

### From The Rectory

#### Hindsight, foresight and faith-sight

Hindsight is a wonderful thing but foresight is better, so said William Blake. Just think how different things could have been were we able to wind back the clock and change a few key decisions.

Hindsight suggests an earlier lockdown would have helped, and then some big events with crowds in early March would not have happened. Offices and public transport could have emptied earlier limiting the spread. Care homes could have been better protected from the start, and numbers of single items bought at the supermarket should have been limited immediately. Hindsight is a wonderful thing.

Hindsight also suggests that some measures the nation has undertaken since March were misdirected. The track and trace app piloted on the Isle of Wight was a waste of time and resources. The Nightingale Hospitals may prove useful yet, but back in April, even at the height of the virus, they were not needed. I'll venture a more risky suggestion as I look back with my hindsight specs on... I think Year 6 SATS, GCSE and A Level exams, and degree finals should all have happened. Maybe later in the term, with distancing and bubbles, a way should have been found for these vital educational milestones to be done properly. I think hindsight suggests that it would have been worth the risk for the sake of grades that can be trusted, hard work properly rewarded, and futures secured.

Of course, using hindsight in this manner can be unhelpful and even unkind towards those in authority who had to make impossible decisions with limited facts. But difficult decisions come with authority, and if Covid and it's effects are going to rumble on into 2021, as looks likely, then maybe a little painful hindsighting of previous decisions is necessary so that we respond better in the future, personally and nationally. For example, surely anyone who panic-bought anything back in March should listen better to their conscience next time. For what it's worth, I think the Church of England should do a little hindsighting too. Many clergy, congregation members, and ordinary members of the public felt very aggrieved that churches were forced to lock their doors in March for the first time in British history. Yes - many churches responded well by going online for worship and on-street to help those in need. However, with parish churches locked, it felt as though the church had turned its back on the nation in its hour of need. As much as I can speak on behalf of the institution, I apologize for that. We need to do better next time.

For this article, I asked a few people in our community to do little hindsighting, and let me know what message they would send themselves in January 2020 were they able to. I got some interesting replies. They were a mixture of the practical, the amusing, the emotional, the moral and the theological. I limited them to one-sentence messages only.

In the practical/amusing group I received lots of orders for supplies for tasks that would suddenly find the time but not

the resources... "order fertilizer, compost, seed potatoes and vegetable seed." "Order paint." The paint one was mine, because throughout April and May the hall, landing, stairs, cloakroom and two bedrooms each got a facelift, but the variety of colours was a bit limited. I've decided polished pebble is the shade of 2020. "Stock up on toilet rolls" was another response. I won't tell you who sent in that one, but if they are reading, see above. "Stock up on hand sanitiser" was a common response. "Eat McDonalds everyday before it closes" was another. When the BBC did a similar exercise recently, the best ones were "teach my mother how to use Zoom," "get my roots done thoroughly," "enroll on a sourdough baking course," "don't do dry January," and "buy an ice cream van, get a liquor licence and stockpile a garage full of hair clippers."

The emotional... "Hug my loved ones as much as I can." "Appreciate the value of a hug." "Give friends and family a big hug." "Hug mum." Need I say more?

The emotional+... "Persuade your children and grandchildren to come and stay with us in Devon for 12 months. We can set them up with accommodation, offices, a school room, playing fields, fresh eggs and honey and a small market garden." From the BBC research... "Find a partner quick."

The emotional/moral.... "Do not take anything for granted, it could all be gone in a flash - everyday, everything and everyone is precious but nothing on this earth lasts forever." "Really appreciate what you have in every way." "Be aware, be alert, be prepared." "Never put off for tomorrow what you can do today."

The moral/theological... "Whatever happens in life, keep praying and love one another, keep faith, things work out." "Remember Romans 8:28."

