Gifts for the Homeless

A couple of weeks ago, I was privileged to meet an amazing family just outside Exeter. As well as working full time on their dairy farm, one of their barns is now the hub for the Exeter Food Bank. Also, they co-ordinate Wednesday night Café, held in the Chapter House of Exeter cathedral, which reaches out to the homeless and vulnerably housed of the city. They shared some heart wrenching stories of individuals, and they conveyed how important it is to make homeless people feel *significant*, to offer them *sympathy* and give them *support*.

According to a recent report from Shelter, more than 1,000 people across Devon are officially homeless. Not just in the larger urban areas such as Exeter (which has one of the highest homeless rates in the west country) but also in the more rural, remote parts of the county – and, in fact, not far from our own front doorsteps.

Homeless people seem to be an increasingly common feature of our urban landscapes, sitting on the streets with their sleeping bags and blankets. But such people only represent the visible tip of an iceberg; there are also the 'hidden homeless', camped out on the floors of friends but who have nowhere to call their own.

Attitudes to the homeless vary. Some people dismiss 'the homeless' with no sympathy: 'it's their own fault', 'they should get a job'. Others throw them coins and move on swiftly. Others are troubled and ask why doesn't the government do something about them? The reality is that most of us don't bother ourselves too much with the plight of those who are homeless. After all, we like to live in tidy worlds of warmth and cleanliness, and these untidy, bedraggled and troubling people just don't fit in.

The Bible in Lamentations 3:19–21 echoes the discomfort of the homeless:

'The thought of my suffering and homelessness is bitter beyond words. I will never forget this awful time, as I grieve over my loss. Yet I still dare to hope when I remember this.'

We have just had one of the coldest nights of the winter, and sitting in my cosy, warm study I can't help but consider the plight of homeless people. We can at least offer them three gifts.

First, the gift of significance. There are many unfortunate aspects of being homeless but one of the worst is the way that you become insignificant; you become, in effect, invisible. People may step around you as if you were some sort of hazard but deep down, where it really counts, they do not see you. You can also be dehumanised by simply being reduced to 'an issue' and referred to as 'the homeless' as if you were some urban nuisance like waste disposal.

Yet homelessness is about *people*. Every homeless person is an individual with a history of hopes that failed, dreams

that became nightmares, and promises that were not delivered. They are like us except for this one thing: with them life went wrong. Every single person on the pavement has a sad and complex story. They are people and one size does not fit all.

If we are Christians we have even stronger reasons for treating such people as being significant. We should remind ourselves that a homeless person is someone made in the image of God. Jesus was born into homelessness, and said of himself that he had 'no place even to lay his head' (Matthew 8:20) and who, for our sake, was reduced to public humiliation.

If you regularly pass the same individual, try to get his or her name and, from then on, greet them with it. It's a reminder to them, and to us, that they are human and not a statistic.

Second, *the gift of sympathy*. These are people for whom something went so badly wrong that they started down the slippery slope that leads to life on the pavement.

In today's merciless world, mistakes go unforgiven and any slippery slope is well lubricated: landlords evict, banks foreclose, bailiffs arrive and doors are closed. And once you are down you tend to stay down. It's not easy applying for a job when your address is 'no fixed abode', or looking for jobs from a park bench, or remaining employed when you can't wash regularly. In every statistic the odds are stacked against homeless people: they are more frequently abused, have worse health and have appallingly low life expectancies. Take a moment and replay your own life. It's not hard to find a point where, had events been only slightly different, it could be you or me out there shivering, holding out our Styrofoam cup. Indeed, 'There but for the grace of God go I.'

Finally, the gift of support. We may want to give money but a thoughtful and strategic approach to giving support is better. Because of the complexities involved, getting people out of homelessness is hard. It takes time, money and sustained effort.

It is encouraging that many of the initiatives with homeless people have come out of Christianity; the Salvation Army, Shelter, Crisis, St. Petrock's in Exeter. One of Jesus's sayings is, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive' (Acts 20:35). To offer those who are homeless, significance, sympathy and support isn't easy. But here, from the most reliable authority, we have the promise that if we do so we will be blessed.

Remembered a century on, casualties of the Great War.





Community Group for improving or creating local amenities

North Tawton Town Council acknowledges the valuable contribution that local businesses and voluntary groups are making to our community and wishes to support initiatives that can further enhance the lives of our residents.

Within the town there are premises that are vacant or under-used and there may well be needs and interests that are not being met.

If you are interested in helping to form a community group to discuss and develop ideas, please contact the Town Council in the first instance. The Council will help to facilitate some initial meetings if significant interest is shown.

Dangerous and illegal parking - who can help?

