

From The Rectory

The crux of Christmas

What spells Christmas to you...? the key festive feature that you just will not do without again this year? Maybe it's all the family gathered around the tree, mountains of food, mulled wine or mince pies. Maybe it's a trip to the panto or a Christmas market, a midnight church service or Carols from Kings. Maybe it's a quiet few days off work at the end of another long year. What's the crux of Christmas for you?

The context of Christmas in the UK this year will inevitably be the build up towards and the aftermath of the general election. We go to the polls on 12th December. The context of the first Christmas in Palestine was not an election, but another big political event.

As Luke writes in his account of Jesus' birth, "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world." (Luke 2:1) He notes that a man called Quirinius was governor of Syria at the time, and that Joseph needed to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem in order to register with his pregnant fiancé, because that was where his family were from. So apart from showing the reason why Mary ended up giving birth in Bethlehem, in line with ancient prophecy, the census seems like a bit of a side issue in the Nativity. Yet every time Luke's gospel is read at a carol service, the census is mentioned. I don't remember ever seeing Caesar Augustus or Governor Quirinius featuring heavily in a nativity play. And no one remembers the census now. I wonder what it showed?

My hunch is that in 100 years time people will have long forgotten about the outcome of this Christmas election too. I suppose Brexit will be remembered, and studied, probably as a shining example of a poorly handled political crisis. But who wins on 12th December, and by how much, will be a short footnote in the history of 21st Century Britain, much like the Roman census at the time of Christ's birth. Context is always important, but events and personalities usually take precedence. It's the Christ of Christmas that is the crux of Christmas, not the context either then or now.

As I write this in the second week of November, commercial Christmas is well underway. Yet again, marketing departments everywhere decided that as soon as we lost interest in Halloween (at about 7.31pm on 31st Oct) we all now must be interested in Christmas, and desperate to spend. We have to be! Aren't you? Why have you not bought your plastic-free, LED, organic, flashing baubles yet? Like many people I've got a bit of love/hate relationship with commercial Christmas. It's nice to see lights going up everywhere, especially as the dark evenings get darker. There are usually one or two Christmas adverts on TV that are touchingly beautiful or genuinely amusing, amongst the many annoying ones. I don't mind the jangly music played

endlessly in shops (as long as it's the unedited version of Fairytale of New York). And what's not to like about a Christmas carol and a Christmas market? But commercial Christmas is not the crux of Christmas. Commercial Christmas is credit-card Christmas – consumer Christmas. The crux of Christmas is Christ.

Okay – so you can see were this is going, and I've just thought of another two more C's. (Maybe you can think of few. Let me know). Culinary Christmas is not the crux of Christmas either. Christmas dinner may be the much-loved centrepiece of your family Christmas. It certainly will be for mine. In fact with in-laws to visit, and local events here, I usually end up having four or five Christmas dinners throughout late December. This is great, because I can have turkey for most of them and beef for another. I've never had a year when I've needed to resort to the nut-roast option for the sake of variety, but there's always a first. Let's face it though... the foodie indulgence at this time of year is off the scale these days. Apparently most supermarket home delivery slots for the week running up to Christmas Day get snapped up within minutes of going live online. They went live weeks ago, so you are far too late if you still want one. A pre-ordered turkey from a local farm shop can easily cost over £100 these days. That's one item of food worth the same as a week's food for a family of five in the UK, or a month's food for a family in many other parts of the world. The supermarkets will be open again on 27th December, so do we really need to stack our trolleys that high? No - don't let culinary Christmas stuff your Christmas. Leave room for the Christ of Christmas.

The final C is the crisis of Christmas. There is nothing like the pressure of Christmas to reveal the cracks in life. Perhaps it is the memory of past happier Christmases when everyone got on better, and a long-lost loved-one was still around. Many a Christmas is spent in hospital, or working, or alone, or dealing with some crisis. Some use Christmas to fend off a crisis too – a few days spent in wine-soaked denial – only for the crisis to return in the New Year. Well, when Christ came at Christmas he was born not into happy, healthy, perfection or privilege. He came as God into the reality of life in all its ups and downs, to redeem it and remake it. He alone is the crux of Christmas. So please leave some room under the tree for Him.







