

Why Keep Lent?

The church's calendar is marked by short festivals that are celebrated with joy, yet Lent is a period -a 'season' - of the forty days before Easter which is very much in a minor key.

Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, February 26th, and ends on Thursday, April 9th and represents the 40 days Jesus spent fasting and praying in the wilderness.

Lent is never celebrated but only 'kept' and is not so much marked by what we do but what we don't do: it's the season of giving things up. Exactly what you give up and how seriously you treat Lent varies enormously between denominations. Some keep it with great solemnity whilst other churches are much less concerned with Lent. Indeed one of the many bizarre things in church history is that a major turning point occurred in the Reformation in 1522 when Huldrych Zwingli publicly defended sausage eating during Lent!

Even among Christians who 'keep' Lent, there is no agreement on how it is to be kept. Many people try to give up something: chocolate, Facebook, alcohol, television or, I suppose, sausages! Even some people outside Christianity take Lent seriously: there are many who, while having no religious beliefs, feel that it's good to give up something for forty days. For them Lent becomes a second opportunity to have a go at failed New Year resolutions, or a 'Spring detox'.

But what is Lent all about? One word widely used by those who observe Lent is 'preparation'. In fact, you could argue that Lent is about three preparations.

Firstly, Lent is a *preparation for Easter*. Easter, with its message of Christ destroying sin and death through his death and resurrection, is the most exciting and triumphant moment in the church's year. It's such a big event that it demands a lead-in to prevent us from stumbling upon it unawares, all too easy in a busy world. Lent provides us with forty days of build-up to Good Friday and Easter Sunday in which we can (and should) ponder prayerfully our need to be saved by God. Lent reminds us of the universal problem to which only Easter's message of the death and resurrection of Jesus can provide the answer.

Secondly, Lent is a *preparation for Existence*. We live in an age that knows little of restraint. We overeat, overdrink, overspend and generally overindulge. It is almost considered a right that if we want something, we should have it now. Restraint is very biblical. Paul writes, 'For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives' (Titus 2:11,12). Lent gives us the opportunity to practise resisting harmful and hurtful desires. Strange as it may seem, to fight and win a forty-day-long Lenten battle over chocolate or coffee (or sausages!) may help us win a war over more important matters of our thoughts and actions.

Finally, Lent is a *preparation for Eternity*. If taken seriously, these forty days can seem to be a long and often wearying season when we never get our own way. For a time, pleasures are sidelined and joys postponed. But Lent is limited, and the shadows of the season are destroyed by the joyful triumphant dawn of Easter Day.

There is a splendid and encouraging parallel with our lives here. For many of us, life seems to run in what we might call 'Lent mode': hopes are unfulfilled, desires are frustrated and joys fall short of expectations. Yet as Lent is not the end of the story, neither is everyday life for those who follow Jesus.

As the celebration of Easter overtakes the solemnity of Lent, so, one day, the joys of eternity will overtake the troubles of this life. For Christians, there is a wonderful and certain hope that however deep a shadow or sadness has fallen over our lives, it will ultimately be lifted and replaced by an indestructible and unending joy. For those who love Christ, life's long Lent will end one day in an eternal Easter, in which death and sin are destroyed forever.

There are many opportunities in all our churches to worship and be thankful to our Lord during the week leading up to Easter (see pages 5, 7, and 32). One of those services is **Compline** - held in St. Andrew's Church, Sampford Courtenay, on the evenings of Monday 6th, Tuesday 7th and Wednesday 8th April at 9 p.m.. The service lasts approximately twenty minutes.

Compline, or night prayer, is a Christian service of worship dating back to monastic life in the Middle Ages. Compline comes from the word 'completion'. In keeping with the earliest practices of the monastic communities, Compline invokes a sense of protection and peace for the night that is to come and thanks for safe passage through the day that has past. It is a short, gentle service of prayer and quiet reflection, giving the comforting feeling of God's love wrapped around us.

Lent helps us to learn to say 'no, not now'; it teaches us self-control and an expectation and an anticipation of what God may reveal to us. Lent isn't just a human exercise but a sacred discipline. Why not encounter our heavenly Father in a deeper way this Lent?



