



From The Rectory

Service and dynamism... those were two of the many words used to describe H.R.H. The Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh on the announcement of his death on 9^{th} April. What an amazing life.

In the days since his death we have heard a lot about him.... his birth in Corfu into the Greek Royal Family, his troubled childhood, his schooling in Scotland, his naval career and wartime exploits, his marriage to the then Princess Elizabeth, her accession to the throne, and his role as her consort through 73 years of marriage and 69 years of her reign. We have heard about his unique temperament, his dedication to duty, his relationship with his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and we have heard about his most treasured achievement - the founding of the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. Even the staunchest anti-monarchist cannot fail to be impressed by the man's service and dynamism over his 99 years.

Here in Devon we can lay claim to a couple of unique perspectives on the Duke. Famously it was in this county that a young Prince Philip, as an 18 year old cadet at Britannia Royal Naval College in Dartmouth, first met an even younger Princess Elizabeth. He was placed in charge of the two young princesses who came to the college for an official visit in July 1939. Elizabeth was just 13, and although they had both been present at a few official occasions before, it was on the tennis court at Dartmouth where the future Queen fell in love with the budding officer, showing off as he jumped over the net.

But Prince Philip was to come even closer to us here in our parishes; Eggesford to be precise, in 1956. The Duke and the Queen visited Barnstaple, but on the same visit they also stopped off at Eggesford Forest to unveil a plaque commemorating the millionth acre of trees planted by the Forestry Commission. The British Pathe footage is viewable online and you can even see them each plant an oak tree either side of the plaque. The two trees are still growing strong today. We found them on a recent family walk. If there is anyone reading this who witnessed this event first hand, I'd love to hear from you. I'm sure someone from our parishes ventured over the hills to see them. Maybe we could publish your memories of the day in a later edition.

Like many, I confess that my view of Prince Philip is somewhat coloured now by his portrayal in the Netflix drama The Crown. How accurate a portrayal it is or not I really don't know, but even the briefest bit of research would suggest the series did at least attempt to capture the essence of the man. I don't recall the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme featuring much in the series. It is probably not sensational enough, which is a shame, because it is reputed to be his proudest achievement. He longed to put back within young people a sense of adventure and service in a world where most grow up in cities, often starved of inspiration, encouragement and experiences. Despite all the technological advances of his 99 years, that seems to be a greater problem than ever before, which the pandemic has sadly further exacerbated. He was also passionate about conservation and he possessed a robust and enquiring Christian faith. He relished conversation and unflinching debate, founding St. George's House Windsor for exactly that purpose. He was not a morning person and he walked quickly.

By his own admission Philip had his failings, but his is an extraordinary story of dedication to his wife the Queen and the country that he made his home. And even when he didn't want to (which he made patently clear at times!) he served the nation and his family with unique character and dynamism through many periods of joy and trial. Sir, rest in peace.



Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

One very happy husband. And the reason why he's blissfully happy? If only it had something to do with me but alas no. The spuds are in. He's ploughed, crumbled, rotavated – and with the help of two very able assistants who were happy to sit astride his home-made potato planter (involving two old Astra car seats and various other 'that'll come in handy' bits of metal that eventually did come in handy) and drop a seed spud down a tube into the hallowed ground at the precise moment/ spacing required – the job was done. Now our attention is fixed firmly on weather forecasts. If only David Braine knew. It wasn't really his fault. We should have paid more attention. Cast your mind back to May 2020 – we're all having to adjust to this pandemic thingy and the skies are blue, the air seems clearer and the Knott household is retiring for the night. Should have listened to David. Should have thought about those precious spud leaves poking through and exposing themselves to a late frost whilst we slumbered. Never mind. Apart from random bits of metal and car seats, we now have assorted flannelette sheets and old duvets. A shed full of them. Just in case. Not sure if flannelette sheets ever featured in the career of our recent guest speaker – (can't imagine that flannelette sheets would tie together that easily to facilitate an escape from prison, husband says they're a bit too thick). Chris Duffin kicked off her prison officer basic training at Styal's Women's Prison which had prison wings named after certain prison reformers such as Fry House, she stood beneath the sign 'Hooker' hanging over the wing entrance waiting to greet the 20 inmates that would troop through. The crime that these particular ladies had committed? Prostitution. Each morning she would be asked 'Getting much business Miss?' to which she would cleverly reply 'No. Too many amateurs in here giving it away. We've got to organise and set our prices right ladies'. And it was that clever, confident and respectful attitude that marked Chris out for Governor training. So, after 15 months on 'the landings' she headed off to Stoke Heath Borstal which housed young offenders. From there it was on to HMP Strangeways working alongside Norman 'Scarface' Brown who, in Chris's words, was a rather unconventional Governor. There were 1,800 male prisoners, hundreds of male staff and an awful lot of rude comments and doubts concerning her abilities but Chris got stuck in and over time she won the respect of both prisoners and her male