That last one is a good place to rest. "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him," that Bible reference reads. It's not that God promises life will be easy for Christians; far from it. Indeed, He says the opposite will often be true. It's not that God doesn't work for the good of those that don't love him. There is common grace available for all in Creation. But the believer in Christ can rest assured that, whatever life throws at them, there is goodness to receive when we cling close to God in faith through thick and thin. Hindsight is a wonderful thing. Learning from the past is essential for life in the future. Foresight is better, but foresight mixed with faith-sight is best. And so as we press on into the autumn of this most trying of years, I hope we will embrace the foresight of faith as much as we pine for the embrace of loved ones.



### Various Works being undertaken around the Town

Over the next couple of months there are a variety of works being undertaken on behalf of the Council:

**Churchyard** – the Council's Tree Surgeon will be pruning the avenue of lime trees from the Lych Gate to the Church, once we get confirmation of approval from West Devon Borough Council. This is necessary as the trees are in a conservation area. Our contractor responsible for general maintenance in the churchyard will be tackling the moss along this path and on the area of cobbles outside the church door.

Cemetery – there are a number of graves where the mounds were not flattened when headstones were erected, our contractor will undertake this work later in the year, making it easier to keep the grass cut. There will also be a general programme of tidying up. It may be necessary to remove decorative items which have been left on graves – again this is to make it easier for grass cutting and to conform with the cemetery regulations. Items removed will be stored safely in the Chapel of Rest and can be reclaimed by contacting the Town Clerk. The Chapel of Rest needs external redecoration, this will be done next Spring. There may also be works to the area of land which will form an extension to the cemetery in due course.

**Memorial Park** – all play equipment and installations in the park are inspected annually by RoSPA. There were several recommendations for improvement, including to the gates to the toddler play area. These gates have been removed temporarily as a precaution, and will be reinstated with appropriate safety closing mechanisms in the near future. A number of minor repairs will also be undertaken by the Council's contractors, to comply with the recommendations of the RoSPA report.

**Trees for which the Council is responsible –** in addition to the lime trees already mentioned, there are a number of other works, to trees at various locations, identified in the most recent tree survey report and these works will be undertaken during the Autumn if possible.

**Wildflower Planting –** Whilst the ongoing Climate Questionnaires are yet to be analysed, we are aware that many responses identify wildflower planting as something that residents wish to see more of. There are a number of grass areas either owned by the Council or for which we are responsible, and some of these will be seeded and/or planted with wildflowers during the Autumn – so we can all look forward to seeing the results next Spring and Summer.

#### **Green Homes Grant Scheme**

Last month we published information about this scheme, and more details have now been released by the Government. Eligible homeowners can get vouchers to help pay for environmentally friendly improvements, although as expected, it's more complex than it originally appeared. To qualify for financial support, you'll need to be installing at least one of the following "primary" improvements:

Insulation, including solid wall, cavity wall, underfloor, loft or roof insulation.

Low carbon heating, such as air-source or ground-source heat pumps, or solar thermal systems, which provide renewable ways of heating your home.

Then if, and only if, you're installing at least one of the improvements above, you'll also be able to use the vouchers to install the following "secondary" measures:

Draught-proofing

Double or triple glazing, or secondary glazing, but only if you currently have single glazing – it won't cover replacement double glazing.

Energy efficient doors, where you're replacing doors installed before 2002.

Heating controls and insulation, including appliance thermostats, hot water tank thermostats, hot water tank insulation, smart heating controls, zone controls, delayed-start thermostats and thermostatic radiator valves.

Please go to our website where we have linked to a more comprehensive explanation on the Money Saving Expert website. There is likely to be much more publicity about this scheme over the coming weeks – we will try and keep you informed, we want residents who might be eligible to benefit as much as possible.

Dear members of the local community

Our Village Hall was a school until the early 1950s. When the school closed, the building was purchased for the residents of Sampford Courtenay by a group of local people. The Village Hall Committee, as trustees, ensures that the hall continues to act as a community centre in the spirit in which it was established all those years ago.

The new Village Hall kitchen, meeting room extension and foyer, offering disabled access and amenities, have been a great success. This means that the hall has been able to offer enhanced facilities to existing events and hirers, as well as attracting more activities. These include yoga, dance classes, table tennis, quizzes, musical events, as well as wedding parties and children's parties, to name a few.

