



From The Rectory

Corona-pestilence... strange days

What strange days we live in! I have been desperately trying to think of something else topical and interesting to write about this month, but I don't think I can avoid it... the big C... coronavirus. It's what everyone is thinking and talking about at the moment. So here goes...

Now, I write this on a quiet Friday afternoon in mid-March. And it really is quiet today. For once, it is neither raining nor windy, the birds are singing outside, it's just about warm enough to have the window open, and hardly a car has passed the Rectory in the last hour. A quick glance on the BBC website and it seems everyone is "working from home" today. Offices, train stations, airports and town centres are deserted, and the scene is repeated all across Europe and much of the world today. What strange days we live in! I don't think I've ever witnessed anything like this before. None of us have, probably.

The situation is changing rapidly, and everyday it seems there are new directives from government. So by the time this publication has reached your doorstep undoubtedly things will have changed again. Perhaps your friendly Roundabout deliverer could be the only person out and about by the end of March. Did they touch your letterbox? Were they wearing a hazmat suit? (And that reminds me, I really should clean this computer keypad... disgusting!) Strange days.... sporting fixtures off, close gatherings of 100 people or more discouraged. Will schools be closing early for Easter? And then there is the rumour-mill and the media circus. Are we making too big a deal of this, or should we be making more of a fuss? I realise in daring to write about this I might be contributing to either. You decide. Strange days.

May I offer a few Christian reflections on this current corona-crisis? The first is: we have been here before as a human race. This may be the greatest public health crisis in a generation, as Boris says, but actually plague and pestilence are nothing new. They have occurred numerous times in history, not least in Biblical history. It was relatively common in Roman times for some horrible disease to decimate the empire. Famously, the Black Death swept through Europe in the 14th century, and the Great Plague terrorised London in 1665, both of which were utterly ghastly at the time, but they didn't half liven up dull history lessons! It feels like any comparison between these deadly pestilences and the current crisis over Covid-19 is a little overblown, but perhaps not. As I write today on 13/03, the statistics are alarming... just under 150 thousand infected worldwide with just over 5 thousand deaths, 798 infected in the UK and 10 deaths... so far. Personally speaking, as a young(ish), fit(ish), healthy man I am not worried about getting coronavirus, nor am I worried for my family who are all younger and at least as healthy as me. But I can think of

plenty of people I know and love for whom it could be much more serious. So it may be nothing new historically, but it is unprecedented for you and me, so we really should abide by all the advice being thrown at us at the moment.

This leads to a second Christian perspective on the matter in hand (very clean washed hand). Pestilence is no respecter of persons. I hear at least one Member of Parliament has coronavirus, the Canadian Prime Minister's wife has it, so does the actor Tom Hanks. It doesn't matter how rich or important you are, viruses are a great leveller. In this way, they are like the bush fires in Australia, or the floods in the Yorkshire and the Severn Valley. You can try your best to "be prepared" but one day we will all succumb. NEWS FLASH....! Just had the dreaded call from school. Sounds like my "quiet working from home" Friday is about to be interrupted. My youngest daughter is unwell. Back soon... Have we got enough toilet roll?

UPDATE.... I think we're going to be okay. Daughter is now parked on the sofa in front of CBeebies, with a hefty dollop of Calpol in her tummy. She hasn't even got a temperature, so maybe the Rectory lockdown I was contemplating on the run up to school will not now be necessary.

Back to the spiritual lessons of Covid-19.... Another one that strikes me is that it is proving not only to be a great leveller, it's also a great revealer. Hearts and minds are being exposed by coronavirus. When we feel that our health and our wealth are under attack the real you, the real me is exposed. For example, I cannot understand why anyone would panic buy toilet roll, or anything for that matter. It just seems so selfish and unnecessary. I'm really not very worried about contracting the virus myself, but I'm gutted that sport is being cancelled everywhere and that our savings as a family are being severely affected by the markets. What does that say about me? And what is the crisis revealing about you? When the two great securities of health and wealth come under threat our idols are exposed. In that one sense then, perhaps coronavirus is going to be good for us. Maybe we are being taught an ancient and much needed lesson, as Moses prayed in Psalm 90, "teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." Daughter now asleep. All is well.



There will be no service at St. Mary's Honeychurch on the first Sunday in April, but there will be a service on Easter Sunday (April 12th) at 3.00 p.m..





Salt Bins

The Council has worked with Wain Homes to arrange installation of 2 new salt bins on the Batheway Fields development. The Council has purchased the bins and we are grateful to Wain Homes for providing a site and putting down paving slabs for the bins to stand on. Please could we remind residents that these bins are not to be used for refuse or dog fouling as has been the case on several occasions – remember that dog fouling bags can go in ordinary public litter bins, so there will always be a bin nearby. We all hope that we will not have any more weather bad enough to need the salt but when it is needed then it must be accessible and not contaminated with waste materials. Thank you for your co-operation.

North Tawton Neighbourhood Plan - Referendum - May 7th

The Neighbourhood Plan has now successfully completed the Examination Stage and can proceed to Referendum which is very good news.

The Referendum is organized by West Devon Borough Council elections unit. All residents on the electoral roll will be eligible to vote and If more than 50% of those voting in the referendum vote 'yes', then the Neighbourhood Plan becomes part of the statutory development plan for the North Tawton area.

