

### **From The Rectory**

#### Mary, Mary, not quite so contrary

There's a new Biblical movie out. Mary Magdalene – it's been showing at Okehampton cinema during March. I've not seen it, and to be honest I probably won't un lit comes out in some other format. Cinema trips in our household tend to be to more family friendly fi ms, like Peter Rabbit. Also, I o en wince at the prospect of another Hollywood biblical epic. The track record is patchy at best. Jesus of Nazareth was mainly brilliant, and it is the standard by which all other "Jesus films" are judged. It is now a li le clichéd though, I think. The Last Tempta on of Christ was pointlessly controversial and very offensive to Chris ans. Jesus Christ Superstar has great music (if you like Lloyd Webber musicals, that is) but it ques ons the divinity of Jesus and oddly stops short of the resurrec on at the end. The Passion of the Christ was excellent in many ways but is too much like a horror movie in parts. For me, nothing beats The Miracle Maker: a stop-mo on animated fim of the life and ministry of Christ. The children at school will be familiar with it, because I o en use clips from it in assembly. I love its beau ful animated depic on of many of the best-known instances in the story of Jesus. But most of all. I love it for its faithfulness to the Gospels.

I gather from reading the press reports about *Mary Magdalene* that the film sets out to refute the commonly held assump on that Mary was a pros tute before Jesus redeemed her. She almost certainly wasn't one. Mary of Magdala (a town on the western shore of Lake Galilee) is iden fi d in the Bible as having evil spirits cast out of her by Jesus, and being present at the key events in the last week of his life. From the movie trailers, it seems the fi m focuses on these facts rather than the myths. If this is the case, then it will be a fi m worth seeing. But of course, nothing beats going to the Bible itself to fi d out exactly what happened.

The myth that Mary Magdalene was a pros tute comes mainly from the wrongly held assump on that she was the unnamed "sinful woman" who poured perfume on the feet and head of Jesus. It is a view s II held in some Chris an tradi ons today, but the facts in the Bible simply don't add up. The Gospel writers - Ma hew, Mark and Luke do not name the woman with the alabaster jar of perfume in their accounts. John does, but he reports that it is Mary of Bethany, the daughter of Lazarus, who anoints Jesus. And Luke introduces Mary Magdalene, seemingly for the first

me, in the very next chapter of his gospel a er the anoin ng. One report I read about *Mary Magdalene* suggests that the film enters "deeply conten ous territory" by seeking to clear Mary's name of pros tu on. Well, despite not having seen it yet, and on the basis of the very favourable reviews in the Chris an press as well, I would suggest that merely adhering to the Biblical portrayal of Mary should hardly be seen as controversial. So it is there I want to place our focus as we approach Easter 2018. Mary Magdalene played a key role in the events of the first Easter as portrayed in the Bible. Her witness to the ages to come is not that she was a redeemed pros tute. Neither does it ma er so much that Jesus cast seven demons out of her, wonderful though that was. Her tes mony is not really about her at all. Instead, her life and witness point to the most essen al of Chris an reali es, namely that, "Christ is risen!" Three out of the four gospel writers place Mary Magdalene at the crucifix on, naming her specifi ally along with the other women who were there. Most of the male disciples had already fled at this point. But Mary is depicted throughout the events of those agonizing hours as the model of Chris an commitment and hear elt discipleship. She is there at the cross when Jesus dies, and crucially she sees where he is buried also; the point being that Jesus really did die and was buried, and that Mary of Magdala - a woman in a man's world - is the key witness to these facts. That is what is so striking about her. So when she goes to the tomb early on the Sunday morning it is the eyes of this faithful, female disciple that are so blessed to fi st witness the staggering reality that Jesus is risen.

I think to focus on what the church has historically got wrong about Mary Magdalene is to miss the point, and it looks like the new movie serves the viewer well in that regard. The story of Mary Magdalene is about her devo on to Jesus as her Saviour, Master and Friend. He is the Lord who died to save her, and us, and was raised to life to bring us back to God. But I suppose if people, not least the church, can get the wrong idea about Mary Magdalene then all the more easily can we get the wrong idea about Jesus. Well, I hope over the next couple of weeks of Bank Holidays, spring flow rs and chocolate we will not make that mistake. I pray this Easter that we will all come again to the foot of the cross to confess our short-comings and our need of redemp on, and then on to the empty tomb which alone gives fresh hope and new life to our souls.