The committee now faces the significant challenge of replacing the roof and the large window adjacent to the new entrance, both of which are in very poor condition. The slates will need to be removed from the roof; the best of them will be reused. There is currently no insulation in the main roof; this will be brought into line with modern standards. The chimney stack needs attention to make it weather-proof. The large window will need to be custom built. There is a lot of work involved with these repairs and quotes have been sought. Based on these quotes, the cost of undertaking the work will be in the region of £150,000. Patch repairs have been undertaken to try to keep the building watertight but we are now at a point where urgent action is needed.

We are writing to parishioners for help. The Village Hall Committee is investigating what grants and other funding may be available, but it is clear that a great deal of additional fundraising will need to take place. We would like to ask you for your views and ideas on how we can achieve this target and save our valuable parish resource. There are many ways that you can help. For example, it could be fundraising ideas, offers to organise activities or events, knowledge of other individuals or organisations that could help or making a donation yourselves.

The Village Hall is an important resource for everyone in Sampford Courtenay. We need your help to keep it open and in a condition to ensure its ongoing use. If you would like to help please contact me.

We have been made aware of cold-calling, potentially uninsured contractors claiming to be tree surgeons operating in the districts, targeting vulnerable (particularly elderly) residents and claiming to be fully qualified, fully insured tree surgeons, offering to do tree and garden works for cash. They are stating they can carry out works to protected trees legally and provide residents with a certificate to submit to us to avoid prosecution. **No such certificate exists and this is not the case**. An application to SHDC/WDBC in some form is required prior to carrying out works to any trees subject to a TPO or in a Conservation Area.

If you hear of any residents being approached by such contractors, please encourage them to take as many contact details for the contractors as possible along with vehicle registration numbers and descriptions of the individuals (if safe to do so) and report them to the police on 101 or via their website at <a href="https://www.police.uk/101/">https://www.police.uk/101/</a>.

Please also observe the following important points:

- Prior to agreeing to any tree works, residents should check the contractor's insurance certificate and qualifications anyone who has gone through the training and paid the necessary insurance premiums will be proud to share the information with prospective clients. A checklist for choosing a tree surgeon is available here
- If the trees are protected by a TPO or in a Conservation Area, residents will need to be in receipt of written consent from the SHDC or WDBC Tree Officer in a decision notice or occasionally email prior to carrying out works to such trees to avoid potential investigation which may lead to prosecution. Resident's responsibilities in relation to 'Protected Trees' are outlined via the following links:

The main message of this email is about checking for insurance and qualifications and the need for planning permission where work on trees is proposed. We are circulating warnings via social media. As it is probable the target market of these contractors is a group less likely to use social media, it will be a help if everyone can be made aware of the problems which can arise.





## **Recreating The Past for Channel 4's New Offices**

Andrew Sinclair MRSS SWAc has recently completed a sculpture commission of two nine-foot female figures to adorn the façade of the Majestic building in Leeds city centre. As a nod to the building's past, and also to its future as the home of Channel 4's offices, the two figures of 'Music & Poetry' each represent the creative arts of music and literature.

Speaking on behalf of the commissioning firm, Rushbond, Real Estate Manager Mark Finch stated, "Since commencing works, we have been determined to deliver a sympathetic, comprehensive restoration programme which respects and pays homage to the Majestic's rich history. Andrew has done an amazing job, displaying true craftsmanship and bringing an exciting set of additions to the building."

Created in Andrew's workshop in the heart of Devon, the figures eventually made the 300-mile journey to their new home laid on the back of a flat-bed lorry, before being winched into place via crane. The whole project from concept to delivery to installation was seamless. Andrew commented, "This was an interesting and significant brief for us, and we're delighted with the result. The Majestic is one of the most exciting projects happening in Leeds at the minute, so it was a real privilege to be involved."

As part of this landmark building, Music & Poetry will stand as a symbol of Leeds' passionate support of culture and the arts, overlooking City Square for many years to come, and stitching together the city's past and future.

