thinks this, but I ask myself "are they going to be okay?" "What choices will they make?" "How will I react when I might not agree with some of those choices?"

Some might say that Jane and I are being unkind to our children by teaching and modelling to them what it means to be male or female in the traditional sense. Some would argue that we are placing a cruel restriction on them by only encouraging them to discover who they are based on their birth gender. We should be encouraging them to explore their identity without the pressure to conform to traditional gender norms, they would say. Well, broadening the ancient categories of "boys play football and dress in blue" and "girls play with dolls and dress in pink" would be a good thing. I think most people would agree that those stereotypes are not always helpful for individual flourishing. But to encourage young people to follow a path that could lead to them to seek gender reassignment is another level altogether. It's a choice that will deeply affect the rest of their lives and every close relationship they will ever have.

Perhaps you are thinking I should relax a little about this gender thing and focus on the church fete. After all, it is not as if there are loads of transgendered people about. Well, you'd be right in that respect. Studies suggest that about 1 in 20 thousand people have gender dysphoria. But the numbers and the rhetoric are growing fast, particularly in educational settings, and that worries me instinctively. Is that worry merely a result of this transgender stuff cutting across my very blessed, stable, middle class, shielded upbringing (by two parents who are still married to each other)? It might be. Or, am I worried because I genuinely believe that when God made man male and female, he made billions of little unique masterpieces, each one in need of restoration work from time to time, but he never intended that we should change his design?

This is a complex subject, far beyond what can be dealt with in 1000 words. So I would really welcome responses from readers on this one. My details are below. And if there are enough responses then perhaps another forum could be found for a wider and more in depth discussion of these issues. Let me know.



New North Tawton Town Councillor

At the recent meeting on Tuesday 4th July 2017, the Council considered applications from four candidates for the vacant post as NTTC Councillor. Mr. Ray Aplin has been duly co-opted on to the Council and will serve as one of the 12 local Councillors. The Council would like to thank all of the candidates for their applications. Just to remind residents, the Council meets on the first Tuesday of each month, normally at 7.30 pm unless indicated otherwise, at the Council Office in The Square. Members of the public are very welcome to attend the meetings, and there is an opportunity for questions and comments from residents (on agenda items only). There may be additional meetings, please check the Council noticeboard for ongoing information.

Den Brook Community Fund – Application Criteria

The Den Brook Community Committee comprises members of the parish councils in the Den Brook area – North Tawton, Bow, Spreyton, South Tawton and Zeal Monachorum. The purpose of the Committee is to administer the Community Benefit Fund paid in respect of the Den Brook Wind Farm. The Committee is looking at the evaluation process to be undertaken for applications to the fund, and would like residents to help by looking at the criteria proposed to date, and suggesting appropriate criteria, taking into account the objective of the fund, which is to 'promote social and environmental sustainability initiatives for the benefit of the community, within the environs of the Den Brook Wind Farm'. The fund is not set up to provide general donations but to fund change projects which meet the criteria. The wind farm company defines "appropriate" project applicants as "a registered charity, charitable club or society, or other not-for-profit entity based within the five parishes". Please look at some of the assessment criteria suggested so far, and if you have any additions to this list or any comments you want to make, please either email the Town Council on northtawton.towncouncil@yahoo.co.uk or post your suggestions to the NTTC Office, 14a The Square, North Tawton, EX20 2EP. Thank you for your help and cooperation.

- Reducing poverty and disadvantage
- Improving the health of residents
- Promoting care and support of vulnerable people
- Improving Community Safety
- Ensuring easy access to employment opportunities
- Achieving parity with national educational attainment levels
- Promoting a wide range of recreational, sporting and cultural activities
- Improving rural transport facilities
- Improving rural employment opportunities
- Promoting environmental awareness and energy efficiency measures
- Building the capacity of voluntary organisations to learn skills and develop experience with a view to them becoming sustainable organisations.
- Will the project benefit the community over an extended period of time?
- Will it benefit more than one of the relevant parishes (as listed above)?
- Is the project environmentally friendly?
- Is it neutral/apolitical?
- Will the project encourage and support voluntary spirit, activity, and participation in our community?

Apparently the fuses did their job and the fallen cable was not dangerous, but no-one was to know that – the Council would like to thank those who acted so quickly in advising Western Power and contacting the emergency services to ensure everyone's safety.

Before our meeting Peter Cripps, whose wife had been President of our W.I., kindly made a presentation to us of a keyboard.

