Giant-killing

"North Taunton?! Where's that?" came the comment from an opposing team member on the other side of the clubhouse. "No, North Tawton!" someone replied. "Well, whatever it's called I've never heard of centenary this year. We have numerous successful them anyway." Forty minutes later North Tawton Under 10's football team had beaten them 5-0 to reach the Cup Final. YES! I wasn't even there to witness the glorious occasion, as I had a church meeting that evening. However, when I received a text reporting the victory, of which my son was a key part, let's just say... the meeting went well.

Everyone loves an underdog, and there is nothing like sport to produce one. Some of the recent examples I can remember are Japan humbling the mighty Springboks in the 2015 Rugby World Cup; Leicester City winning the Premier League in 2016; Greece winning Euro 2004; but the history of sport is littered with many a giant-killing. Let's hope the mighty North Tawton Under 10's are victorious again on 5th May in the final. And maybe more sporting history will be written this Spring. By the time this is published, perhaps someone will have been plucked from obscurity to win the Masters golf at Augusta. Maybe Mr. Blobby or someone in a dinosaur costume will have won the London Marathon. Perhaps not.

I happen to be writing this article between two extraordinary sporting dramas of a different kind. The favourite has just won the Grand National. It's the only horse race I tend to watch, but even I know the favourite rarely wins, and what's more Tiger Roll is the first back-to-back winner since Red Rum in 1974. And in a few hours time, a man even older than me will compete in the Boat Race – James Cracknell. As an ex-rower myself, perhaps there is hope for me yet. I seriously doubt it. Not fit enough and certainly not brainy enough to go to Cambridge.

Spring tends to bring with it a succession of sporting dramas. As we near the end of the football and rugby seasons many eyes will look to Cup Finals, play-offs and relegations battles. Personally, I am delighted that Exeter Chiefs are (again) riding high at the top of the Premiership with a play-off final at Twickenham looking likely. But even if you are not interested in that kind of thing, I hope you are delighted to hear about our Under 10's footballers (did I mention them?...and my son being one of them?... oh yes I did... sorry... one very proud Dad here!). But they are not the only local team doing very well in 2019. The 1st XV at North Tawton Rugby Club is on the verge of promotion. Congratulations to them. And I think in many other walks of life, for a little place like us, we do very well. Between the four communities of Honeychurch, Sampford Courtenay,

Bondleigh and North Tawton we have three big companies which have a country-wide reach, one of whom (Gregory Distribution) is celebrating its small businesses too, tucked away on farms and in back rooms. We have a wonderful variety of clubs and societies, quizzes and coffee mornings also. Indeed, within a hundred metres of my house I could play bowls, appear on stage with ANTS, or strut my stuff at zumba, pilates, ballet, or badminton. I'm not sure what some of those things are (!) but I know lots of you enjoy them, because I see you walking along the road to the Town Hall everyday. The fact of the matter is, there is loads to do here, and that is great. Most of my wider family live in far bigger places than this, but they often comment about how much there is to do in this community. We punch above our weight. We're good at giant-killing here.

That phrase, of course, comes from the Biblical story of David slaving Goliath. It's a Sunday school and school assembly favourite. However, the Bible is littered with many unlikely victories and victors. Usually it is the Israelites who turn out winners, be that against the Egyptians at the Exodus, or against the various big and scary tribes who occupied their land. But there were also many times when God's people were on the losing side too. Indeed, the Israel which Jesus was born into in the first century was a "bottom of the league" occupied territory. The Romans were the league leaders at the time.

For the most part, victory for God's people tended to be a function of their faithfulness to him and to each other. It wasn't automatic, but usually when the people cared about their God and cared about each other, they tended to be victorious in life, or at least do better than expected. I think there is a lesson for us all there, especially if we are involved in some club or society. If we are just in it for ourselves, then failure is likely. At this time of Easter, we commemorate the greatest giant-killing in history. A lone competitor is nailed to a cross, and He dies. Game over, with no extra-time. Sin and death have won. But then in the greatest come back since Lazarus, he rises victoriously three days later. Whatever happens to the Under 10's on 5th May, it's only that giant-killing that really matters, because it is a victory he won for us all. But nevertheless, come on boys! You can do it!

Borough, Parish & Town Council Elections 2019

These elections take place on Thursday 2nd May. Our local Polling Station is the Town Hall, as usual. There are 4 candidates for 2 places on West Devon Borough Council. Our Ward is Exbourne Ward (which comprises of several adjoining parishes). With reference to the Town Council, there are 12 vacancies; however we only had 10 candidates standing for these. This means the 10 are automatically elected, and soon after 2nd May the Council is likely to commence the procedure to co-opt a further 2 councillors. Please see the Town Council noticeboard or our website, northtawton.towncouncil@yahoo.co.uk for details of councillors automatically elected.

Assistant Clerk to North Tawton Town Council

The Council decided to continue with 2 Town Clerk posts; Town Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, and Assistant Town Clerk. Sarah Say took up the post of Town Clerk on a permanent basis in January, and Stephen Webb has now been appointed Assistant Town Clerk, following a formal interview. Four candidates were interviewed and there was a rigorous scoring process to identify the most suitable person for the post. The Council are very happy to welcome Stephen to his new role, and we are confident he will be a great asset to the Council.

