

### From The Rectory

#### Two tribes

"The more I think about it the less sure I am that anyone truly knows the implications of the UK either staying in or leaving the EU. Everyone is guessing." That is a quote from the May 2016 edition of Roundabout. Nearly two years later, I'm afraid to say I feel the same. On the one hand, like many people who voted in the EU Referendum June 2016, I'm appalled that after so much Brexit water has passed under the bridge that our Government appears to be in such a poor state of readiness for March 29<sup>th</sup>. (By the time this is published the deadline might even have been extended!) On the other hand, again, like many people who voted in June 2016, I'm so wearied by the whole Brexit debacle that I'm not sure I care very much about the outcome any more. My conscience kicks in there, because that's an attitude I'm not proud of. But I fear it's the overwhelming attitude of the country now, no matter which box you crossed in the referendum. It does feel like the last two years has wounded the soul of the nation.

Look, with 29<sup>th</sup> March approaching, I feel that I must write something about Brexit, albeit reluctantly. I've only touched on it briefly in the last few months. My last proper treatise was in May 2016, so it's about time. And I imagine, if you were not interested then you would have stopped reading by line two. Now that you have got this far, permit me to engage your soul about this vexed subject of Brexit.

Despite the current national restlessness and division, I can foresee that we will make the best of Brexit one way or another. Undoubtedly there will be short-term losses, especially if we leave the EU with no deal. I imagine the country will go into a period of recession, and that getting goods across the border at Calais could be very difficult for a while. I worry about our farmers too and how they will be affected, and the potential damage to the fragile peace in Northern Ireland. But I also imagine that in five years time there will be successes to celebrate too. After all, the country has come through periods of far greater uncertainty before, and responded positively. There's a little bit of me that wonders if March 29<sup>th</sup> will turn out like the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2000 – a huge fuss about not very much. Remember the "Millennium Bug"?

Some will celebrate March 29<sup>th</sup> as though it were some kind of "independence day". For others it will be a sad day as they mourn the fracturing of our relationship with the rest of Europe. For most people it will probably just be a day to shrug the shoulders and get on with life. I think it will be day to stop and pray, and reflect on what has definitely been the most sorry chapter in our national life in my life-time, but then to knuckle down and get on with making the best of things in our little part of the world.

To help with that, I've been challenged recently about how we might all heal some of the division that Brexit has sown across the country. I voted to remain in June 2016. I thought it was the least bad of two undesirable options. That's the tribe I find myself in. I don't think I have fallen out with anyone in the opposing tribe. But I read recently, that since 2016 the old tribes of class or wealth, political Left and Right, and even county or country loyalty have been superceded by two new tribes. You are either a Leaver or a Remainer, and these two narratives are threatening to eclipse all others. I'd like to think that here in West Devon we'd be a bit more balanced and a bit more chilled out than that, but I have witnessed strong tribal rivalries expressed even here.

The article I was reading went on to give some very helpful advice to both tribes about how they should view the other as we exit the EU. To Leavers, the encouragement is to be honest enough to accept that March 29<sup>th</sup> will bring some pain before it brings gain, and that that pain is not the fault of Remainers for negotiating a bad deal. Any deal was bound to be a compromise. There is no perfect way to extricate Britain from 40 years of purposeful European integration. So Leavers, please do all you can to lessen the pain the country may feel once we leave.

The challenge to Remainers is to show they fully accept the result of the referendum by working hard to make the best of the situation we are now in, and not blame Brexiteers for the inevitable short-term losses the country may suffer. Remainers need to accept that the price of living in a democracy is that sometimes we have to be good losers, and any attempt to thwart the decision of the referendum would be dangerous for democracy. Personally, this is why I am not in favour of a "People's Vote". We've had one already.

I hope that in a local community like ours, our tribal loyalty to one another and to the red soil of our parishes will come to fore and drown out the Brexit barracking. It needs to. Too much damage has been done. A time of healing is needed, or better still, physiotherapy. Like a player trying to return from injury stronger and fitter, I hope the task of getting on with making the best of Brexit will in itself be the physio our country needs. Then, hopefully one day soon two tribes will again be one nation.



Remembered a century on, casualties of the Great War.

Driver Herbert Stentiford aged 43 of the Army Service Corps who died on March 13th 1919 in North Tawton. He lived at Higher Newland Cottages, North Tawton.