North Tawton Town Council Town Centre Car Park – Act of Criminal Damage

The Council is extremely concerned about a recent act of criminal damage involving a vehicle parked in the car park. On Tuesday 29th October the Lloyds Bank Mobile Bank was unable to park safely, and therefore unable to serve customers. This was because the bollards put out to reserve the space for the bank had been moved and put around another vehicle, and a car had then parked in the reserved space. Lloyds Bank staff overheard one of their customers stating they would put a notice on the windscreen of the vehicle where the bollards had been placed. Subsequently, a large cardboard notice was glued to the windscreen of this vehicle. However, the vehicle in question was parked where it was entitled to, and NOT in a space normally reserved for the bank. Regardless of this, the fixing of this notice fits precisely into the legal definition of criminal damage. If anyone has information as to the person who committed this criminal act, please would you inform the Council? The Council is considering what action should be taken in respect of this issue — our residents are entitled to be protected and governed by the laws of the land, and not be subject to acts of ill-informed vigilantism by persons who decide to take the law into their own hands.

North Tawton Neighbourhood Plan

NORTH TAW

We are pleased to report that the Neighbourhood Plan has now completed the Examination Stage of the process. The Examiner made some recommendations about policy wording and maps, as well as a couple of statements we need to include in the plan. However on the whole the Plan was well received and subject to the recommendations being accepted, the Plan meets the basic conditions as defined in the Localism Act 2011. This means that once we have made the required changes the Plan can be submitted to a referendum. This is a huge sigh of relief and means that all the years of hard work by several Councillors and members of the public will finally result in (hopefully) an adopted Plan for the residents of North Tawton.

Of course, as with any formal process, there are still procedures to go through with West Devon Borough Council before residents can vote on the Plan at Referendum. This is likely to be in January or February – we will keep you posted of timescales and process.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Husband is feeling 'housey'. I've just had to add housey to my laptop dictionary as it didn't recognise the word. Husband says the weather is to blame. He's just looked out of the front of the house and has announced that it's raining. He's now on his way through the hallway and the kitchen to look out of the back windows to tell me that it's raining there too. All this rain has led to the diagnosis of feeling housey. And he has a cold. The combination of houseyness and a head cold is tricky. I've long suggested that he could do with an indoor hobby and this is always met with a look that says 'if you think that an Airfix model kit is going to help you are sadly mistaken'. So, he's going out to the shed. In other words, he's going to stand in the shed and look at things. Things that he's put in assorted margarine tubs. Things that when questioned as to why he wants to keep them he will reply 'because it might come in handy'. I'm not too sure that they ever have.

Our November speaker was Ros Fry – Ros is a Community Legacy Manager with Cancer Research UK and part of her remit is to give talks about their latest research and the impact that leaving a gift in a Will can have. If any of us thought that this topic was going to be serious and difficult to listen to, we were proved wrong. Ros had brought her glamorous assistant Andy (Ros's words not mine) along to help and between them they gave an entertaining, interactive and factual presentation packed with interesting statistics. It was reassuring to hear that 82p out of every £1 donated to CRUK goes directly into funding research and that over the last 40 years cancer survival rates in the UK have doubled. Back in the 1970's just a quarter of people survived – today that figure is a half.

Ros went on to tell us about how personalised medicine is so important – people with the same cancer can have different forms of the disease so responses to treatment can vary - and cancers growing in different parts of the body may also share the same genetic faults so respond to similar treatments. Scientists are therefore looking into developing new drug treatments that target specific genetic faults and designing more efficient clinical trials.

Apart from putting money into collection tins and taking goods to CRUK's charity shops, funds are also raised by leaving gifts in Wills – this could be a percentage of an estate, a specific amount or even items such as jewellery, paintings or books. Ros and Andy showed us a board with a range of different things that had been bequeathed and then auctioned specifically for CRUK. We then had to guess how much the individual items had raised. From a pair of Chinese vases to a collection of old model railway sets. And having just had a look around the CRUK website I was interested to see that back in 2009 a 'Handbag' auction was held which included bags donated by members of the public together with a number of bags donated by celebrities. What a brilliant and fun way to raise money! And Ros and Andy [the glamorous one] certainly showed us just how crucial CRUK's work is.

