

From The Rectory

"And the award goes to..."

As you may have noticed, it is awards season. The Golden to agriculture," or to some other good cause or sector of Globes were in early January, and in February it's the BAFTA's, then the Oscars, and then the BRIT Awards. One or other of these celebrity shindigs might possibly grab your attention momentarily in the coming weeks, especially at this wet and cold time of year when there are less local events to propel us off the sofa and out for the evening. Most years, I will partially tune in to award season, not least because it's useful for pub quizzes... "Which film won best picture at the Oscars in 1996?" Braveheart - I know that one; although I'm struggling to remember any since The King's Speech about 10 years ago. Sometimes you also get a half decent performance at the BRIT Awards too in-between the screaming fans, the shout-outs and the make-some-noises. But awards ceremonies are tedious, don't you think? I never last more than half an hour or through one cycle of advert breaks. And these days, they tend to be hamstrung by diversity issues as well, making them even more tiresome. It would be better to use the time to actually watch the film or listen to the album.

But have you noticed the growing trend in recent years of snazzy award ceremonies for ordinary people too ...? people who have made some considerable unsung difference in their community in some way. The biggest is the Pride of Britain Awards for people who have "made the world a better place". Then there is the Unsung Hero Award for "non-medical NHS staff and volunteers", and the BBC Sports Unsung Hero Award for a "sportsperson who has made a substantive yet unrecognised contribution to sport." The ceremonies are often now on telly, and are covered ever more widely in the press year on year. They make a nice contrast to the star-studded, over-hyped and over-long celebrity ceremonies where the dresses, the speeches and the red carpet have just got too ridiculous. It is really great to see "Mandy from Middlesbrough" who has taught 5000 children to swim over 50 years of service, collect her award from Carol Vorderman, and tell the country how proud she is of all the children who have learnt to swim under her tuition. We love our heroes these days, and we crown lots of them. But maybe it is getting a bit OTT though.

I am all for national recognition where it is deserved. Indeed, some years I have skipped passed the celebrities and looked well down the New Year's Honours list, to the names that no one has ever heard of. There it says next to a name "services to healthcare charities" or "services

work. I've googled the person's name and found a truly inspiring tale of selfless service conducted over many years far away from the limelight. I can think of few people around here who deserve the red carpet or the letters after their name. But they probably won't get either, and some wouldn't want public recognition anyway, because the private satisfaction of the task itself is praise enough.

That is perhaps the only draw-back of our modern obsession with crowning heroes. We under-value the attitude we should all seek to nurture in ourselves and in our children, of just quietly knuckling down and getting on with it, despite the cost and despite the lack of recognition. I guess we could call it "gracious grit" – the attitude that scrubs and serves, grafts and grinds, and persists in doing so when no one is watching. That is how businesses prosper, institutions make a difference, and families thrive. God knows, though. He sees, and one day he promises that all that is concealed will be revealed.

I'm reminded of a prayer that I think I first prayed at school in South Devon when I was 8 years old. It is attributed to Saint Ignatius of Loyola of whom I knew nothing until looking at his Wikipedia page a moment ago. Fascinating chap! You probably know the prayer...

Teach us, good Lord, to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labour and not to ask for any reward, save that of knowing that we do your will. Amen.

Amen indeed! That's the attitude of gracious grit worth praying for and developing in the year ahead. It just might get you an award one day, or letters after your name; but in all likelihood, neither. However it will get you the satisfaction of knowing that you've made a true difference somewhere or to someone. For as another great Oscar winning film testifies... "what we do in life echoes in eternity". Name the film, the actor, and the year!?





North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

And relax. That 'normal service has been temporarily suspended because it's Christmas' bubble has been carefully deflated and packed away along with the tinsel and fairy lights until at least August. So I'm now trying to concoct a tasty recipe from half a bottle of apricot brandy (spur of the moment purchase) a packet of brussels sprouts flavoured crisps (husbands' idea) and some left over Stilton. Stand aside Delia.