Criminal Damage, Vandalism and Intimidation

Most of you will be aware of various issues occurring in the Town over the past two to three years, but you may not be aware of the scale and detail of the problem, the financial cost, and the impact on the quality of life of our residents. These are some of the events of which the Council is aware:

- Intimidation and harassment of one of the Council's contractors.
- Repeated deliberate defacement in the public toilets, including excrement being smeared on the walls and on the baby change unit this resulted in the toilets having to be closed for a period of time.
- Damage caused at North Tawton Primary School.
- Repeated vandalism of a light in the public car park, causing potential danger to elderly residents, as well as the cost of repair and replacement with a new light.
- Deliberate destruction of daffodils in the churchyard.
- Eggs being thrown at someone's house.
- £450 pounds worth of damage to contractors' fencing in the memorial park.
- Obscene and disturbing graffiti on the arches under Taw Bridge.
- Repeated and constant intimidation of groups meeting in the Town Hall, such that the external doors now have to be locked to prevent unauthorised entry. Constant banging on the doors of the hall causing disturbance and distress to users. Please be aware this includes little 5 and 6 year olds attending dance classes.

The police are aware of these issues and I assure residents that action is being taken. However, on reporting the latest incident, the graffiti at Taw Bridge, I have been requested to ask residents to report to the police any incident of harassment or damage. They are most adamant that they need all the evidence they can get. Just ring 101 and report the details – even if the police cannot investigate each incident, they need to have a clear record. They also need people who have witnessed incidents to report and to be willing to produce a witness statement if necessary. With reference to incidents at the Town Hall, the police officer I spoke to termed it to be <u>completely unacceptable</u> that occupiers have to lock themselves into the building. They regard this very seriously, and we should do the same. The residents and children of our town have the right to feel safe and happy going about their day to day life. The financial costs of damage are being paid for directly from the precept, which comes from your Council Tax, using up funding which could be used for the benefit of residents. The human cost is far more concerning, and I would encourage everyone affected to ensure they take action by reporting all incidents to the police. Thank you for your co-operation.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

'Fascinator' – the word comes from the latin "fascinatus" meaning "to bewitch, or cast a spell on". The English language verb "to fascinate" means "to attract and hold attentively by a unique power, personal charm, unusual nature, or some other special quality".

Do I need to make a fascinator in order to bewitch or cast a spell on husband? Obviously, the answer to that is yes. Husband insisted I wear it whilst making the tea. He then proceeded to giggle incessantly. Not the effect I had anticipated. It is now in the spare bedroom – in a bag. However, it was a brilliant workshop, attended by ten of our ladies, with accomplished milliner Teresa Kendall guiding us gently through the steps of 'How to make a Fascinator'. Hilary's dining room table was awash with netting, feathers, beads and flowers – oh and UHU glue. Thank goodness for UHU. It means you don't have to do the sewing thingy.

Back to our April meeting and a talk from Carmen Luscombe about Associated Country Women of the World. A.C.W.W. was formed in 1929 by Madge Watts, the lady who introduced the W.I. to Wales back in 1915. It is an international charity with the aim of connecting and supporting rural women worldwide. It has nine million members across 84 countries with 470 member societies including the National Federation of W.I.'s. It believes in creating opportunities for women to exercise more power through being better informed, being part of an enabling environment and having the necessary tools to carry out the changes they want. A.C.W.W. offers active support for a wide range of crucial development programmes in rural communities including leadership and skills training, nutrition and education, literacy, HIV/Aids awareness, small business initiatives and small-scale agricultural income-generating initiatives.

In the 1930's the first Chairman of A.C.W.W.'s Finance Committee suggested that every member should contribute a penny over and above their subscription to help with the running of A.C.W.W.. This is now known as the Pennies for Friendship Fund and this money provides the life-blood of A.C.W.W. allowing them to connect and support women and communities worldwide. When sending our Pennies for Friendship from Devon we can specify which priority focus area we want our funds to support (e.g. Maternal and Reproductive Health). We will then get regular feedback from A.C.W.W. updating us on the development of the project. Through her illustrated talk Carmen certainly gave us a much better understanding of the role and aims of a sister organisation that we knew little about.

Oh we were very busy in our tea break. "Busy doing what?" you may well ask. And I would reply – busy eating cake of course. Cake is a very serious business and I like to give it my absolute, undivided attention. I could dedicate this whole article to cake but that sensible voice at the very back of my brain is saying "No – tell them about the John Lewis Lock In". Oh – you mean the evening at John Lewis when hundreds of W.I. ladies from all over Devon enjoyed gin, martini and prosecco tastings? On the nights from Wednesday 29th May until Saturday 1st June, ANTS will transport you back in time to war torn Britain in 1940. Thousands upon thousands of children were evacuated from the cities, leaving their families behind, to the relative safety of the countryside. This would definitely have included North Tawton and its surrounds.

Brilliantly organised by the War Time Government (Yes I know this sounds very unlikely today!) The Steam Trains ran non stop. These children encountered an unknown environment and culture because in those days there was no Television or media and most did not travel very far from their home, SO there was a massive collision between countryside and city, age groups and culture.

This is the story of one such encounter. But the great British spirit shone through and in the majority of cases there was a happy meeting and happy ending to an encounter that foresaw the protection and survival of the next generation of Great Britain.