As a Governor, Chris also did time at Dartmoor Prison and Cookham Wood where she frequently encountered Myra Hindley who was an orderly there and, as part of her 'job', would make the tea. Chris described Myra as being pleasant and polite, getting on well with the staff. One of Chris's philosophies was 'when you are in prison or work in a prison you have to deal with the person rather than the crime'. A remarkable speaker with a hugely interesting story to tell. Can you make a rabbit out of a flannel? I was peering in to my W.I. Easter goody bag and there it was. Peering back at me. Two eyes and a little pink cutey nose. Now that's clever. What else have I got? Some divine chocolates, a rabbit shaped Easter biscuit, a lucky four leaved clover key ring, (all home-made of course) a posh teabag and some sunflower seeds. How about that? Bet you wish you were in the W.I.. Oh – what's this? A request for this year's subscription? Worth every penny.


Is this the beginning of the end — or the end of the beginning?

And what have we learned from the past year?

- 1. Appreciation for the tremendous efforts by workers in the NHS to care for us.

- 11. Older students have not had the "full university" experience for which they had hoped (and paid).
- 12. Not to sing.
- 13. Social media has been a boon; the benefits of "Zooming" have been embraced even by those who were afraid of it.
- 14. Unanticipated effort has gone into clearing the attic, redecorating the home and tidying the garden (for those lucky enough to have one).
- 15. Pet dogs are desirable companions. Also, there is life in the old dog yet. The elderly can take comfort from the example of one near-centenarian with a zimmer frame and undiminished determination.
- 16. Online church services have attracted greater numbers than would normally attend church in person.
- 17. Most areas of Devon (and most people living there) have escaped the worst effects of the pandemic.

Referendum to be held in North Tawton

Everyone in North Tawton who is on the electoral register can vote on the town's Neighbourhood Plan on Thursday 6th May. The Plan, which has developed over a number of years, began with a questionnaire to all households and has evolved through a series of consultation events. It sets out policies for development of the town until 2035.

The final stage for every Neighbourhood Plan is to put it to a public vote. The Plan cannot be adopted until that has happened. Voters can vote "yes" or "no" to the question on the ballot paper:

"Do you want West Devon Borough Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for North Tawton to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area."

If more people vote "yes" than "no", WDBC will use North Tawton's Neighbourhood Plan to help decide planning applications. If more people vote "no" than "yes", WDBC can consider planning applications

without reference to the Plan.





Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus May's Monthly Challenge - Wildlife: Bees, bugs and plants
The challenge this month is to do more than you would usually do to help insects, particularly bees, and wildlife. Remember that insects are useful and they pollinate plants to produce flowers and fruits.
We need them – and they need us to look after them!

- Could you make a **bug hotel**? There are lots of instructions for different styles available on the internet. Can you put a log pile in your garden or yard for bugs to hide and nest in?
- Do you have plants that attract and provide food for bees, butterflies and other insects?

 Look out for plant swap plants that they particularly like. Remember that bees like single flowers more than double they can easily reach the central part of the flower where the nectar and pollen is stored. If you've got a crowded bunch of leafy bluebell plants then split them now after flowering and whilst you still know where they are to get even more flowers next Spring if you forget you can still do this in the Autumn, if you remember where they are. Check, though, that they are the native English bluebells, not the invasive Spanish ones which will hybridise (cross pollinate with) the English ones!
- **Take photos of bugs, bees and butterflies** on flowers and plants ready to enter into the Parish competition later in the year, either at the Produce Show or wherever we hold as an alternative event.
- Could you **take cuttings** of plants that they like (e.g. buddleia, sedum) and, when rooted, give them to other people in the Parish to attract even more bugs to Sampford Courtenay? We will try to organise a Parish 'bee and bug count' for children (and adults) sometime after lockdown ends.
- Do you **need to mow all of your grass regularly** or could you leave some of it to grow? Can you let any wild flowers go to seed before you cut it? This would save fuel/ power as well as being good for bugs and wildlife, particularly if it is next to hedges and links to anything that your neighbours can leave uncut as well.