The Council has launched its new website, which can be found at northtawtontowncouncil.gov.uk. The website will always be a work in progress. We welcome ideas from our residents about things they would like to see on the site which would make life easier for them and others. North Tawton Cemetery

The Council's contractors work hard to keep the Cemetery maintained in a good condition. They need to access grassed-over grave plots to keep the grass cut neatly. Therefore, the Council has regulations about items that are left on graves. We try hard to be sensitive about this and leave items in place for a period of time. For the long term, the only flower receptacle allowed is one that is an integral part of a headstone and base. All other flower receptacles, plant pots, windmills, lights, and other items have to be removed from graves. We recently cleared some of these items, at the same time clearing old wreaths and dead plants and flowers. Items that people are likely to want to keep are stored carefully in our Chapel of Rest building within the Cemetery. If you are missing an item that you placed on a grave, please contact the Town Clerk who can arrange for you to view the items in the Chapel and reclaim your property, if it is there. We thank residents and visitors for their co-operation and understanding.

Cleaner/Caretaker required for NT public toilets

As from the end of May 2020, the Council needs to appoint a new cleaner/caretaker for the town's public toilets. The toilet building is situated in Market Street just where the little cutway runs through to North Street. There is a male and female WC and a storage cupboard for cleaning materials etc.. The job involves opening the toilets at about 8 a.m., closing at 5 p.m. (the closing time may well change to 6 p.m.) and cleaning the toilets each day. One hour per day is allocated for this and the rate of pay is £11.00 per hour. The council would be open to splitting the job between two individuals if applicants come forward who are able to make a mutually agreeable arrangement. This would make it easier to arrange cover during holiday or sick leave. This is a job which may well fit in with child care responsibilities and could be ideal for two friends to share. If you are interested in helping to keep this facility open for residents and visitors, if you can undertake this work to the consistent high standard users deserve, and if you can commit to being reliable, please contact the Town Clerk.

Lloyds Mobile Bank - Town Centre Car Park

As you may know, the Lloyds Mobile Bank is the only banking facility available to residents, apart from the banking functions offered by the Post Office. The Council reserves, or more accurately tries to reserve, a parking space in the main car park on Tuesdays so that the mobile bank can park safely and serve its customers. For those who use it, this is a crucially important facility, which our community is in danger of losing. Despite a new large notice explaining the arrangement and asking people to ensure the relevant space is left free, there have been several occasions recently where the mobile bank has not been able to park safely and has departed leaving customers very unhappy. Please can I ask everyone to leave the space clear on Tuesdays in future, thank you.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Storm Ciara is doing her level best to distract me whilst writing this piece but husband tells me that we still have a roof, tv aerial and rubbish bin lids so all is well.

Husband is feeling smug. He thinks that he is the only person to have stuck fast to his New Year Resolutions. I have reminded him that you need to be doing the actual thing that you resolve to give up but he says I'm being picky. So he's given up smoking – (he doesn't smoke), he's given up drinking spirits – (a strong brew of tea was his limit) and he's being careful not to waste money on 'unnecessary stuff that we don't really need' – (that has always been the case and unfortunately includes occasional flowers for his wife as he will remind me that I can do a heck of a lot more with a bag of spuds).

Resolutions feature on the agenda for the W.I. at this time of year too. These are put together by members, after a lot of careful research, and have to be approved by both Federation and National Headquarters before they can be formally proposed and voted for. National campaigns such as Keep Britain Tidy were developed from W.I. resolutions. The whole process takes a full year and once all the votes have been counted, the resolution with the most support is taken to National's A.G.M. and voted on again before being adopted. Just to make things more interesting, North Tawton W.I. Committee members present each of the potential resolutions at our February meeting, with an opportunity for questions and discussion. After the very welcome cuppa and plain biscuit (my laptop seems to have written 'plain' when my fingers were supposed to write 'lovingly dunked in chocolate') our members vote individually for their most important resolution. The results are sent to Devon Federation and so the process goes on.

There are five resolutions on the shortlist this year: A Call to Increase Potential Stem Cell Donor Registration, Protect our Precious Helium, Time to Talk About Death and Dying, End Modern Slavery and Female Crash Test Dummies. There was a diverse and interesting selection with well researched arguments and statistics to support each of them, but it was End Modern Slavery that received the most votes from our members.

Time for a bit of light entertainment in the form of Bill Murray. Bill came to live in Devon in 1965 when his parents took over the Burton Hall Hotel in North Tawton and he's been singing songs about country life, most of them humorous, learnt from older generations of singers at get-togethers in village halls, fairs and inns - one of them being the White Hart, North Tawton. He is a founder member of the Dartmoor Folk Festival and plays many of the old dance tunes on his English concertina at pub sessions all over the moor. He also recites hilarious dialect stories and anecdotes from Devon and beyond that he has gathered over the years. We were treated to The Farmer's Alphabet, What About a Little Drop of Cider and The Knitting Song/Bondleigh Canal (priceless) mixed with some lovely stories and memories of times in North Tawton. It was a lovely gentle half hour and much enjoyed by a very appreciative audience.

