

From The Rectory

Something to look forward to?

We are all longing for things to look forward to. I'm hearing that phrase increasingly often as we head towards the close of this difficult year. The longing for a brighter future is always there any year. How we feel today is usually subject to our plans and possibilities for tomorrow – a birthday coming up, a holiday, a treat we have been looking forward to for months... Christmas? So in a year when planning anything has been a nightmare, many of us are feeling pretty down in the dumps at the moment. It feels like there is nothing much to look forward to.

Having said that though, I am feeling a little glimmer of hope today as I have a couple of things to look forward to soon. I really hope Covid doesn't scupper them like it did our summer holiday. Exeter Chiefs have two massive games ahead in the next two weeks. By the time this is published we may be European Champions and Premiership Champions. Or we may be neither! The other glimmer of hope is that I think we Weldons might actually get a few days away in the Cotswolds shortly. We were supposed to go months ago, but... well, you know! If restrictions remain as they are, it looks like we can go. Two things to look forward to! (In a late edit... I'm now thinking I should delete this paragraph. There's talk on the BBC of a possible circuitbreaking lockdown over half term. Oh no!)

I'm a planner. Much of my job is about planning for future events and services. I am now being asked daily about Christmas plans for our churches, and my response is, "I don't know. This is what I'd like us to do, but there may be some very last minute decisions." We are planning to hold Christmas services and events in all our churches much as we usually do, and that may turn out to be possible. But nobody knows at the moment, and that is unsettling. So whether it is sport, holidays, Christmas plans or seeing a loved one face-to-face, we all yearn for future things to look forward to. We live off them. We can deal with the hardships of the present if there is something good just around the corner.

All this seems to run counter the ideas behind modern mindfulness, which seeks to help people embrace and enjoy their present reality more fully. It's present reality that is the problem in Autumn 2020! With a variety of techniques like meditation, yoga and breathing exercises, through to colouring, journaling and spending time in nature, there has been an explosion of methodologies helping people to be more aware of their thoughts and feelings as they happen moment by moment. I think mindfulness has much going for it, and there are widely practised Christian versions of it now, which include prayer and contemplation. Many people Rev'd Nick Weldon (Vicar) have found their busy stressful lives hugely improved by taking time to take note of their present experience more

fully, and count their blessings. Perhaps this is why the forced mindfulness of those blissful days of early lockdown in April came as a welcome relief for some.

But things are different now. The present reality feels increasingly tortuous and bleak. With the shorter days of winter approaching, there remains little end in sight to the loneliness and emptiness caused by a largely blank social diary. Everyone is feeling it. And so focussing on the present seems counter-productive, even potentially harmful.

With that in mind, I want to appeal to that busy-bee-like productiveness that has got the British through many a difficulty in the past. These days will pass, as has been repeated often in recent months, but they will pass much quicker and feel much less gloomy if we all find ways to make things happen this winter Doing nothing will only elongate the present reality.

In April, we were all quite good at this. We stood outside in our hundreds to applaud the NHS. We did Zoom-quizzes, DIY, and our daily exercise. We were galvanised into helping our neighbours. But now, everyone seems tired. The novelty of lockdown life wore off weeks ago, and for many, postlockdown life seems much more complicated and wearisome than it ever was before. Ordinary things like popping to the shops feel like hard work, and every glance at the media just reminds us of the problems.

So for the sake of the lonely, our own sanity, and the life of our community, let's find ways to make things happen this winter. Where there is a will there is a way – a Covid safe way. And where this is happening already, the dividends are proving great. I've noticed, every time the work has been put in to make something happen in these trying days, everyone goes away feeling miles better (until they watch the 10 o'clock news at least!) There are hundreds of reasons not to bother and just hold out for the vaccine. But as we enter month 9 of this pandemic I think the reasons to bother are mounting... community cohesion, mental, physical and spiritual well-being and the local economy to name but a few. I really hope we get through this pandemic with only a handful of positive tests in this community. It looks as though that will be the case in our lovely sheltered rural setting. But I worry that the causality list due to other causes, secondary to the virus, is growing. So let's do what we can when we can, as safely as we can, as best as we can, as soon as we can. We all need something to look forward