Reprinted from Roundabout in May 1995:

Following a previous article, P.C. Dave Killick made enquiries and Headquarters at Middlemoor confirmed that the North Street Police Station was built circa 1859 and its successor was officially opened on 15th April 1966. (in Barton Street, near the present fire-station.—editor 2021)

The opening of the newest Police Station was not before time. The old building in North Street could not be said to have headed the list of priorities in the matter of services. A piped water supply was not connected until 1930 and electricity was not installed until 1946. Before this, gas was the only means of lighting.

The site for the old building was bought for £50 and the newer station was put up by a local builder (Mr Hooper), using stone from Cocktree Quarry (now disused), on the edge of Dartmoor.

At this stage of its history, North Tawton was an important centre. It had a large tan-yard, a woollen factory, three annual fairs in April, October and December, and was governed by a Portreeve.

During the building of the railway 100 years ago there were frequently skirmishes with drunken imported navvies, and it is recorded that on one occasion when one was lodged in the cells for being drunk and disorderly, his friends entered the town in a mob and demanded his release. They met their match, however, in the local Magistrate and Rector, Rev'd. Robert Hale, who read the Riot Act from the police station and got them to disperse.

£165,000 in Den Brook Grants


The Den Brook Community Fund Committee met "virtually" in February to approve four more Community Grants which brought the total grants allocated so far to over £165,000.

Over the last four years, the five parishes adjacent to the Den Brook Wind farm invested funds in their local communities through membership of the Den Brook Community Fund.

Background.

In 2015, the five parish councils of Bow, North Tawton, South Tawton, Spreyton and Zeal Monachorum signed a Service Level Agreement with RES who manage the Den Brook Wind Farm. The agreement enables the Fund Committee to distribute grant payments over the life of the wind farm. Over four years the Committee received £210,373.90 in grant monies to invest in capital project proposals submitted by local voluntary not-for-profit organisations and social clubs who are based within the parish boundaries. The overall fund is apportioned to a pre-agreed formula based partly on parish populations and the pie chart below identifies the proportion of grant allocations by parish.

Share of Grants Across Parishes



Community Investment.

Meeting twice yearly, the Committee use Cost Benefit analysis, various accountancy ratios and a set of seven pre-defined benefits to assess project proposals. This approach enables disparate project proposals to be assessed in a consistent way enabling it to measure investments made by the Committee across their local communities.

Based on the number of benefits validated on each grant application and divided by the amount of each grant, the amalgamated amounts of the investment are -

Provision of a sustainable legacy -	£30,555.12
Energy saving proposals	£15,469.95
Promotion of Equal Opportunities	£22,094.72
Promotion of Health & Well-Being	£32,084.14
Provision of services to vulnerable and disabled people	£24,480.18
Encouragement of voluntary and social activities	£32,671.38
Improve local employment opportunities	£ 8,059.01

The fund has contributed to all kinds of projects. Large building renovations (usually funded in stages) include improvements to village halls and youth clubs. Medium sized grants have helped sporting clubs to establish or renovate playing fields and provide machinery to maintain them, as well as the provision of sporting equipment and secure storage facilities. Other grants include provision of stage lighting and sound systems, whilst smaller projects have provided scout groups with tents and camping equipment. and new toys for nursery groups.

Overall, the committee has provided financial assistance to 35 projects and the average cost to the fund to achieve each benefit has been £946.16, with the lowest at £155 and highest at £3,333.

Next Steps

As we slowly emerge from the Covid 19 lock-down, people will be more energised than before as they realise how much they have missed or rely upon social and community support for their health and well-being. When we are able to meet up again, the five communities can begin to build back their voluntary organisations and clubs, or maybe start up a new venture (the Committee accepts costed business plans!).