Is it just me or does anyone else decide that Christmas is a good time to make completely irrational purchases of food and drink which will still be hovering around come the middle of January, forcing you to look straight faced at husband and say 'oh yes – that's a vital ingredient for my (insert name of exotic Greek/Russian/Mexican recipe here – he'll think you're a domestic goddess)'.

Graham Hurley's writing career started aged 14 when he wafted downstairs wearing his father's green silk dressing gown and announced to his parents that he wanted to be a novelist and he was going to start on Monday. Armed with paper, a typewriter, and carbon paper he sat in his bedroom on the given day and waited for something to happen...... but it didn't. A few years later after boarding school and university, where he gained an English degree, it was back home to Clacton-on-Sea with no job and no money. His parents encouraged him to find employment by circling a variety of job adverts in the local paper - eventually this worked and he became a 'promotion script-writer' with Southern Television. Sounds glamorous? Not according to Graham. He was writing the script for that 'bit' between programmes where the announcer says 'well that was Hughie Green with Opportunity Knocks and now it's time for Coronation Street'. But this paved the way to jobs as a researcher, then a director and Graham spent the next 20 years involved in making interesting and exciting documentaries for ITV. However, he still wanted to write. Graham then had the idea for 'Rules of Engagement' which led to an ITV commission and, at last, a two-book contract with Pan Macmillan. Two more international thrillers followed. A loss of contract between ITV and Southern Television meant that Graham was out of work, but this presented the chance to take a leap and become a full-time novelist. A leap that has proved to be very successful (26 novels to date) but only because of Graham's hard work and dedication to research whilst writing his books. Graham's love of reading has been life long and his success as a novelist is evident, but interestingly one of the most important things to get right, he told us, is the book cover. So should you judge a book by it's cover? This novelist's answer to that is an emphatic 'yes'.

Feedback from our coach trip to Wells earlier in December was pretty positive –comments such as 'lovely food in the Cathedral's Refectory', 'beautiful festive decorations in the Bishop's Palace', 'interesting independent shops' and 'did you realise we were on a Chinese coach with a Cummins engine?' (and apparently that's a good 'un) No, dear husband – how could I have missed this? Why hadn't I known that back in 1919 Clessie Lyle Cummins founded a company that would produce the world's finest engines? Every day is a school day.



Friends of North Tawton Surgery

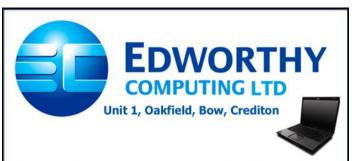

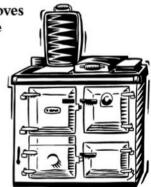

Notes from SCPC Jan 7th Meeting

- 1. Cllr. Wilson welcomed everyone and wished them a Happy New Year, and expressed the council's thanks to the Bell ringers and everyone else who contributed to the Annual Ringing out of the Old Year and ringing in the New and singing around the brazier in the square. A certificate of Thanks and Recognition can be found on the Website and Facebook page.
- 2. A member of the public highlighted that WDBC had failed to publish a Planning Application over the Christmas period, thus shortening the time available to view and make comments. She had notified the Chair who, on contacting WDBC Planning Dept, managed to get the consultation period extended. Thus there was only 1 Planning Application considered at this meeting which was unanimously SUPPORTED.
- 3. Cllr. Wilson reported that sufficient funds have been raised to lease a Defibrillator for a four year period. It is recommended that the Unit be situated in the square and once a suitable electricity source is established, the unit can be in place six weeks after an order is placed.
- 4. Cllr. Wilson and the Clerk have had a meeting with representatives from Devon Highways as part of their new "Doing What Matters" Scheme. DCC took on board all the information councillors and parishioners had collated regarding the state of the roads around the parish and the continued concern about excessive speed at various spots.
- 5. Christmas Cheer raised a profit of £282 to go towards the VE celebrations in May. It has been suggested that this will become an annual event and hopes that families will come and visit Santa's Grotto and join in the festive cheer.
- 6. To raise further funds for VE Day Cllr. Wilson is organising a Murder Mystery on Fri 21st February at the Village Hall. Tickets will cost £7.50 and are limited, so book yours now by ringing 01837 82285.
- 7. After several months of deliberation and debate SCPC set the Precept for the coming year at £9,996, an increase of 34p per week per household.
- 8. Cllr. Wilson has submitted an application for Pocket Park funds to enhance the facilities on the Village Green additional seating, adult gym equipment and re-establishing the Wild Flower Meadow are just some of the ideas.
- 9. Cllr. Joy Tucker is working towards a parish Climate Emergency policy and as such has invited Mike Davies and WDBC Mayor Tony Leech to attend our next Open Meeting on 31st March to talk about how WD are tackling this subject.

