

From The Rectory

Accessibility brings life

An Easter holiday highlight for me was taking my son and daughter to Sandy Park to see Exeter Chiefs play rugby against Gloucester. We won 46-10. It was brilliant. My son and I have been a few times, but it was my daughter's first visit to see the reigning Premiership Champions. In fact, it was Emily's first time at a major sporting fixture. So it was our pleasure to introduce her to the various traditions of a visit to see the Chiefs. These included, a walk across "the wobbly bridge" on the way to the ground, patiently waiting for Daddy to purchase crisps and some liquid refreshment, and then a walk around the pitch before the game started. My son loves this part because he likes to try to catch the ball as the kickers warm up before the game. Then we took our seats, explaining to Emily that it might get quite noisy, and that anyone dressed in cherry and white was bad. We taught her the various Exeter Chiefs chants, and then the game started. It was brilliant (I think I might have said that already). The Chiefs dominated the game and won easily. We particularly enjoyed how quiet a group of teenaged Gloucester supporters sitting in front of us were by half time. By the end, they were all staring at their phones whilst I hope that doesn't happen as GDPR comes into force at the we celebrated. As I write, Exeter Chiefs have three games left and are 8 points clear at the top of the table, and what's more my brother's team Bath are eighth (yes!). Here's hoping for a successful passage through to the play-off final at the end of May.

There was one further Chiefs ritual that Samuel was insistent we introduced Emily to ... a chance to meet the players after the match. Perhaps other sides do this too, but one of the best things about going to Sandy Park is the accessibility the crowd gets to the players. We let the disgruntled Gloucester fans leave, and about 20 minutes after the final whistle most of the Chiefs players came back out of the changing room to meet the fans. We jostled for position behind the advertising hoardings and after a few minutes we found ourselves standing just along from Jack Nowell and opposite brothers Sam and Joe Simmonds - two of whom are England players. After a brief conversation with them, photos were taken and at least two of us went away with big smiles. I think by this time Emily had had enough.

It was a refreshing experience to be allowed such accessibility to these top rugby players when I'm sure all they wanted was a hot shower. I suppose they are probably told to do it for the sake of good public relations, but they all shook hands, signed shirts and chatted away happily to the adoring public for at least half an hour. In an age where sensitivity about privacy is increasing, it was refreshing.

At the end of May, new data protection legislation comes into force - General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). As

churches, we have had to make sure we are compliant with the new regulations as to how we hold and process the data of our members. It's been a bit of a headache, and if you are involved with any club or society then you will know what I mean. That said, as we would wish to treat any member of our church with respect, openness and honesty, so should we treat any data we hold about them too, asking them for the necessary permissions and giving them the means to opt out. My worry, though, is that GDPR, along with some Health and Safety legislation, just makes us all a little more fearful of one another and what happens if "something goes wrong". I'm sure the Health and Safety explosion of the last 20 years has saved many people from serious injury and even death, and that GDPR will force some aggressive organisations to back off a little and treat people's data with greater respect (here's hoping it reduces junk mail too). However, I fear that society's desire to increase respect for the privacy of individuals could drive people apart. As accessibility reduces so suspicion and loneliness increase.

end of May. I suppose organisations, including churches and rugby clubs, will have to learn to strike the balance between creating communities of people with meaningful relationships between them, but at the same time maintaining respect for the dignity and preferences of individuals as well.

Jesus never had a problem with this. He was able to create a strongly cohesive movement of followers typified by his twelve disciples, yet he was able to perfectly respect the circumstances of individual people whom he encountered as well. I think he was able to do this through a perfect blend of compelling kindness and persuasiveness.

