

From The Rectory

Is revival coming?

In North Tawton it has been pleasing to see a couple decade, as are numbers of baptisms, of shops recently opening up again in the Square with new businesses going in, and there is at least one more coming later this summer too. Sadly, like most rural communities, we have got used to seeing shops close in recent years. I am no retail expert, but perhaps now that the boom in online grocery shopping has settled down a bit, people are looking again to local shops for particular products and services that the internet does not provide as effectively. It's probably too early to say, but maybe the Square is beginning a bit of a revival. I hope so, because nobody likes to see empty shop fronts. It feels like the soul of a place has departed.

Of course, the rural economy is far bigger and more complex than what can or cannot be seen on village high streets and in town squares. They are merely the most visible indicators of health in the rural economy and may not offer a true picture of the whole. But I'd hazard a guess that general levels of consumer confidence across West Devon increase a little each time another empty shop front is reoccupied. Surely it is in everyone's interests to have more reasons for people to get out of their cars and get off the broadband to spend their money locally. Maybe revival is coming?

I was reading recently about revival in Poland and Hungary; a revival of a slightly different kind admittedly. I think I now know a little bit about rural economics in Devon, but I've yet to get to grips with the spending habits of country folk in Central Europe! No – the revival described in those two countries was of a more political and spiritual nature. Nevertheless, it struck me that the growing conditions for the seeds of revival there are not wholly dissimilar to here. Unlike us, neither country has held a referendum about their membership of the European Union yet. But I gather both Poland and Hungary do have softly Eurosceptic conservative governments at the moment, so it's not unthinkable that they will. Inevitably, therefore, each government does attract accusations for being too right-wing and nationalistic. On that basis, I don't think it would be wise for me to comment any further about either of them, because I'm not from there. Besides, I find the current political scene in this country infuriating and bewildering enough. I don't think I've got the patience or desire to start trying to understand the situation in Warsaw or Budapest as well, and the vast rural areas in-between. However, for one reason or another, chicken or egg, in Central Europe there seems to be a real national revival going on as people rediscover their historical and religious roots. For example, church attendance has been rising every year in both countries over the last

confirmations, first communions and marriages. Remarkably, marriage rates in Hungary have increased by 43% since 2010, and divorce rates have dropped by 22.5% over the same period. No matter where you stand religiously or politically. surely that has got to be good for every member of society.

The kind of revival Christians like me long for is for individuals to return to the Lord in deep faith and in great number. It is something I pray for regularly for two reasons: the glory of God and the good of mankind. I genuinely believe that as people rediscover faith in Christ then it is good for all, even those that don't believe or believe in a different god. Blessing is multiplied like loaves and fish. Whole areas, even whole countries can be transformed. It happened in Scotland and in the United States with the Great Awakening in the mid 1700's, and across Wales in 1904-05. Throughout the second half of the 18th century, thousands came to Christ across Devon and Cornwall largely under the ministry of Wesleyan preachers, despite opposition from the Established Church of which I am now a part. John Wesley himself made 31 visits to the West Country, and despite getting a rather frosty reception in North Tawton in 1765, by the 1851 census just under half the total population of both counties were members of Methodist chapels. Schools and hospitals were founded, prisons reformed, slavery abolished, and many of the laws we take for granted today were established across the UK during this time. It doesn't happen automatically, and too often Christians have used their influence inappropriately, but simply put, Christian revival is good for society.

Now, I'm not arguing that Britain should become more British, or England more English, or even Devon more Devonian. I'm not sure really what any of those things mean, if they are things at all. And I am certainly not arguing for a mono-chrome society where differences and distinctions are not genuinely welcomed and celebrated. But a reconnection with our God, our land, our history and our hopes would be better for all, I'm sure of it. It might even result in a fuller and friendlier high street also, as people spend their money and spend their time a little more knowingly and a little closer to the place they call home. Lord, bring revival!

Proposal for creating a 'Man Shed' for North Tawton, using the Chapel of Rest in the Cemetery Grounds as a venue.

Are you interested in socialising, helping your community, sharing your skills, gaining a real sense of achievement, and being part of a new initiative in North Tawton? Find out about the Man Shed movement and get in touch with the Town Council if you want to be part of this project.

What is a Men's Shed?

The 'Man Shed' concept originally started in Australia as a way of combatting social isolation amongst men. It's now spread worldwide - in the UK there are over 400 'Sheds', with a growth of almost 10 per month. Men's Sheds are similar to garden sheds, the difference is that garden sheds and their activities are often solitary in nature while Men's Sheds are the opposite. They're about:

social connections and friendship building sharing skills and knowledge individual pursuits and community projects achievement and social interaction a place of leisure where men come together to work.

