To sing or not to sing

A few months ago I remarked in Roundabout about how quiet it was in our community. It was just before lockdown. As people were beginning to stay at home, most noticeably the traffic was falling light. You could hear the birds singing. It some ways it was blissful.

That quiet has morphed in recent weeks. It is great to hear children outside playing at school break time once again. The roads are busy, and shops, pubs and businesses are filled with the chatter of people going about their business, albeit rather muffled behind face-masks in many locations. But places that usually throng to the sound of large gatherings remain quiet: sports stadiums, theatres, halls and churches.

Unlike sporting arenas, which remain empty except for players, coaching staff and fake crowd noise, our church buildings have had plenty of people back in them since July (socially distanced of course) but our gatherings have been much quieter than normal because we are not yet permitted to sing. This has been really hard, because singing is integral to Christian gatherings, and we love it.

The news today, as I write, is full of speculation about how the new "Rule of Six" will affect family gatherings and social events this autumn. Even the prospect of large Christmas celebrations has been called into question. So it could be a very quiet end to the year. Happily, church gatherings are exempt from the Rule of Six, because they are not social gatherings, and we have all the necessary Covid-safe measure in place. Choirs and worship bands are now permitted to sing and play again, and so where we have these in our churches (Sampford Courtenay and North Tawton) we are beginning to get back to normal. But still, for the time-being, congregations should not sing. Having said that, though, since the requirement for worshippers to wear face-masks in church, the nonsinging has been getting a little noisier each week when music is played! Seriously, one hopes the silence may be broken soon, because if we are permitted say a muffled Lord's Prayer together behind a mask, why can't we sing quietly too?

If you are not a church goer, or have not been to church recently, it is hard to explain how not singing feels to Christians when worship music is being played. It is a bit like being an Exeter Chiefs fan (other less good rugby teams are available) watching a match at Sandy Park, and Rev'd Nick Weldon (Vicar) being told you cannot cheer when points are scored and the game is won (as it nearly always is with the Chiefs). In

a similar way, Christians take great delight in who God is and what he has done for us, and one of the main reasons to gather on a Sunday is to declare that as a congregation in song. Saying it just doesn't quite hit the mark. His praises should be sung.

There is another Christian discipline, though, which is also important... fasting. Fasting is often a Lenten activity. Traditionally, it is a time of abstinence from food to concentrate on prayer and a fresh dependence on God. But fasting from other things has become fashionable in modern times... a social media fast, a news media fast, or a clothes shopping fast. Ultimately fasting is good for us, and so this imposed singing-fast might actually be doing some good for our congregations even if it is just the extra delight we will feel when we can break our fast sometime in the near future (we hope). What hymn or song should we break-fast with?

What other good might the singing-fast be achieving? Since our churches reopened for gathered worship in July we have still had lots of music in our services, but for listening to only. In Bondleigh and Honeychurch this has been on CD and MP3. In Sampford Courtenay we have had soloists sing and musicians play. So there has been plenty of worship, just quiet worship. In North Tawton we have used videos of Christians worshipping all over the world during lockdown. Seeing the faces of fellow believers praising and playing instruments in their lounges, kitchens and bedrooms has been surprisingly encouraging in these strange days. In fact, despite the quietness and restrictions, we have felt more connected to the worldwide church than normal.

Perhaps another benefit of the singing-fast could be the realisation that we live (normally) in a very noisy world, with a cacophony of sounds all competing for our attention. I find stillness and quietness hard. I have always loved the big noise of the sports stadium, the rock concert, and rousing congregational worship. It will be great when they are all back. But maybe modern life is too noisy too often, even in our churches. Perhaps God is calling for less noise in our ears. Maybe then our hearts might be better attuned to His still small voice within that can so easily be drowned out. Why not have a quiet think about that?

Complaints of Anti-Social Behaviour.

The Council has received a number of complaints from residents in Fore Street regarding unacceptable levels of noise from 11.30pm into the early hours of the morning. In addition to the noise which deprives residents of their sleep, bottles and glasses have been smashed and jagged fragments of glass left on the pavement and in the road which pose a potentially serious health hazard. Criminal damage to a motor vehicle parked in the vicinity has also been reported. This totally unacceptable behaviour has been reported to the Neighbourhood Police team and an incident log no 497-5/9/20 has been raised – please quote this number if further complaints arise. The Environmental Health Team at West Devon Borough Council has also been notified to ascertain what action it is able to take in relation to these complaints.

Community Emergency Plan - Covid-19

On New Year's Eve 2019, we all looked forward to what 2020 might bring. Never in our wildest dreams could we have imagined the events of the last few months were ahead of us. Our world changed. Staying indoors for 12-14 weeks was not easy, both physically and mentally. That's when some of us felt really old and "vulnerable", relying on others for help in one way or another.

I would like to say a big thank you to all those who helped, and are still helping, neighbours, friends and relatives through this crisis and also the businesses that kept serving the town in very difficult circumstances as well as those that started doing home deliveries, and diversified into selling basic items, baking etc. Thank you, too, to all who helped distribute the leaflets NTTC produced.