Did you know that we have a North Tawton W.I. Synchronised Swimming Team? Actually, we didn't know until we had our Awaie Day at The Waie Inn. There we were – splashing around in the pool, and suddenly the opportunity presented itself to record the moment for posterity. So I did. I have photographic evidence and I'm prepared to use it. Apart from forming beautiful patterns in the water we ate, drank, skittled and yoga'd. And you may think that we all went home and had an early night but you'd be wrong. Some of us dashed off to John Lewis for the pre-Christmas W.I. Lock-in. Was I prepared to spend, spend, spend? Yes, yes, yes. You want to know what I bought don't you? Towels. Thick, fluffy, green towels. I just couldn't help myself. Others probably bought perfume, a posh frock or two but I bought towels. I call that very restrained. Happy Christmas.



News from the Castle

Hi everyone,

It has been a real mixed bag for the last month of our main season. The low has been the recurring high winds which have arrived like clockwork every Friday in October. Drogo is on such an exposed site with lots of lovely trees that we need to be extremely careful about access on these high winds days. It also has an impact on the building work on the final sections too – frustrating for everyone.

The high over the past month has to be the amazing Takeover Day which took place with children from Okehampton Primary School. The children spent four weeks learning about the stories of Castle Drogo and what makes a great day out before sending the adults out of the way and welcoming lots of visitors to the Castle on Thursday 17th October. The children were just brilliant, and you may have seen them on BBC Spotlight. The Thursday volunteer team did an amazing job of encouraging the children to be brave and chat with people. The feedback from everyone has been wonderful so we plan to make this an annual event. It was just joyous.

News from the estate is that fencing is nearly completed in Rectory/Drewston woods near Drewsteignton - you may have seen the fenceline and new gates going in. Once we are happy the entire wood is properly fenced and water is not an issue we will be in a position to put some ponies into the wood. Once the ponies are in, please help us by encouraging people to keep their dogs under close control. I'm sure that nobody wants panicked ponies! We are always grateful for anyone who wants to keep an eye on them and let us know if they spot any issues.

We are also starting to put plans in place to thin the large Beech trees along the castle drive. These trees are very large and very close together and, being beech, are suffering from lots of damage by grey squirrels. We want to thin them to increase light levels to enable us to underplant with young trees, whilst allowing the remaining large trees room to spread. We are currently planning this work for winter 2020-2021. It won't be easy as the areas are small and the trees are large and we won't be shutting the castle when we do it. We hope that as much as possible of the good timber can go for high quality, long lived uses such as furniture.





Notes from SCPC Nov 2019 - AUTUMN OPEN MEETING.

- 1. Chair Cllr. Michele Wilson welcomed Cllrs. Lois Samuel and Barry Ratcliffe from WDBC, Cllr. James McInness DCC, Dave Sexton –WDBC. Tony Watkins &Mark Trafford from Airband and 17 members of the public to our Autumn Open Meeting.

 2. Cllr. Wilson and other councillors went on to un-date those present with progress against the Parish Priorities identified.
- 2. Cllr. Wilson and other councillors went on to up-date those present with progress against the Parish Priorities identified from the Parish Survey earlier this year.
- a) Improved Internet Communication Airband has surveyed several properties in the parish, and because of the up-take have offered free Broadband Connection at the Village Hall.
- b) Road Safety Plan Cllr. Wilson has put together a Road Safety Plan and will be speaking at the Highways Traffic Audit Committee on 5th November.
- c) Improved Parish Communications SCPC are still keen for parishioners to sign up with their email address on the Parish Website to get early notification of parish events direct to their inbox. There is also the parish Facebook page which can alert parishioners to road closures, bad weather etc. or help find lost ferrets.
- d) Defibrillator Campaign Cllr. Lois Samuel announced that she had approved our application for £500 from the Locality Fund which now gives us enough funds, with other fund raising during the year, to go ahead with arranging to lease a defibrillator for 4 years.
- e) Improved Toilet Facilities this will need major fund raising or Grant funding to bring the public toilets up to DDA compliance.
- f) Increased Awareness of the Community Transport Scheme SCPC organised one outing to Tiverton Canal for a ride on the horse drawn barge in the summer, via Okehampton Community Transport. If anyone has any suggestions for future parish outings, please let us know.
- 3. Cllr. Lois Samuel outlined the forthcoming changes to the Recycling Scheme. Look out for more details through your letter boxes, and on the Noticeboards and Facebook and Website.
- 4. Dave Sexton gave a useful talk on Grants available to make your homes more fuel efficient. Again look out for more details on the Noticeboards, Facebook and Website pages.
- 5.