Our Speaker this month was Carol McFadden who gave a fascinating talk entitled "The Social Life of a Lace Maker". Carol detailed the history of the craft, the important theme being that the act of lace-making was definitely not the genteel pursuit commonly imagined. Lace making was carried out in the county of Devon from the 1700's and most often by the poorer members of society. Children from the age of 5 years also attended "lace schools". These were presided over by a "Dame" who was not adverse to using a stick on her charges, both girls and boys. Carol showed us a variety

of lace patterns and the methods used for their application and described patterns which were particular to an area or group of lace-makers. Of particular interest was a very large piece of black lace, finely decorated and we were invited to guess exactly what this piece of lace might have been used for. It transpired that it was a pall to cover a bier and it seems quite a few of Carol's friends are keen to have this beautiful piece adorning their own biers – hopefully in the very far future!

We looked at various styles of lace and their provenance both in the British Isles and abroad. The well-known town of Honiton was of course mentioned as well as Colyton. This was a most enjoyable talk.

Instead of a competition members were invited to bring old lace in for an exhibition.

After a break for tea the business part of the meeting followed. Bow W.I. is holding a "Tea at the Savoy" event on Sunday 10th September between 3 and 5 p.m. and members were invited to attend.

Trips are being organised to the Dartmoor Zoo in September and Cothelstone House for 11th October which will include looking around the house and afternoon tea.

A supper quiz will take place on 13th October. David Arney will preside and Richard Edwards will keep the score board.

We were pleased to hear from Karen Austen that her son Ross (who gave a talk in November 2016) has once again been chosen for the "power lift" event in the Invictus Games this Autumn.

Our next meeting will be "Pimms on the Pitch" on 2nd August and there will not be a speaker. This will be a social occasion and members are asked to bring a plate of food for sharing.





- <u>Highwavs</u> the Clerk had received several emails in response to maintenance of roads around the parish – a summary of the main points will be posted on the website & are listed below:
 - a) **Highway Inspections** "A" roads are inspected monthly, "B" and "C" roads are inspected 6 monthly and minor roads annually. In addition DCC responds to reports of individual defects on highways from parish councils and members of the public.
 - b) **Preventative Maintenance** with a limited funding available DCC strategy is based on preventative maintenance and timely intervention rather than adopting a "worst first" policy which is not cost effective. (a number of roads that are in "reasonable" condition can be patched and surface dressed for the

same cost as reconstructing one road that is in poor condition.)

- c) **Report a problem** It is helpful for Parishes and individuals to report potholes that meet the criteria online via the <u>website</u> These go straight to the contractor for repair.
- d) **Beware Children Playing signs** a member of the public asked if SCPC could ask for "Beware Children" signs on roads approaching the village to try and slow down vehicles. Cllr. A Thorley was actioned to investigate this.
- e) <u>Community Self Help</u> DCC also provide funding and training for volunteers from the parish to become Road Wardens. If any of you are interested in becoming a SC Road Warden please contact the Clerk.





In "From the Rectory" in April, Nick Weldon outlined a partnership scheme St. Peter's Church is undertaking to support five different organisations over the next three years.

This is the fourth of five articles about how the church community at St. Peter's in North Tawton has committed itself to aiding five charities over the next three years. Maurice Poole here explains his interest in Farming Community Network for which he is acting as the church's local "champion":

I have been asked to represent FARMING COMMUNITY NETWORK (F.C.N.) for St. Peter's Church at North Tawton as part of the new partnership networking.


Farming Community Network was formerly set up as Farming Crisis Network in 1995 by a few farmers who saw the need for a listening ear in times of trouble. Each farm must survive and thrive to remain as a business; just consider the problems surrounding animal health and welfare: having to rely on the right sort of weather to produce a decent crop; complying with all the regulations and red tape that go with food production; negotiating tenancy agreements and so forth. Then add the problems we all face: accidents, ill health, domestic and family difficulties, retirement plans etc.. When a farmer is forced out of business, for whatever reason, not only are jobs lost and a family home lost, but farming families are displaced, while generations of expertise in caring for the countryside can be lost for ever. F.C.N. is a Christian organisation and registered charity which continues today with a network of three hundred volunteers organised into county groups throughout England and Wales, many of whom are members of the farming community or have close links with agriculture. They provide pastoral and practical support for as long as needed and help people find a positive way forward through their problems.

It doesn't matter whether they need help in filling in forms or in being accompanied on a visit to the Bank. They may need encouragement when they find things are going badly or someone to help when they are upset or grieving. F.C.N. volunteers can be at their side. Much of the work goes on quietly and unseen because it is offered confidentially. Farming has the highest rate of suicides of any other industry, a sad indication that the value work of done by F.C.N. cannot be overestimated. Many people have their health, their families, their future and their very lives intact because of the


care, support and friendship they have received through F.C.N. volunteers.

F.C.N. has supported over three thousand people in one year. The number and complexity of problems is growing. None of the money given will go to supporting a business, but for the essential needs of a family only.


