

# The courage of faith

"Faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see," so it says in the Bible. For Christians, faith is about believing in the promises of God and acting upon them. So, for example, by faith I believe God has forgiven me of my wrong-doing because Jesus died on a cross in my place. He paid the price for me. It's one of the central aspects of Christianity. I didn't see him die with my own eyes (or indeed rise again). I wasn't there. But over time I have become convinced of the evidence. To me it would be unreasonable not to believe that the Bible's message is true.

This is why Christians reject the idea that faith and reason are somehow opposed to one another. Reason and make-believe are, but make-believe is not faith according to the Bible. Make-believe says there are fairies living at the bottom of my garden. Faith is persuaded there is a fox, because I have seen the evidence! Indeed. I think faith in a crucified and risen Jesus is perfectly reasonable, so much so that I not only believe it to be true, I seek to live my daily life on that basis. One of the main reasons I am a Vicar is that I want to help people see with their eyes of faith what I believe to be true. I long that people would have the courage to make a decision about their faith, for it seems many people trundle on through life without really deciding what they think about these matters, or daring to ever revisit them.

Faith takes courage; it always does, like the courage to believe that the bridge will hold as I walk across it; or that the plane will fly when it leaves the runway; or that when I open my mouth to sing, the right note will come out. I have no problem with heights or flying. I like both. The prospect of falling is not very welcome, but as long as I feel safe at height the distance to earth doesn't really bother me. For me, reason dictates that the plane or the bridge will do its job, so I put my faith in them. That particular adventure of faith excites me. However, when it comes to singing, especially singing solo, I find the adventure much more nerve–jangling.

Across our four churches there are a variety of worship styles in our services, from the lively and informal, to the choral and traditional. At Sampford Courtenay, Roger the organist has been trying for years to get me to sing the various priestly solo bits in the Prayer Book services they have there. He's not succeeded yet. I've got my reasons... "we've got a fantastic choir; one of them can do it; it's good to see others using their gifts." My excuses have worked so far, but perhaps not for much longer, because I sing quite a long solo in the latest St. Peter's Troupers production, Jesus Christ Superstar. "If you can do that Nick, why can't you do the bits in

the service?" he's been asking quite justifiably. In truth, I can actually sing a bit, and I quite enjoy it too, but only really when singing with other people. Singing solo is another thing altogether, and believe me, it has taken considerable courage and much practice to get myself confident enough to sing my solo part in JCSS. I've not been helped by the fact that my particular song is right at the top of my range too. As I write this today, with three days to go before the first performance, I can feel the nerves beginning to surface. Will I hit the right notes when it comes to my big moment in front of 150 people? I don't want to let the rest of the cast down. Oh no... my family is going to be there, and the Bishop! I'm just going to have to go for it I guess - another adventure of faith.

It's been said, "you should do one thing a day that scares you". The quotation is sometimes attributed to Eleanor Roosevelt, political activist and wife of a former U.S. President. But people of my generation will know the quote from the brilliant spoken word song by Baz Luhrmann that reached number one in the U.K. charts in 1999... "Everyone's free to wear sunscreen". Google it. I'm not sure doing something everyday that scares you is particularly good advice, but maybe once or twice a year we should sum up the courage and go for it.

For me, singing solo has been scary. By the time this is published we'll know if it has been painful too – for the audience! But I have found it wonderfully invigorating to face my fears and do something that requires the courage of faith. Six months ago I certainly could not see myself doing it, nor was I sure of what I hoped for .... to nail those high notes in front of a packed audience. But the adventure has been a life-giving one, and not just for me. It has been wonderful to see others on the JCSS stage doing things that they have never done before or not done for many years.

I think there is a tendency in all of us to seek to live unchallenging and unchallenged lives, to do nothing that scares us for fear of exposure. I think we are often the lesser for it and we can miss out on what life has to offer in God's world. So I challenge you to take an adventure of faith before the year is out, and perhaps do something that scares you, maybe even dare to revisit some of your beliefs about life and God too. Remembrance, Christmas and a fast approaching New Year are perhaps the best times of year to do this. Go for it!

This, however, proved not financially lucrative so she started making adult footwear too. The year was 1981 and the name 'Green Shoes' was a nod to the early days of the Green Movement and Greenpeace whilst reflecting her close proximity to Dartmoor. The business was becoming more successful.


A fire in the premises forced Alison to relocate elsewhere in Totnes. Undaunted, she started putting on workshops, and when the opportunity arose to buy a large disused chapel in Moretonhampstead, she jumped at it. Now there was plenty of space for workshops and her shoemaking team grew. Alison is now looking to 'retire' but Green Shoes will hopefully go on. To bring a visual dimension to her talk, Alison had brought samples of both shoes and boots along with some of the equipment she uses and some gorgeous swatches of soft, beautifully coloured leather. Karen volunteered to have her foot measured which involved carefully drawing around her feet and a variety of measurements. The beginnings of a tailor-made pair of shoes. Alison pointed out that all her shoes and boots can be resoled at least three times thus making them last so much longer than your average high street bought footwear. A really interesting talk from an inspirational lady.

Suitably refreshed and onto business stuff. Excitement is mounting regarding our pre-Christmas evening 'lockin' at John Lewis. And it just so happens we're having our 'Awaie Day at the Waie Inn' on the same day – so having skittled, swam and yoga'd ourselves to a frenzy, a bit of light retail therapy will be the perfect antidote. #### Okehampton Library joins the fight against hygiene poverty

The staff at Okehampton Library are thrilled to announce a new partnership with Beauty Banks. Libraries and Beauty Banks are all about supporting people in local communities to be the best they can be, and this joint partnership means that libraries can help more people when they are at their most vulnerable. Beauty Banks is a people powered movement co-founded by PR beauty guru Jo Jones and journalist Sali Hughes. The social enterprise is made up of a community of people who share the belief that being clean is a basic human right and fundamental to our general health, our mental health and wellbeing.

Beauty Banks, which launched in February 2018 collects new and unused products, re-packages them and mindfully distributes them to registered charity partners for distribution to the guests they serve.

Okehampton Library is the latest library in Devon to become a 'Beauty Spot', a location where the public can donate unwanted hygiene products that will then be collected by Beauty Banks and redistributed to people in need. Libraries Unlimited, the charity that runs Devon Libraries, has already opened beauty spots in Exeter Library, Paignton Library and Barnstaple Library.

Carole Cornwall, Library Supervisor at Okehampton Library said: "Library customers are kind, supportive and generous as we've seen with our Period Poverty collection points in libraries across Devon, and in Exeter with the donations made to ensure homeless people were warm and well clothed last winter. Libraries are safe spaces open to everyone and are ideally placed to be able to support their local communities and those who are most in need within those communities. We know that feeling good about yourself is important in so many ways and we hope that our customers will support this great initiative."

She continued: "We're looking for donations of basic hygiene products such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, shower gel, shaving gel, soap, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, tampons or sanitary towels, body lotion, hairbrushes, combs. Also essentials for children – baby shampoo, nappies, wipes, nappy cream, baby bath and lotion, hairbrushes and toothbrushes. Teens also need deodorant, spot cream and sanitary protection. Beauty Banks clients living in temporary accommodation and homeless shelters often need travel minis they can carry more easily from place to place."

Beauty Banks serve all kinds of clients of all genders and ages. Put yourself in any of their shoes and donate what you would need to feel human and dignified. Also accepted are donations of otherwise unattainable luxuries like makeup. Beauty Banks asks that only unused and unopened products are donated for health and safety reasons. These donations will then be distributed in the community through a local organisation.