North Tawton Town Council is obliged to keep a copy of a Local Emergency Plan, now called Community Emergency Plan [CEP] which doesn't specifically mention pandemics. We are in the process of updating the C.E.P., to include a section on pandemics. You will soon receive a copy of NTTC's Emergency Advice for information regarding possible situations.

Once the Council has approved the plan, we will be looking to appoint volunteers to various roles defined within the plan (Volunteers must be willing to have their names and details kept on file) to facilitate a fast response in the event of a community emergency.

NTTC does not have access to lists of vulnerable residents. However, if you consider yourself vulnerable and would like to register your details with the council, feel free to do so. They will be kept in the strictest confidence, and can be removed whenever requested.

Things have started to get back to a sort of " normal", but as I write this the Government has started to put restrictions in place again. Fingers crossed we don't have a second wave.

Remember, the volunteers listed in the Council's second leaflet are still there if needed. You may not want physical help, but just someone to chat to; most are good listeners.

Dear members of the local community

Our Village Hall was a school until the early 1950s. When the school closed, the building was purchased for the residents of Sampford Courtenay by a group of local people. The Village Hall Committee, as trustees, ensures that the hall continues to act as a community centre in the spirit in which it was established all those years ago.

The new Village Hall kitchen, meeting room extension and foyer, offering disabled access and amenities, have been a great success. This means that the hall has been able to offer enhanced facilities to existing events and hirers, as well as attracting more activities. These include yoga, dance classes, table tennis, quizzes, musical events, as well as wedding parties and children's parties, to name a few.

The committee now faces the significant challenge of replacing the roof and the large window adjacent to the new entrance, both of which are in very poor condition. The slates will need to be removed from the roof; the best of them will be reused. There is currently no insulation in the main roof; this will be brought into line with modern standards. The chimney stack needs attention to make it weather-proof. The large window will need to be custom built. There is a lot of work involved with these repairs and quotes have been sought. Based on these quotes, the cost of undertaking the work will be in the region of £150,000. Patch repairs have been undertaken to try to keep the building watertight but we are now at a point where urgent action is needed.

We are writing to parishioners for help. The Village Hall Committee is investigating what grants and other funding may be available, but it is clear that a great deal of additional fundraising will need to take place. We would like to ask you for your views and ideas on how we can achieve this target and save our valuable parish resource. There are many ways that you can help. For example, it could be fundraising ideas, offers to organise activities or events, knowledge of other individuals or organisations which could help, or making a donation yourselves.

The Village Hall is an important resource for everyone in Sampford Courtenay. We need your help to keep it open and in a condition to ensure its ongoing use. If you would like to help please contact me.

What to expect at Okehampton Library:

Customer Numbers

There will be a limit on the number of customers at any one time and therefore safe queuing will be in place to enter the library.

Face coverings

Customers must wear face coverings (unless a customer is exempt) to ensure that we keep each other safe. **Hand sanitiser and cleaning**

A hand sanitiser station is in position to enable customers to sanitise when entering the library. Cleaning will be in place for services such as the public computers and self-service kiosks and regular cleaning of other areas is in place.

Test & Trace

Customers can voluntarily provide us with their name and telephone number to support NHS Test and Trace. **Social distancing**

We have changed the layout to ensure adequate space for customers to move around in safety in a one way system and the floor space has been marked up to support social distancing and it is requested that 2m social distancing is observed by all staff and customers.

Quarantining returned books

All books and items returned to the library will undergo 72 hours quarantine before they are removed from customer accounts. Customers will be asked to place returned items into a box near the library entrance to keep them separate for quarantining. The maximum number of book loans has been increased to 24. This is a temporary measure and it will be reviewed in December 2020.

Browsing books – quarantining

We recognise that our customers enjoy browsing and that glancing through a book before is often an integral part of the experience. In the event a customer changes their mind, a 'browsing box' has been put in place, where customers can safely leave a book or item they have handled and no longer wish to borrow.

Booking computers

Computer access sessions are limited to 1 hour and are bookable by phone, email or in person. Computers are situated to allow for 2 metres social distancing and are cleaned between every use. The number of computers available has been reduced because of this safety measure.

Computer support

New links are available on the public computer desktops for help with computers and IT queries. Staff will not be able to give assistance with the computers at this time.

Children's libraries

We invite families to use the library. A range of children's fiction stock is available in the main library. Staff will be able to bring you any other items that you require from the children's library, including picture books and we do have a range of picture book bags available with activity sheets. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult in the library.

Staff would encourage parents and carers to speak with their children before they visit the library about social distancing and also to let them know that whilst the library experience will feel different, their library still loves them and wants them to enjoy reading and learning!

Choose & Collect

There will also be a Choose and Collect service for those who do not wish to browse or are unable to enter the library. To book a space, call or email in advance to book this contactless service.