And finally – lots to choose from on our Trips and Visits table including another chance to have two puddings (rude not to) at the Waie Inn in celebration of our 91st birthday. There also seems to be quite a bit of interest in our Burlesque class. Let's make this clear. Having looked up a definition of the word 'burlesque' I'm convinced that we'll be pretty good at it, in fact we're awash with natural talent, as historically it was used to refer to an array of entertainment that combined comedy, caricature, ridicule and distortion. So that tidies that up nicely. Stop sniggering.



Notes From Blueberry Hill Market Garden

Greetings everyone !

Preparations for the new growing season are coming along nicely this year thanks to the help of John and Jon, two splendid gardeners. Thanks to farmer, Phil, and Francis too, for all the post and tunnel help. We've all been working our way through the massive pile of horse manure purchased from farmers Viv and Jane, one of the fine investments we've made recently. Determined to adhere to a strict no-dig approach, the manure is being laid down in as many areas as it will cover. The garden compost will provide the rest of the mulch material. Sowing of vegetable seeds is well under way, and vegetable plants will be available to buy from the beginning of April. With the climate crisis on my mind for much of the time, I'm determined that we shall do our very best to play our part in mitigating the worst effects and helping to tackle it. I confess that until recently we

used bagged compost, mainly to fit with the cash-flow situation. No more. *(continued on page 23)*

We now buy organic compost from Devon in dumpy bags: no more plastic. Our organic poultry feed comes in paper sacks and we shall seek to buy our seed potato from suppliers who don't pack them in plastic netting. The no-dig system we employ means that there is no soil disturbance which can release CO2, among other benefits. We are also learning to develop a permaculture system so that the garden will, in time, become self-sustaining and highly productive.

Now here's something new for you.... We often need to buy in top-up supplies from other growers in Devon, in order to fulfil our weekly vegetable orders. Thinking about the climate crisis, we would like to ask all you local growers if you would be interested in selling us your surplus produce. We'll buy it from you at a set price for each type of produce category, and we will make the same amount per KG on it. Our criteria are that no synthetic fertilisers are used, and that no chemical pest control or herbicides are used either. Not only should this encourage more home growing, but we will be able to supply more people with locally grown produce so that we'll all be doing our bit. Any surplus that doesn't go into the weekly baskets can be sold from our shop. Please e-mail me at blueberryjacqui@hotmail.co.uk if you would like to get involved. What do Archaeology clubs do in the winter?




Some dig, of course; A.C.E. has done that in the past but, to be honest, digging mud in sideways hail palls after a while. We tried walks of archaeological interest but kept having to cancel them because of the weather. So this year we decided to stay indoors and get on with identifying and cataloguing finds. We started digging at Moistown near Winkleigh in 2013 and since then we have amassed over 3000 finds. These were mostly pottery but

also metal, environmental finds, bones, shells and the like; also plastic and other modern materials. When the find is excavated its co-ordinates are recorded and it is given a find number. That is recorded on the plastic bag in which we keep it. Once we start the postexcavation work the find number is written on the find itself, where possible. It is difficult when it is a bit of baler twine and that is why we keep the finds within the plastic bags at all times. All the information also goes on to a spreadsheet; some of this is done on site. In the winter session each find is identified, weighed, measured and dated and all the information is entered on the spreadsheet. We have been learning about pottery, of which we have the biggest number of finds. Eventually, when we have managed to raise some

funds, we will have an expert to look at the more interesting pieces, but, in the meantime, we are learning to separate the industrial pottery from the medieval and so on. We have our own inhouse expert on bones, looking at the environmental finds. We have a few bones but there is no need to get too excited as they are of animals. The oldest piece of pottery we have found, has been identified as Saxo-Norman, circa 1066. We have quite a bit of medieval pottery. Industrial pottery is plentiful and to some, not very interesting. Think of the blue and white ware that you dig up in your gardens. We intend to put some pieces together to rebuild the original plate or cup or... chamber pot. !!

So, if you don't think excavation is for you, perhaps doing this sort of post-excavation work might interest you? If so, do get in touch. Erica Williamson