Private William Arscott aged
18 of the 52nd Battalion of the
Devonshire Regiment. He died on March
23rd in Etaples Hospital, France. He lived at
Crooke Cottage, North Tawton.

Private Frederick Tiller aged 36 of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry. He died on March 30th in Egypt and is commemorated on the Alexandria War Memorial. He lived in Barton Street, North Tawton.

Lance Corporal Samuel Horn aged 31 of the 1st Battalion of the Devonshire Regiment. He died of wounds in March 1919 and is buried in Sampford Courtenay Churchyard. He lived at Sampford Chapel.



### **Defibrillators and Defibrillator Training**

The Council has signed a new agreement with the South West Ambulance Foundation Trust for provision of 2 brand new replacement defibrillators, to include the relevant support package for the next 4 years. These defibrillators are situated outside the Council Office at 14a The Square, North Tawton, EX20 2EP, and outside Fore Street Garage, EX20 2ED. (The defibrillator located at Strawberry Fields was purchased by the Council and is outside this agreement). New boxes have been provided, so the equipment will look different, but it still operates in exactly the same way.

The package agreement includes annual defibrillator training, which is not generally well attended. We would like to try and provide training sessions at convenient times for our residents – so, please email or write to the Clerk (contact details at foot of page) and let us know of days and times that you think would be convenient – for example, Saturday mornings might be more helpful.

### **Seamoor Lotto**

SeaMoor Lotto was created in 2018 by South Hams District Council and West Devon Borough Council. Set up to support community projects in the local area, the SeaMoor Lotto operates on the principle of raising money within the community for the community.

In a time of shrinking budgets and increased community need, SeaMoor Lotto enables people to support the causes they care most about, helping good causes to connect with their supporters.

A ticket for the SeaMoor Lotto costs £1 per week and 60p returns to the local council to be devoted to good causes; of that 60p, 50p goes directly to our local area and 10p across the district generally.

### North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

### Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

According to husband, I've just had a 'lovely day out'. First stop — Mole Avon — to look at the wood. Should I get '6be4' or '4be4'? We stop to admire the galvanised wheel barrows and look longingly at the railway sleepers. Then it's inside to check out the incredible range of wellies and boiler suits. Is he the only man on the planet to have 'best' 'good' and 'not so good' wellies? With the same grading in boiler suits? This is not supposed to be an advert for Mole Avon but letting husband loose in there is like the proverbial small child in a sweet shop. I can summon up only a tiny fraction of his enthusiasm for strimmer cord and coach bolts and screws. (he has just given me a detailed description of what makes a coach bolt different to a coach screw — you do not need to know this, believe me). We're through the tills, we're heading for the exit and he suggests 'let's get some seed potatoes' HURRAH. I can sense the possibility of a trade-off looming — seed potatoes in exchange for tea and Bakewell slice at the garden centre. Deal? Done.

Let's move on to teaching English to village children in Tanzania. Which is precisely what retired police man David Harvey applied to do in 2008 when he came across a volunteering opportunity in a newspaper. The charity 'Village Africa' was set up in 2006 by Caroline Johnston and a local village priest and is based in the village of Yamba, high up in the Western Usambara mountains in Eastern Africa. David described his initial arrival in Milingano followed by the challenging trek, on foot for the last couple of miles, up into the mountains to Yamba (the views were stunning). The village houses were made from wattle and daub, the roof was either galvanised (a sign of wealth) or grass and split banana leaves. Two streams running through the village were used for everything and as a result were heavily polluted. Plastic containers (a very precious commodity) were used to collect the mountain mist water that would run off the roof tops. The soil was very shallow but surprisingly fertile which allowed the villagers to harvest three crops per year of plantain, beans, maize and potato. However, David described them as living life virtually on the edge of drought conditions. Despite the tough environment the villagers seemed happy and content – teaching the children was fun and David tried hard to make lessons colourful and active with as much learning as possible taking place outside. A typical morning started with exercise (regardless of the fact that some pupils had just walked three miles through the bush to school) followed by assembly and the Tanzanian National anthem. Cookery lessons for the girls would include how to pound plantain – football for the boys would involve a ball made from plastic bags wrapped up with string and elastic bands. Everyone loved to make music - whether it was playing homemade guitars or singing - and the school even had its own drum band. David's particularly special memories are of the spectacular scenery, the sunrises and sunsets, and the people – especially the children. He may only have been there for three months but the impact of his Village Africa experience was clearly profound.