One of the suggestions for Sampford Courtenay for next year – was a mass collection of Christmas Trees – with just one trip to the Recycling centre!

The History of Twinning



Town Twinning started as an official relation-ship builder in Europe after the second world war. The idea was simple: repair damaged relationships between France, Germany and the UK. Find towns which had suffered during the wars and pair them. Then encourage people from these areas to meet, mix and get along.

There are now thousands of towns and villages proudly declaring, as you enter their territory, with which partner communities they are twinned. In 1975 North Tawton was twinned with a lovely little town in Normandy (close to Honfleur and Caen) called Blangy-le-Chateau.

In the early years, North Tawton Twinning Association was a much larger group — exchange visits were arranged between the Primary Schools, the Fire Service and the Football Clubs. Members would travel by coach, via a ferry from Portsmouth to Caen, to spend wonderful weekends, staying with host families in their homes and experiencing a French life for real. Many from North Tawton experienced their first taste of snails and mussels or "Moules et frites". Many friendly tournaments of football, boules, and petanque were "fought" as on the fields of Agincourt. It was even known to have "Country Dancing" in the Town Hall, with bi-lingual calling of the dance steps.

Now, partly because of the necessary regulations around Child Protection, the school cannot make exchange visits unless accommodation is available en masse in a School Hall etc. and the rest of us are all 45 years older.

However, although older and a smaller group, we still enjoy bi-annual visits. Recently we have travelled by car, via Plymouth to Roscoff on overnight ferry, and a pleasant four hour drive through picturesque French countryside and historic towns and villages. Once we arrive we are greeted in the Town Hall by the Mayor and twinning committee, where we meet our hosts, then fed, wined and dined and transported to visit a variety of historic and scenic venues before returning home happy and exhausted.

In between time, the committee aim to raise funds to cover the expenses incurred when they visit us. (i.e. Transport, entry to National Trust Houses and meals out in local pubs etc.) and we are always looking for new suggestions on how to raise funds and encourage more people to join the Association.

If this has sparked an interest – why not come along to our AGM at the White Hart Inn on Wednesday, 19th February, at 7.30 p.m. and find out how you can get involved.

To all those 'youngsters' ex-pupils and previous twinners - it would be a chance to revisit / perhaps catch up with old friends!!!! A group from Blangy will be visiting North Tawton this May – please join us and meet some of our lovely French friends.

Bondleigh Rainfall

December 2019 has been a wet month with almost three weeks of continuous rain. The total amount is 173.3mm. After a generally dry year the wet Autumn months have made 2019 wetter than average at 1097mm..

I have been measuring the rainfall in Bondleigh since 1997 and have accumulated some quite interesting figures. The average annual rainfall now stands at 1001mm with 2012 being the wettest at 1380mm and 2003 the driest, at only 680mm.. The three Autumn months of 2019 amounted to 455mm..

However in 2012 it was 565mm and in 2000 it was 581mm. The wettest month was December 1999 with a total of 275mm.