There is one other myth about Mary Magdalene. I like this one, but I think it is even less true than the pros tute myth. This one places her in Rome, some me a er the resurrec on, at dinner with the Emperor Tiberius. When she tries to convince him of the truth of the resurrec on of Christ, legend has it that Tiberius laughs at her. Mary happens to be holding an egg in her hand, and he says, "a man rising from the dead is no more possible than that egg turning red before our eyes." Well, guess what happens next? What a great story! It's a shame it's not true. But the truth behind the myth is.

Private Ernest Brealey of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry. He died on 15th April, 1918 aged 27, and is buried in the Aire Communal Cemetery in St Quentin, France. He lived in High Street, North Tawton.

Private George Northcott of the 1st Battalion, Dorset Regiment.



He died on 19th April, 1918 aged 35 and is buried in Bienvillers Military Cemetery in France. He was the son of Frederick Northcott of Exeter Street, North Tawton.

Private Harry Avery of the2nd Battalion, Devonshire Regiment. He died on April 24th 1918 aged 18 and is buried in Adelaide Cemetery, Villers Bretonneux in France. He lived in Globe Cottages, North Tawton

We announced in 1914 our intention of remembering the local First World War casualties in "Roundabout" in the month a century after they died. It occurred to us that there may be those living locally today who might wish to have the name remembered of a relative who fell in that conflict, even though he went to fight from a different part of the United Kingdom and we invited anyone who wished to pass the details of their relative to us to be included at the right time. Below is such a case:

Remembered a century on, a casualty of the Great War.

Private Philip W. Simons of The Durham Light Infantry. He died on 9th April 1918 aged 34 and is remembered on the Ploegsteert Memorial in Belgium.

#### OkeRail

OkeRail Community Interest Company - a not for profit organisation - was formed in early 2016 with the aim of promoting and resurrecting a regular daily rail service between Okehampton and Exeter. Residents may recall that Dr. Michael Ireland, the Vice Chairman of OkeRail, gave a talk on this subject at the North Tawton Annual Town Meeting in 2017. Since then, the Chair of North Tawton Town Council, Cllr. Steve Whiteley, has joined the OkeRail Forum and regularly attends their meetings.

The Transport Secretary, Chris Grayling, recently made this announcement: "We have instructed GWR to prepare plans to introduce regular train services to Okehampton, with the objective of securing a credible and costed plan for delivering an all-week, all-year train service between Exeter and Okehampton as soon as reasonably practicable."

Meanwhile, Okerail has given advance notification of the first Royal Oke special train from Okehampton to Oxford and to Stratford upon Avon, via Crediton and Exeter St David's. This train is being run for the local community in the Okehampton area and towns and villages who would benefit from the reopening of the line.

The train will leave at approximately 7.00 a.m. giving between 5 to 6 hours in the respective destinations, arriving back in Okehampton about 9.00 p.m.. The date is yet to be finalized but is likely to be toward the end of April. If you think you might be interested in these trains, please look out for more information in the local press, or check the Okerail Facebook page for updates.

#### Nat West Mobile Bank

The bank has announced that the last day of service in North Tawton will be Thursday 3rd May. With the closure of the Okehampton branch, the nearest Nat West banks will be Launceston, Tavistock or Exeter. The bank advises that transactions can be made online or using a mobile app, and many transactions can be undertaken at the Post Office – please ask them for more advice.

#### From the Archives – 20 years ago

The minutes of the Council from June 1998 record the following, further to a visit by consultants undertaking a regeneration strategy for North Tawton:

"A long discussion ensued which included parking, traffic management, viability of existing businesses in the Town, tourism, and support for other groups and projects in North Tawton. Councillors stressed that their main priority is the economy of the area and they were currently battling with Devon County Council and West Devon Borough Council to address imbalances in levels of support."