Report on SCEnSus meeting, 11 August 2020

The third meeting of SCEnSus, Sampford Courtenay's environmental and sustainable living group, was most productive in terms of moving forward the various initiatives and areas of focus identified by group members, in consultation with others.

Reflecting on statistics available from WDBC, concern was raised regarding the fact that currently 28 per cent of the contents of black sacks is food waste. As food waste can be composted, it seems such a shame that so much is being disposed of as general waste, which is sent for incineration. Trials are being undertaken locally whereby general waste collections are reduced from once a fortnight to once every three weeks in the hope that people will be encouraged to recycle more. 

#### Twiddly Bits for Charity

Last year, film maker Geoff Hodgkinson from Exbourne and his colleagues from the Tiverton Camcorder Club were commissioned by the Bondleigh Barn Band to capture the story of how the band has grown over the previous seven years from 6 players to over 50. ### What to expect at Okehampton Library:

#### **Customer Numbers**

There will be a limit on the number of customers at any one time and therefore safe queuing will be in place to enter the library.

### **Face coverings**

Customers must wear face coverings unless a customer is exempt, this is to ensure that we keep each other safe.

### Hand sanitiser and cleaning

A hand sanitiser station is in position to enable customers to sanitise when entering the library. Cleaning will be in place for services such as the public computers and self-service kiosks and regular cleaning of other areas is in place.

### **Test & Trace**

Customers can voluntarily provide us with their name and telephone number to support NHS Test and Trace.

### Social distancing

We have changed the layout to ensure adequate space for customers to move around in safety in a one way system and the floor space has been marked up to support social distancing and it is requested that 2m social distancing is observed by all staff and customers.

### **Quarantining returned books**

All books and items returned to the library will undergo 72 hours quarantine before they are removed from customer accounts. Customers will be asked to place returned items into a box near the library entrance to keep them separate for quarantining. The maximum number of book loans has been increased to 24, this is a temporary measure and it will be reviewed in December 2020.

### Browsing books - quarantining

We recognise that our customers enjoy browsing and that glancing through a book before is often an integral part of the experience. In the event a customer changes their mind, a 'browsing box' has been put in place, where customers can safely leave a book or item they have handled and no longer wish to borrow.

#### **Booking computers**

Computer access sessions are limited to 1 hour and are bookable by phone, email or in person. Computers are situated to allow for 2 metres social distancing and are cleaned between every use. The number of computers available has been reduced because of this safety measure.

### Computer support

New links are available on the public computer desktops for help with computers and IT queries. Staff will not be able to give assistance with the computers at this time.

### Children's libraries

We invite families to use the library, a range of children's fiction stock is available in the main library. Staff will be able to bring you any other items that you require from the children's library, including picture books and we do have a range of picture book bags available with activity sheets. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult in the library.

Staff would encourage parents and carers to speak with their children before they visit the library, about social distancing and also to let them know that whilst the library experience will feel different their library still loves them and wants them to enjoy reading and learning!

### **Choose & Collect**

There will also be a Choose and Collect service for those that do not wish to browse or are unable to enter the library. To book a space call or email in advance to book this contactless service.

#### **Events**

We very much look forward to the day when we can restart our events and activities. Please visit Okehampton Library social media and website for details of the amazing online programme that is available over the next few months.

### **ACE Archaeology Club**

From 1869 onwards, until the arrival of North Sea Gas, anyone entering the town from the bottom end could not have missed the familiar gasometer, which rose and fell according to the amount of gas which was being stored. The late Walter Mortimer tells us that the gasworks were erected in 1869 at a cost of £750 and was run by a private company. We know that Mrs. Merchant's father, Mr. Densham, was the manager during World War I. In his memoirs, the late Walter Martin states, "I used to look in at the local gasworks, just opposite the Woollen Factory, and watch old Bob Skinner replenish the gas retorts with coal from which the gas was extracted. The town was lit by gas at that time besides being used for domestic purposes and interior light." Mrs. Merchant remembers that when there was a coal shortage, her father had to make gas by combining sawdust with some sort of tarry substance.