Everyone is aware of all the parking issues we have here in North Tawton, but the Council continues to receive numbers of complaints about this issue. Even today, an incident of 'double parking' in The Square (even though only for a short period) led to a complete gridlock around The Square. The Council has ongoing concerns about traffic and parking, and has already agreed to form a working group, due to have an initial meeting in the near future, to discuss these issues and try to come up with viable solutions. In the meantime, who should residents contact if they have a complaint?

- Dangerous Parking can be defined as wilful and unnecessary obstruction of the highway, or leaving vehicles in a dangerous position, or sometimes it can refer to parking on the pavement in such a way that wheelchair users or those pushing buggies or prams have to divert onto the highway as there is no room on the pavement. The police have previously advised that specific incidents should be reported to them on the non-emergency contact number 101. They will need details of the vehicle itself, and where it is parked, and will attend if it is possible to do so.
- 2 Illegal Parking this can be a complex issue, but essentially drivers should be aware of road markings and restrictions and park accordingly. Cars should be parked within 50cm of the kerb unless in a parking bay. Don't park on areas of hatched white lines. Illegal parking is enforced by Devon County Council, and can be reported on their dedicated webpage. The easiest way to find this is to do an internet search for 'Devon Highways report a problem' and you will see where to report parking issues on this page. Alternatively, ring Devon Highways on 0345 155 1004 or 0845 155 1004 check charges with your telephone network provider first.



The Commemoration is written so that it can be put together at short notice. Preliminary rehearsals are likely to be on three Tuesdays in September: 11th, 18th, 25th, two Tuesday evenings in October: 2nd and 9th (the 9th to be the "Dress Rehearsal") before performances at the end of that week.







From the North Tawton Parish Records:

From around the turn of the twentieth century, one of the major effects of improved medical practice has been to reduce infant mortality. Nowadays we expect a child and its mother to come safely through the time of its birth and for it to have every prospect of a full life's expectation. That has not always been the case and our parish records contain many sad instances of children who died as infants. Our ancestors lived closer to death than we do. Life expectation was shorter, medical practice less developed and disease more easily flourishing in insanitary living conditions.

One case from the grave records of St. Peter's Church in North Tawton tells a particularly heart-rending story. John and Charity Wensley lost the following children: William (7 weeks) in 1767, Sarah (3 weeks) 1768, Charity (2 weeks) 1769, Anthony (7 years) 1772, and Richard (15 months) 1772.

One hopes that the couple were able to raise other children to help them bear the trauma of losing so many. Whether or not they had that solace, the parents lived much longer themselves and were buried in the same churchyard, Charity aged 57 in 1795 and John aged 88 in 1819.

But what would John and Charity have given for the kind of health care we enjoy today for our young families?

ACE Archaeology Club

We are now busy planning for another year of archaeology. There is so much going on.

We have changed the dates of our Moistown dig so that we do it all in one go instead of spreading it out and doing a week in spring and two weeks in the summer. We decided that putting up the tents and then taking them down twice and covering and uncovering the trenches twice wasn't a good use of time and energy so we will be digging from the 30th June to the 25th July. This also covers the Council for British Archaeology festival on the 21st and 22nd July, for which we will be doing our bit. As well as the opportunity to have a look around our site and find out more from the exhibition, there is the chance for visitors to have a go at digging. The 'Have a go trench' is usually full of children but we would love some adults to try it as well. You never know, you might like it.

We have a small group of people now starting to work on the thousands of finds that we have, mostly pottery sherds. We have to do a crash course in how to identify the different types of pottery. We have found some pieces dating from the Saxo-Norman period and quite a bit of later medieval as well as the ubiquitous blue and white ware! So have a lot to get our heads around.

Of course, we aren't the only ones doing archaeology and we hope to have some involvement in work that will be going on in the National Trust estate at Fingle Woods. DARE has successfully been providing independent and impartial advice on the SMART meter roll out in North Tawton and the surrounding area, through our SMART Energy GB funded project. We have been very warmly



welcomed by a number of groups including the Bow Friendship group, North Tawton's Tuesday Chat group, the Create and Craft group and those attending the Bow Christmas Market. We have also held a number of open surgeries in North Tawton, which were kindly hosted in the Town Council Offices. Following on from these events, we have found a number of queries have become a running theme of our sessions. Therefore, we thought we would answer these questions through this article and make readers aware that they can contact us should they need any further information.

Do I have to have a SMART Meter?

SMART Meters are not mandatory, it is your choice as a consumer if you wish to have one installed. However all of the major energy suppliers have to offer you the chance to have a SMART meter by 2020 and you can ask your supplier for a SMART meter to be installed. Also, it is worth noting that eventually they will stop the manufacture of normal meters, if you have a fault with your meter in the future it may have to be replaced with a SMART meter if your supplier isn't able to source a traditional meter.

Do I pay for a SMART Meter?