Children in our foundation unit used Julia Donaldson books for inspiration while KS1 had the theme of Roald Dahl and KS2 had the books of David Walliams, meaning we had some very scary looking Demon Dentists and a few brave souls who came as The Boy in the Dress. It made it a very special day and hopefully it will continue to inspire the children to read.

There was a sighting of a dragon over the school a few weeks back. It also appeared to leave a nest in the school field with a strange looking egg and some bones. This was all part of a writing day we set up in school to inspire the children. It certainly worked as they were very excited throughout the day and produced some fantastic and very imaginative pieces!

North Tawton children enjoyed a very good result in the recent Rotary Club Primary Schools' Quiz. After having qualified from our heat, the children progressed to the final held in the Octagon Theatre at Okehampton College. After a tough evening of quizzing the NT team finished in fourth place. It was a great achievement not least as 18 teams started the competition in the qualifying rounds, so congratulations to our team of Charlotte, Amy, Sam and Ellie who are all in Year 6.

The school recently had a day of activities to mark Safer Internet Day. This is aimed at keeping children safe online and helps children recognise potential dangers when they use the internet. Mrs. Ware, who is the school's online safety officer, has set up a team of e-leaders who are our go to team for ICT issues including online safety. They proudly wear a badge to identify themselves and worked with Mrs. Ware to lead a school assembly on the subject. The e-leaders are: Emily and Ted from Y2, Harvey and Louis from Y3, Jimmy and Cobie from Y4, James and Alice from Y5 and Courtney and Saxon from Y6.

The Dartmoor MAT is now three months old and, as you can imagine with any new organisation, it's been a very busy period. The governors are currently in the process of putting the leadership structure in place including recruiting an executive headteacher who will oversee North Tawton along with South Tawton and Chagford. We should know the outcome of this appointment shortly after Easter. It's not without sadness on my part that I report I will be leaving North Tawton at the end of this school year. As you may be aware, I was appointed as an interim head to oversee the transition into the newly formed MAT. I have recently accepted a new headship post at Shebbear Community School and will start in September. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time at North Tawton and have particularly liked getting to know the staff and families of the school as well as the wider community. There are still some months to go and I'll endeavour to ensure there is a smooth transition to the new leadership of the school.

I couldn't finish without mention of the recent snow. The school did close for a couple of days. This is always a difficult decision but I do feel it was the right one. The children certainly enjoyed playing in the snow which is a rare treat. And schools being schools .... we made them write all about it when they came back in on Monday!



#### News from the Castle

#### Hi everyone

The new season at Castle Drogo is underway with some exciting changes to the presentation of the castle. Lots of the protection work has been taken down in the rooms along the green corridor so we can once again see the views from those windows. It's been a few years! We are especially excited about the new art installation in the Library. It has been created by artist Edward Crookes and is inspired by the wonderful architecture Lutyens designed in Castle Drogo. It is very striking and quite wonderful – I hope you enjoy it. Also, we will finally be able to open the chapel again this year. The access route is a long way (via the rhododendron garden and around the south end of the building) but it does make for an interesting explore and quite an adventure. It definitely feels like we are on the home stretch now.

We have just completed a lovely community project. As part of a Heritage Lottery Fund project called Away From the Western Front, we have worked with music and drama students at Okehampton College to create performance pieces inspired by the story of a young man from Drewsteignton called William George Arscott. William was a labourer at Castle Drogo at the start of the First World War. He enlisted immediately and ended up fighting in the campaign in Salonika in Greece. The students from the college explored and researched his story to inform the music and drama they created before performing it in the Chapel at Castle Drogo. It was truly beautiful.

As many of you know, we introduced car park charging last summer to help fund the amazing work the ranger team do in the Teign Valley. So far, the income raised has enabled us to invest in our woodland track and path networks to make it easier for us all to get about. We have also employed contractors to undertake scrub clearance works on Piddledown common, which is vital for the continued health of the heathland and the habitat of Fritillary butterflies. Thank you to everyone for their support of this and helping us to care for this wonderful landscape.