The Devon Federation W.I. quiz is almost upon us – we are furiously revising (maybe not that furiously) we are hoping that the cake selection at half time is as yummy as in previous years and that (as happened one year) the team next to us is composed of a gluten free lady, a vegan, one lady with Type 2 diabetes and another lady 'trying to be good'. I'm proud to say we helped them out.

We are invited to sign up for a bluebell walk on Dartmoor in May or experience a Medieval Day at Church House, South Tawton. Want to know more about late medieval lifestyles including fashion and makeup tips? There will even be an opportunity to do some fifteenth century dancing. My mind is suddenly filled with images of husband at a recent 'wedding disco' – when I asked him about his unusual 'style' he said 'those moves are all my own work'. I've just checked fifteenth century dances on YouTube – step, step, step hop - it's him!!

### OKEHAMPTON AND DISTRICT LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

### ROMAN REMAINS STUDY DAY ON AUGUST 10th.

The Roman occupation of Britain lasted from about AD 50 until AD 450. At several different periods during that time North Tawton was the site of important military bases probably guarding the crossing of the River Taw on the road which led through Exeter and Okehampton. Some of these military camps would have had thousands of troops present with accompanying buildings.

Recent excavations in the building site to the East of Okehampton have provided a clearer view of the importance of this area. There is archaeological work being carried out on the North Tawton sites during this year. Some of this in association with building work, some by a group of archaeologists from Exeter University and the County.

Our Society is organising a study day in North Tawton on 10th August 2019. This will include illustrated talks on the Roman Features which are visible in the area of De Bathe Cross and Newland Mill. By courtesy of Rev'd Nick Weldon these will be given in St. Peter's Church North Tawton starting at 2 p.m.


We are pleased that we will get information from a group which will include local archaeologist Steve Stocker who has a full and up to date knowledge of the Roman features in the area, Chris Smart who has a wide knowledge of the Roman Forts in Devon and Joao Fonte who is experienced in modern archeological methods and has a wide knowledge of the Roman Military.

Some of the Roman features are visible from public roads and footpaths. By the generosity of several local landowners we will be able to visit other local sites where the Roman features can be seen. The arrangements for these escorted visits will be published nearer the time and numbers may have to be limited.

This event will be named after Dr. Jean Shields BEM who contributed so much to the historical knowledge of our area.

We always welcome visitors to our meetings and I hope that those of us who live close to these important historical features will be able to attend. There will be a small charge to cover temporary membership of our society.







The first signs of Spring really are here. It is hard to imagine that we had to close the school just a few weeks ago because of the snow! Driving through the lanes to Chagford School,



### **ROYAL BRITISH LEGION.- NORTH TAWTON BRANCH - Founded Feb 1922**

Brian Balsdon who died recently had been a tower of strength in his help and expertise and gave some hope of the Branch surviving against the odds. Brian became Membership Secretary at a time when RBL was undergoing major changes, some of which meant members were not receiving cards, making it almost impossible at Branch level to know member numbers. By patient application Brian resolved this. As Vice Chairman he was a reliable member of the committee. At the 2018 AGM he became Chairman.

Tribute should be paid to Barry Ware, who has been Branch Chairman for almost twenty years, through a long illness and difficult times. He has sustained the Branch, the annual Auction funding the Christmas widows payments and has organised regular Mystery trips for several years. Barry took over as the last of the World War Two veteran members could no longer manage.

Clifford Westlake was Chairman for many years, Reg Farley, Reg Fry, Alf Bolt and Les Skinner were long term members. One of the innovations, still being presented was the Legion Shield awarded at the School at the end of Term, the staff deciding the winner and certificate recipients.

Viewers of "Dad's Army" will have seen the scramble to enlist in the Local Defence Volunteers, in fact this task fell to the Legion Chairman Bill Heath, who later segregated the older veterans to form the North Tawton Post of the Royal Observer Corps. Major Legion events pre-war had been the Children's party and the Garden Produce show.

Nationally the Legion made much of the 90th Anniversary because of the uncertainty of Branches lasting until the Centenary. In order for the North Tawton Branch to reach our Centenary in 2022 we need new members. Please consider how you can help.
