Here are some guidelines from the RHS about purchasing peat free compost.

- · If the bag doesn't say peat-free then it most likely isn't.
- Wording such as 'environmentally friendly', 'compost' and 'organic' do not always mean it is peat free. Always check the bag to see if it says 'peat free'.
- A good quality peat-free growing media is usually a little more expensive. The price does tend to reflect quality.