Covid-19 and the coming winter season

In the near future all households will receive an up to date version of the NT Emergency Plan Leaflet. Meanwhile, here is some information if you want to help local residents, or if you might need help:

Volunteers - The Council wants to be in as good a position as we can to help residents where necessary and where possible during the winter, which could be a difficult time for many. We have retained our list of community volunteers, if anyone else wishes to volunteer to help those who may be vulnerable and housebound, please contact the Town Clerk in the first instance. You'll need to have someone to provide you with a reference, or be known to a member of the Council, to the Rector, or to the Chair of NT WI. Don't forget, you may be able to help just by being a 'friend on the phone' – those who cannot get out and about can be glad of someone to chat to now and then. **Are you in the category of a 'vulnerable person'? -** if you are shielding, if you cannot get out and about, if you are worried about how you will manage to get shopping or prescriptions during the winter, or if you are at home and lonely, you can contact us and we will try and put you in touch with one of our registered volunteers.

North Tawton Cemetery - would you like to donate a bench?

There is space in the cemetery for one bench, and we're wondering if anyone would like to donate a bench in memory of a loved one. If you would like to find out more, please contact the Town Clerk. We can order a suitable bench and plaque on your behalf if you wish.

Durant Trust

Town Councillors are Trustees of the Durant Trust. The aims of the trust include "the provision of grants on applications made by bodies and groups within North Tawton which benefit the parishioners of North Tawton. The Charity shall not provide grants to national bodies nor to individuals within North Tawton." A meeting of the trust will be held during November, at a date to be finalised. If you would like to apply for a grant please contact the Town Clerk, Secretary to the Durant Trust.

Memorial Park Car Park

We're aware that parking is often difficult to find, but there is a problem with cars continually parking on the yellow hatched areas at the entrance to the car park. This can make access to the park for contractors and their machinery very difficult. Additionally it makes it harder to manoeuvre in and out of the car park, so please could we ask residents not to park in these areas.

Other news:

- Various minor works identified by the Annual RoSPA safety report for the memorial park equipment have now been completed. This includes repairs and refurbishment to the gates to the toddler area. We're ordering some new larger bins, and next year the metal gates to the entrances in Barton Street will be refurbished.
- In early November interviews will take place for a new Assistant Town Clerk, further to the retirement of Mr Stephen Webb. Stephen has been a great asset to the Council, we will miss him, but we all wish him a healthy and happy retirement and thank him for everything he has done over the last couple of years.
- At the time of writing there is a vacancy on the Council further to the resignation of Dr. Peter Brickley. Again, we would all like to thank Dr. Brickley for his enthusiastic involvement in the work of the Council, and wish him well in all his future projects. Please check our noticeboard and website for information as to progress in filling the vacancy. Bear in mind that there are legal timescales which mean the advertisement for possible election had to be posted by a certain date, and expires within a certain period of time. If no-one asks for an election to be held, the Council can co-opt someone onto the Council again, check our website and noticeboard.

Pledge for Nature Update

North Devon Biosphere

What happens next?

"What happens next is up to every one of us" – Sir David Attenborough's haunting words as he closed his latest documentary, Extinction: The facts. This was re-inforced by the end of September UN report on biodiversity which concluded: "The health of ecosystems on which we and all other species depend is deteriorating more rapidly than ever. We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide."

The issues are as apparent here as they are in the tropics, and we have a special responsibility to look after nature in North Devon's UNESCO Biosphere Reserve not least because the area's economy depends on it. But how can each of us respond to Attenborough's seemingly overwhelming challenge? I suggest four ways:

First, we need urgently to create more space for nature and connect up wild areas across gardens, community spaces, business sites and particularly farms - let a corner go wild, avoid the use of chemicals, make a pond or wild flower patch or plant trees. Farmers, who manage so much of the countryside, have the largest opportunity to help nature, and many are doing so already. But can you do more, by leaving aside some less productive land for nature, and making your farm more nature-friendly?