You can usually find woodworking, metalworking, repairing and restoring, electronics, model buildings or even car building in a typical Shed. Sheds typically attract older men, but many have younger members and women too. Whatever the activity, the essence of a Shed is not a building, but the connections and relationships between its members. Many Sheds get involved in community projects too – restoring village features, helping maintain parks and green spaces, and building things for schools, libraries and individuals in need.

Why are they needed?

Research has shown the negative impact of loneliness and isolation on health and wellbeing. Recent evidence shows that loneliness and isolation can be as hazardous to our health as obesity and excessive smoking. Men typically find it more difficult to build social connections than women. Unlike women of a similar age, less older men have networks of friends and rarely share personal concerns about health and personal worries. For some men, when retirement comes, it can feel as if personal identity and purpose is lost. Men's Sheds can change all of that.

Sheds are about meeting like-minded people and having someone to share your worries with. They are about having fun, sharing skills and knowledge with like-minded people and gaining a renewed sense of purpose and belonging. As a by-product of all of that they reduce isolation and feelings of loneliness, they allow men to deal with mental health challenges more easily and remain independent; they rebuild communities and, in many cases, they save men's lives.

If you are interested in progressing this project please contact the Town Clerk. The Council believe that this could be of huge benefit to our community, but it can only work if there are people who want to commit to it in partnership with the Town Council. If we get sufficient interest we'll set up an initial meeting to see if the project can be progressed. If this proves successful, the Council will consider improvements to the Chapel of Rest to provide a suitable venue for a North Tawton 'Man Shed'.

Complaints about dog fouling

Over the past few weeks we have received many complaints about dog fouling. We are very grateful to responsible dog owners who pick up after their dogs, and use the dog bins which are provided by the Town Council and which we also pay to have emptied. Anecdotal evidence indicates it's only a small minority who are leaving dog fouling on pavements, where all too often children tread in it – we all know this is a potentially serious health hazard. I would like to issue a heartfelt plea – please, carry a bag with you and pick up after your dog – the bag can be put into any litter bin, not just the dedicated dog bins. Thank you for your cooperation.

News from the Castle

Hi everyone,

All is going well at Castle Drogo with the weather making it possible for the builders to catch up on some of the time they lost during the cold snap. It has been wonderful to welcome visitors back to see the Drawing and Dining room in full glory and the gardens have been full of colour.

This year presents some exciting opportunities in research as we are looking to start an oral history project. We'll be recording the memories of those associated with, or with memories of, Castle Drogo in the past, from the early days or in more recent years. If you have any memories, or know someone who might have, and is willing to talk to one of our trained interviewers, then please get in touch. You can find out more about the project in the Rayners' Room in the castle where there is a place for people to record their contact details, or please email: oralhistorycastledrogo@nationaltrust.org.uk. We are really looking forward to hearing the memories from people.

I wanted to let you all know as soon as possible that we will be closing Foresters track for around one month in mid-June. Foresters Track is a permissive bridleway running on the South side of the river between Fingle Bridge and Whiddon Deer Park. There will be an alternative route for those wishing to do a circular/ longer walk, or for those cycling or on horseback. However, the public footpath on the north side of the bank (fishermans path) will remain open and provides the most direct route to avoid the closure, but only on foot.

The closure is to allow over 200 metres of major track repairs to take place to fix erosion caused by the river Teign. The resulting track surface should make the path more accessible for all users, and improve access for our own work operations, as well as reinforcing the river bank. The timing of the work is to take advantage of minimum water flow within the river and all works should be completed by the summer holidays. The track will be entirely shut at all times including weekends due to the risk of falling rocks and unstable surfaces.

READING FOCUS

North Tawton Community Primary School has always encouraged our children to extend their learning beyond the requirements and expectations of the National Curriculum. Part of this approach to enhance learning is the encouragement of reading for pleasure.

The school is working hard to help our children to discover the joys of reading. We have launched a new regular competition for the children, which has already had some very positive results. In February we held a reading competition, Read in February. To the delight of the librarians, the competition led to a tremendous increase in registered users at Okehampton Library. In April we held another competition, Avid April Readers. We altered the rules slightly to encourage the children to read a wider range of genres. I am pleased to report that both of these initiatives were very well received by pupils and parents, who responded with great enthusiasm.


Last month I attended an OFSTED training session regarding their new inspection framework. Some important and alarming facts were highlighted. I was very concerned to learn about a landmark study conducted in the U.S.A. by Hart and Risley, which found stark differences in the learning and use of vocabulary across different social classes.

"Over four years, researchers recorded that an average child in a professional family accumulated experience of 45 million words; in a working-class family, 26 million words; and in a family receiving welfare, 13 million words." *Hart and Risley, 1995.*

Our Literacy teaching has an important focus on the use of very high-quality texts. We ensure that our children learn a wide range of vocabulary, and reading is placed very high on the agenda. We share our own enthusiasm and love of reading with the children at every possible opportunity, and our literacy results are projected to improve this year.