The Neighbourhood Plan and all the appendices, including the Town Design Statement, can be found on the North Tawton Town Council website. Hard copies will be available for reference in the Council Office and other venues around the town including pubs, café, takeaways, shops, Doctor & Dentist surgeries, Community Centre & Mortimer Room.

This is a very important milestone for North Tawton and we would encourage residents to read the Plan and decide how you want to vote.

Thanks to everyone who has been involved with the development of the Neighbourhood Plan over the past few years. It has been at times a long uphill struggle but it's thanks to you all that we have got to this very important stage.

Watch out for further information – but don't forget to vote on 7th May.

Coronavirus

At the time of writing, the Council Office is open to the public and the Town Council plans to hold its next Full Council meeting on 7th April. However, now that the Government has announced that the initiatives to combat the virus have moved from the "Containment Phase" to the "Delay Phase" the Council will review public facing services and public access to meetings in the light of developing guidance from central government.

Any details of changes to Council services and public meetings will be placed on the Noticeboard outside the office and published on our new website – northtawtontowncouncil.gov.uk

2020/2021 Budget.

At its meeting on 3rd December 2019, North Tawton Town Council set an expenditure budget of £123,459.45 – an increase of 2.46% from 2019/20. In seeking to minimise expenditure, the Council agreed to reductions in Administrative costs and limited increases to inflationary measures only.

Set against this, the Council faces a significant loss of income for 2020/21 as West Devon Borough Council decided to cease payment of the Council Tax Support Grant of £3562.00 and has indicated that it will charge the Town Council business rates for the car park, likely to be about £1812 for 2020/21.

In order to mitigate against the net loss of £5,374 and accommodate inflationary increases, as well as maintaining current levels of service, the Town Council voted to increase the Town Council Precept from £111,682 in 2019/20 to £122,189 for 2020/21 - an increase of 9%. West Devon Borough Council predict that as a result, householders who occupy Band D properties in North Tawton for example, will see an annual increase in the parish share section of the Community Charge bill of £14.93p for 2020/21. Bands A-C will obviously pay less than this.

In sharing comparable costs of other Parish Councils across West Devon, the Borough Council has calculated that on average, precepts have risen by 13%, with one parish requesting a 92% increase.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

We have an upstairs window that looks due west and occasionally you will hear husband mutter 'tis looking black over Bill's mother'. I do not know who Bill is. Let alone his mother. Apparently Ray Moore used this phrase to describe bad weather approaching. Husband tells me that Ray was a Radio 2 disc jockey back in the 80's [does anyone say 'disc jockey' anymore apart from husband?] but my ears were tuned in to Radio 1 back then listening to the likes of Gary Davies, Peter Powell and the occasional burst of Tommy Vance [remember him?] I feel very sorry for Bill's mother – she must have dreaded the weather forecast.







North Tawton dad's special reason for taking on second London Marathon



A bereaved dad from North Tawton is re-lacing his running shoes to take on the Virgin Money London Marathon for a second time in aid of the charity that help him when his son died. Luke Compton, said his 'world fell apart' the day 18-month-old Kaleb passed away in June 2015, and that running has been his way of dealing with grief. Since 2015, Luke has completed more than 50 half marathons all over the country and ran his first London Marathon in 2017, raising more than £7,000 for Children's Hospice South West (CHSW).

On Sunday, April 26, he will be proudly taking on the famous road race again for the charity.

"I always said if I was to do a marathon, it would be London and it would be for Children's Hospice South West," said Luke, 30.

"In 2017 I had that chance to run it for CHSW and completed it in 3hrs 48mins. I also said 'never again' but fast-forward a few years and here I am again, deep into marathon training. Running is my 'way out'; it's my way of having my time to think about Kaleb and what I could do to help CHSW".

"I remember seeing a quote a few years ago and every time I read it, it reminds me of Kaleb, the London Marathon and CHSW – 'thousands of miles separate us, 26.2 unite us'."

After Kaleb died, Luke spent some time with him before his funeral at the charity's Little Bridge House children's hospice, near Barnstaple. Luke said he remembers the fear, heartache and pure devastation he felt driving from North Tawton to the hospice the day Kaleb died.

"My world had just fallen apart but the time we spent together at the hospice is something I will forever thank CHSW for – warm, happy and life-lasting memories, moments I will never forget. The children's hospice was and remains the most incredible charity and I promised from that day on I would do anything possible to help and raise awareness to thank them for everything they did for Kaleb and continue to do for me."

Luke and his family have supported CHSW ever since, forming the Kaleb's Thumbprint Friend's Group to help raise money and awareness. The hairdresser hopes to raise £10,000 by taking on the London marathon again but said raising awareness was as important to him as raising the money.

He said: "I won't be running London 2020 in memory of Kaleb, but for everybody contacted to CHSW - the children who use the hospice for respite and support; those who have used it for end-of-life care; and sadly for all the children who have no idea that it is there for them in the future".

(As we go to press we understand the London Marathon will be postponed until later in the year. We hope Luke's sponsors will be patient and keep their support for him for this worthy cause. Editors.)