In the parish churches over the next few months we are going to be learning about this from John's Gospel. It contains accounts of Jesus in deep conversation with two particular individuals who have been drawn to him (Nicodemus a Jewish leader, and an unnamed Samaritan woman at a well) and also a long discourse where he instructs his disciples how they are to live - that they should live as one. Both with the individuals and the group he is able uniquely to capture hearts that go away transformed, but in no sense is anyone coerced or manipulated by him. By making himself accessible to them in this way, their lives are changed for the better. Accessibility brings life, and my children and I got a taste of that last weekend at Sandy Park.

North Tawton Waste Plastics Recycling Group wins West Devon Borough Council Mayor's Green Award 2018

This group, which was set up two years ago, provides a collection point for the waste plastics which are currently not able to be included in the normal kerbside recycling collections. The volunteers assist in all weathers to help residents sort their plastic, and, as awareness of the dangers of single use plastics continues to spread, the group goes from strength to strength.

The Mayor, Cllr. Jeff Moody, recognised the high standard of entrants, saying: "Every year we are taken aback by the wide range of nominations across the Borough, and this year is no exception. These people really are the backbone of our communities, helping in so many different walks of life, from working with the elderly or disadvantaged, to improving our environment or helping our animals and wildlife. The final winners we have selected are everything we were looking for in our local heroes and are deserving winners in every sense of the word."

North Tawton Town Council is equally proud of this volunteer group and the work that it does – work which commenced well in advance of the current publicity around plastic pollution and public demand for less plastic usage and more recyclable materials.

The collection of waste plastics takes place in the town centre car park on the 3rd Saturday each month – look out for the notices outside the Council Office. Materials you can collect and bring for recycling include yoghurt pots, plastic food containers and trays, plastic sandwich containers – but please be aware, black plastic trays and containers cannot currently be recycled. Please take the opportunity to save and recycle these materials, which otherwise go to landfill – it's very easy to do, and you will probably be amazed at how much plastic material you collect.

Section 106 Community Facilities Grant Scheme

Funding for this grant scheme comes from monies that the local planning authority can require from developers. Some of the Section 106 money can be spent on new community facilities or upgrading local community facilities. The scheme is open to all community based groups which are not for private profit making and can only apply to capital projects. Examples of community facility projects include: new play areas or new equipment to improve existing areas; sports facilities including equipment; creation of allotments for use by the community. For more information please go to the Council's website at <u>northtawton.towncouncil@yahoo.co.uk</u>, or visit the Council Office to obtain a copy of the scheme guidance notes. Please be aware there is only room in this article for a very brief outline, but there are numerous eligibility issues to be taken into account in order to make a successful application. Further information is also available from the West Devon Borough Council Countryside and Communities Projects Officer, telephone 01822 813701. The Town Council cannot provide application guidance.

North Tawton Town Council Meetings

Parish and Town Councils are the level of local government closest to their communities. All local government bodies must be open and transparent, ensuring that we have strong local democracy which is genuinely accountable to the residents they serve and the local taxpayers who help fund them. Council meetings are not public meetings, but the public do have a statutory right to attend as observers, and North Tawton Town Council meeting agendas have a section for members of the public to ask questions on agenda items. Agendas and minutes are posted on the noticeboard outside the Council Office in The Square, and on the Council's website. The Council would like to encourage residents to take the opportunity to attend meetings – you do not have to ask questions, you don't have to stay for the full meeting – please take the opportunity to come along and be part of the local democratic process. Our Speaker today was Tony Venning, who gave a spirited account of the Life and Loves of Samuel Pepvs. Pepvs is widely regarded as the greatest diarist in the world. In the nine years he kept diaries, he wrote over one million words. Pepys was a very colourful personality, both in public and his personal life. He was married but he and his wife were childless. She died of typhus aged 29 which devastated him and he asked, when the time came, to be buried next to her in St Olave's Church, Spitalfields, London. This beautiful church was named in honour of Olaf II Haraldsson, traditionally known as St. Olave of Norway and the national flag stands on the right near the altar. As well as writing the diaries Pepys was at the centre of Government life and also had the ear of the sovereign. Besides his diaries another important legacy was his founding of The Blue Coat School for Orphans, enabling them to receive a good education and be prepared and equipped to go out into the world when they grew up.