No, you should not pay any fee for the SMART meter to be installed or for the home energy display unit, if someone asks for money to install a SMART meter it is a scam.

Why would I want a SMART Meter?

SMART Meters are very useful if you find the manual reading of your meter difficult, or if you don't like energy company representatives visiting your property to read the meter. They are designed to see an end to estimated billing, which can cause consumers a great deal of distress and lead to a large number of over-payments. The home energy display can help you identify high energy using appliances, or reveal the consumption of appliances being left on stand-by and gives you your consumption information in pounds and pence, which is easier to understand.

Can I change fuel supplier I like to switch to get the best deal?

Currently you can switch supplier, although the tariff information will disappear from the home energy display and you may have to take manual meter readings again for your new supplier. There are two generations of meters; SMETS1 & SMETS2. SMETS1 meters communicate with one supplier, SMETS2 have been introduced to overcome this issue and will communicate with a data control company which will then feed consumption information to your supplier, this means you will be able to switch and maintain all functionality. Only SMETS2 meters will be installed from July 2018 and a software change will happen to all SMETS1 meters to make them compliant before 2020.

Will a SMART meter work in every home?

Unfortunately, not all homes are suitable for a SMART meter. This may be because of difficult access to the meter, a long distance from the meter to the home, certain wall construction types which hamper the signal and areas of poor mobile phone signal. The SMETS2 meters have been introduced to try and overcome some of these issues, namely poor phone signal, but it is important to make your supplier aware of any of these matters when they offer you a SMART meter, so they can check if your property will be suitable. The Smart Energy GB in Communities fund is a central part of Smart Energy GB's work to ensure everyone in Great Britain hears about smart meters and knows how to use them to get their gas and electricity under control. The fund is managed by Charities Aid Foundation (CAF), which has 45 years' experience in designing and delivering strategic grant-making programmes to part of the Smart Energy GB in

Communities programme, which is being delivered by a consortium of charities - National Energy Action (NEA), Energy Action Scotland (EAS) and CAF. If you would like further information please call us on 01837 52600 or visit

First published in "Roundabout" in February 1991 (an extract thought to be from a local newspaper of 1912)

A capital variety entertainment took place in aid of funds to place incandescent burners in the parish church. The Hall was packed with a representative gathering, who thoroughly appreciated the evening's programme. The first item was a pianoforte duet by Miss C. Letheren and Mr. H. Manuell, the rendering of which evinced great skill on the part of the performers. Mr. Ingles then sang "If I should plant a tiny seed of love" which was deservedly encored. Widdecum Fair" was selected as the encore. This was followed by a vocal duet "Our Farm" by Mr. J. Taverner and Miss W. Taverner, who delighted the audience and were recalled. A sketch entitled "Miss Priscilla's Cat" was then performed by the Misses R. Sloman and B. May, two youthful performers who gave their parts with great skill. The Rev. E. Paine gave a song in his well-known style, which was followed by "Drum Roll" by Mrs. Matthews, always a favourite with North Tawton audiences. She won an encore and was received with enthusiasm. "Molly", a song by Mr. Ingles was loudly applauded. Lastly the Rev E. Paine sang "Three for Tom" in capital form, and deservedly won an encore.

The Second part consisted of a play entitled "The Little Rebel" by the North Tawton Dramatic Society. The Characters were taken as follows:- Mrs.Wingrove, Mrs. May; Laura, her daughter, Miss D. May; Kitty Winks, Miss W. Taverner; Mr. Ormeston, Mr. May; Mr Poppincourt, Mr C. Whitmore. The Play reflected the greatest credit on the performers who were rewarded with applause. Mrs. May acted her part in a bright and jovial manner and elicited roars of laughter. Miss D. May made a charming schoolgirl, and Miss W. Taverner well acted the part of Kitty Winks. Mr. May acted the lover in a delightful way, and Mr. Whitmore well performed the part of would-be suitor. A dance which followed, was well attended. Hearty thanks were tendered to Mr. and Mrs. Way, who were responsible for the evening's entertainment.

To which Dr. Jean Shields added (in 1991)the following notes:

Miss Connie Letheren: her parents had a business (shop) in The Square. The Taverners who lived at Melhuishes in The Square when I knew them, originally owned Newlands Mill. James Taverner was a Church Warden. Mr. Ernest May Lived at Crooke (later moved to de Bathe). He was also a Church Warden. His daughter, Miss Daisy May, became Mrs. Tucker, lived at Crooke, and she, too became Church Warden and is mother of David Tucker (present Church Warden). Mr. C. Whitmore was a cousin of the Mays and was probably spending a holiday with them. Miss Sloman: the Slomans farmed at Middleton, Honeychurch. Mrs. Matthews was perhaps wife of Harold F. Matthews of Nichols Nymet.