Second, use your spending power to support businesses that are doing good things for nature. Buy local meat and vegetables sourced from farms in countryside stewardship or with organic or Red Tractor symbols. And at the supermarket, buy British - and avoid exporting problems abroad.

Third, use your influence to make government at all levels to do more for nature. Encourage your employer and other businesses to do more, both on the land they manage and through their supply chains. Lobby your bank or your pension provider to ensure they are not investing in businesses that are damaging nature.

Finally, support a local conservation organisation and help their vital work. We'd love to hear how you are going to respond to Sir David Attenborough's challenge. Please contact us at biosphere-mailbox@devon.gov.uk or put a pledge on the map at



The Three Hares Primary Schools

You may have already come across the symbol of the three hares that is so prominent across this area. In the last couple of years, it has also become associated with a small group of three primary schools, known as The Three Hares.

The Three Hares schools are North Tawton Primary, South Tawton Primary and Chagford Church of England Primary Schools. These schools became academies in January 2018, within the larger organisation of Dartmoor Multi Academy Trust, which consists of fourteen primary and three secondary schools.

I would like to introduce myself to you: my name is Elizabeth Underwood, and I was appointed in 2019 as Executive Headteacher for The Three Hares Primaries. I work closely with our leadership team comprising the three Heads of School, Sunita Chauhan, Sarah Marvin and Tara Penny, to drive school improvement and offer the best possible education for the children within the local area.

Now that all of the children are safely back at school (and, by all accounts, delighted to back with their friends) we would like to share more about our schools with you. Below are some reflections, compiled by a few children about their experiences of lockdown, through to coming back to school in September. We are looking forward to sharing more with you all in the coming months.

Back to School

In March, our school had to close because of Coronavirus – Covid 19. At first it felt a bit weird being at home because it was so new. But after a while we all settled in to this new way of working. We had fun being with our families and spending lots of time outside, riding bikes and playing games.

Some children were able to go to school because their parents were key workers. That means they have essential jobs that can't be done at home on a computer, like doctors, police officers, shop owners and teachers. The children came to school so the adults could keep the country running.

After a while it got a bit boring being at home. We really missed our friends, and some of us even missed our teachers and doing school work! Sometimes it felt like we had no purpose and sometimes it was quite frustrating for us, and for our parents. It was interesting that when we were not at school, we really missed it!

Some children had their birthday during lockdown and couldn't have a party or even have one friend around to play.

Now we are back at school and it feels great to be with our friends and continuing our education. It is great to be in class with our teachers and learning our new topics.

It does feel different in school now because we have bubbles. We have different areas of the playground and field to play in but we do swap so we have a change of scenery. In class, we have to sit in rows and we have to socially distance, but we are working hard and making the best of it. We hope everyone stays safe and their hearts are filled with rainbows. Let's continue to be happy, even when it's tough.

Hi everyone

It is great to be back! After 6 months of being on furlough, I was delighted to get the call to return to work this week. What a year 2020 has been. I have missed my regular communications with you all and the various calls and messages I receive. I hope you have all kept safe and well and looked after each other.

I would like to say a massive thank you to everyone who has been in contact with my friends and colleagues at Castle Drogo, Finch Foundry, Lydford Gorge, Parke and the many wonderful countryside sites across the moor over the past 6 months offering support, positive messages, donations and coming back to visit (in a socially distanced way, of course). It has meant so much to the team during such unusual times – and we really appreciate the help. It has also been a privilege to be here for you all when you need that all-important breath of fresh air and access to beauty and nature. Aren't we lucky to be in glorious Devon with the wonderful Teign Valley on our doorstep!

Speaking of the estate, you may also remember that I mentioned last year that we were starting to put plans in place to thin the large beech trees along the castle drive. These trees are very large and close together and, being beech, are suffering from lots of damage by grey squirrels. We are going to thin them to increase light levels to enable us to underplant with young trees, whilst allowing the remaining large trees room to spread. This work is due to take place in October so you will see activity very soon.