Our next meeting is the A.G.M. in which we shall welcome a new Committee and begin the new programme of Speakers from June. Everyone is welcome to join us at the monthly meeting, the first Wednesday of each month and we are sure that the programme will have something of interest for everyone.



I don't want to tempt fate but as I write this (a few days before the end of the Easter holidays) it finally feels like spring and we have hopefully said goodbye to the longest, and certainly wettest, winter I can ever recall. I'm sure it didn't rain this much when I was growing up in Hatherleigh all those years ago but then again, time can play tricks on the memory!

The summer term is usually looked forward to by everyone at school. The children finally get the chance to use the field to play on again and for us at NT, it means the swimming pool is back in use. The pool has been undergoing its annual maintenance and should be ready for the children to start using soon after the start of term. Having a pool on site is a real bonus for the children. All primary age children are expected to be taught how to swim and for most schools this usually means having to bus children to a local pool thereby wasting valuable learning time. We are so fortunate in having no travel time allowing more time in the pool. This is particularly useful now that the Department for Education (DFE) are this year expecting schools to report on how many Year 6 pupils can swim 25m by the time they leave school.

Swimming is not the only thing our oldest children will be tested on this term. They have been hard at work working towards their SATs tests in May. They will undertake assessments in reading, writing, spelling, punctuation and grammar and mathematics. The majority are by means of a timed test so they do mean plenty of pressure for the children. I'm sure you will join me in wishing them well and fingers crossed for some good outcomes.

They are not the only ones who have to undertake assessments (although they are rather less formal then the ones Year 6 have to take). Year 2 have their own versions of SATs in the same subjects as their Year 6 peers while Year 1 have a screening test in their knowledge of phonics. Reception children are continually assessed on their progress towards achieving what is called a 'Good Level of Development'. All of this information is reported to the DFE who use it to consider how well schools are doing.

Thankfully the summer term is not just about assessments. We have sports' day to look forward to, a number of planned trips including a residential for our Year 5 and 6 children and by the end of term we have the annual excitement of finding out which teacher you will be having next year! The Year 6 children have planned transition visits to Okehampton College and we are all excited to find out who will be joining us in nursery and reception in September.

The music concert is normally a highlight of the summer term but in a break from tradition this has already taken place. It was a wonderful occasion and a real celebration of the musical talent at NT. We had a variety of performers including singers, instrumentalists, the school choir and each class contributed something too. The standard was high and was a testament to the quality of music at the school. The children benefit by having specialist music lessons, a weekly singing practice and a range of musical instrument tuition on offer. Many thanks to Mrs. Shorland for organising the event and for co-ordinating the various musical opportunities on offer.

At the end of term we said goodbye to Mrs. Squire who works in the office and deals with, among many tasks, the school's finances. After a long association with the school as parent, volunteer and a member of staff, she is off to join the central finance team of the Dartmoor MAT. We wish her well in the new role and I'm pleased to say that she will continue to be working with the school to ensure we don't spend too much! We have appointed a new admin. assistant to work alongside Mrs. Grainge in the office so we welcome Mrs. Malerba to the NT community.

Our Spring term ended with an Easter Service at St. Peter's. It was a lovely occasion attended by the whole school including nursery children and many parents. The children all contributed with readings, songs, sharing art work and a fascinating piece by Hazel class who told us about the history and meaning of Maundy Thursday, which this year coincided with the last day of term. Many thanks to Reverend Weldon for welcoming us.

Finally, we ran a vocabulary challenge over the holidays. The children were given the task of finding one new word a day for each day of the holidays. They were challenged to find unfamiliar words they came across in their books, on signs or in conversation. Hopefully it has proved to be a fun and worthwhile activity. It certainly provoked lots of conversation in our house and children always seem very drawn to the most unusual of words which is great!




