



From The Rectory

Please Remain Calm

"Subscription completed. Please remain calm." That was the message that flashed up on our TV screen after what seemed like half an hour of searching, scrolling, and passwords. "Death by log-in" we call it. Why is Amazon Prime telling me to remain calm? Don't you hate annoying and unnecessary messages like that! They are in the category of modern irritants alongside mobile phone updates, unskippable adverts, pointless tannoy announcements, average speed cameras, and being asked if you accept cookies or not (I'm still annoyed that you don't get an actual cookie when you click "accept all.") Maybe I do need to be told to remain calm.

Anyway, for our viewing pleasure that particular evening we selected the next episode of the brilliant HBO drama "Chernobyl". Yes – that Chernobyl. If the annoying Amazon consumer advice had not disturbed my calm enough, the programme certainly did. I needed 10 minutes of The Repair Shop to calm me down afterwards. However, there was one silver lining to our harrowing evening sitting on the sofa. There is nothing like a catastrophic nuclear disaster to take your mind off the present crisis.

Thankfully the present crisis is significantly easing now in the UK. As I write, it has just been announced that the country will take the third step on the roadmap out of lockdown on 17th May, and thanks to the vaccination programme, it looks like we will pass step 4 without a u-turn as well. One very welcome prospect at the end of the pandemic will be (hopefully) the reduction in silly advice. It really has felt as though we have all been treated like idiots at times over the last year; so much so, that when the "roadmap" first appeared in February, I was looking for the date for when the Government would allow me to think for myself once again.

Having said that, Boris has just announced we can hug our friends and relatives again. Perhaps the pool of silly advice has not been drained quite yet. My children's reactions were priceless though... "Yay! Huggles with Granny!" (Olivia aged 6). "That's weird." (Emily aged 10). "Do I have to?" (Samuel aged 12). Out of the mouth of babes...

Okay, yes... some people have constantly needed reminders of the restrictions. In fact, I should be included in that number too. I thought I knew how to wash my hands. But my daughters quickly showed me a better way. "You didn't wash your thumbs Daddy!" There have also been plenty reported incidents of rules being flouted and covid-risky liberties being taken. But after a year of restrictions, most of them necessary, one does feel rather over-advised and robbed of the ability to make a sensible personal decision. The levels of public compliance have been extraordinary. I suppose that is what fear does. But

we must remember that ordinary civil liberties have been hard won in this country, such that law-abiding people can live their lives with freedom of speech and conscience, and freedom to assess their own levels of risk. This is one reason why we as churches have continually offered worship in person in church whenever it has been permitted. We have wanted to keep the decision in the minds of worshippers, not making that decision for them by remaining closed.

One possible consequence of covid, the Government's response to it, and the high-levels of public compliance is that we end up with a more risk averse society, where people and organisations will be more reticent to do things without the rubber stamp of authority. I wouldn't welcome that as I think it would quench ambition, restrict opportunities and limit freedom. As someone responsible for buildings and what happens in them, I haven't wanted to put people at risk, but at the same time I haven't wanted to take sensible decision making away from individuals either.

Are you making plans for this spring and summer? I hope you are. We are. We've got lots of family and friends to catch up with in person. It's my father's 80th birthday this month, so we are having a Zoom party on the actual day, and then a proper party later in the summer too. I hope you are filling the months ahead with long overdue meet ups, celebrations and shindigs. And I hope there is not a restriction or silly message in sight, except "please have fun."

Now that takes the biscuit! My calm has been disturbed again. I've got a mild ear infection at the moment, and I've just read the side of the bottle of eardrops. "Do not spray at someone else" it says. Ahhh! In fact, most of the accompanying leaflet seems to have been written for a complete imbecile. Lord, give me strength. However, I should come clean about Amazon Prime, though. Having watched episode 2 of Chernobyl, and ranted about the silly "please remain calm" message, my son flicked the remote control and said, "No Dad. That's the name of the episode. You subscribed to an episode called 'Please Remain Calm". Who feels like an imbecile now?





New Chair and Vice-Chair of North Tawton Town Council

At its recent Annual Meeting, members of NTTC voted for a new Chair of the Council further to Cllr. Whiteley deciding not to stand for the post of Chair this year. Cllr. Jean Trewhitt was elected as Chair, and Cllr. Whiteley agreed to stand for Vice-Chair and was duly elected.

Cllr. Trewhitt has previously chaired the Council's Estates Committee, and also the Neighbourhood Plan Group, which successfully delivered our town plan – see the article below about the recent referendum.

Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Success

North Tawton residents have resoundingly endorsed the town's Neighbourhood Plan.

Those who took part in the Referendum on 6th May voted by a huge majority (87% to 12%) to accept the plan which will now become a tool in planning decisions made by the local planning authority (West Devon Borough Council). A simple majority was all that was needed.

The volunteer group of councillors and local residents who drew up the plan is delighted at the result. It means that when considering planning applications for future development of the town and surrounding area, West Devon Borough Council must take into account the policies that have been decided by local people during the consultation that has taken place over recent years. Jean Trewhitt, who chaired the group, said:

"It's great that people have seen that the Neighbourhood Plan is an important document when it comes to shaping the future for us all. West Devon needs to consider it when they are making decisions and we know that they will. We can't guarantee that everything in the Plan will be delivered, but the Plan itself is a guarantee that our voices will be heard. A big thank you to those who came out and voted for it."

This recent meeting again had to be held via Zoom. The agenda was brief, as it is intended to call an informal Town Meeting in early Autumn, at which time it is hoped that this can be held in the Town Hall – residents will receive plenty of notification in due course.

A meeting of the Durant Trust will be held by the end of July, a date will be set shortly. Please look out on our noticeboard and website for notification of this meeting. The Durant Trust can make grants to organisations for the benefit of residents of North Tawton. Organisations interested in applying are advised that new application forms will be issued, so do not apply using the old forms – again, notification of the new forms will be on our website and noticeboard in due course.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

There's a first time for everything. But if this is the very first time that you have picked up 'Roundabout' magazine and your eyes have alighted (should that be alit?) on this particular page then – a) you have my sympathy/apologies and absolute permission to flick back to the North Tawton Town Council page and b) you need to know that 'husband' (that is to say the deeply Devonian chap to whom I said 'I will' one fine July day) is also wedded to the humble spud. In fact, he'll be upset that I dared to call it 'humble'. For him, the potato season lasts pretty much for the entire year. January – they are chitting in the spare bedroom (no guests allowed whilst chitting is occurring) they chit through February and the beginning of March. Later in March they are planted. We then watch for the first signs of foliage breaking through the soil and prepare to protect them from any naughty frosts that could happen anytime until mid-May. The foliage is then carefully monitored throughout the spring/summer for any issues – especially the ol' potato blight. Harvesting is next. Accompanied by exclamations ranging from 'not enough rain – they're a bit on the small side' to 'blimey – look at the size of these – there'll be no spud famine this year'. Up they come, in to the potato sacks they go and then over to me to embrace all recipes potatoey for the rest of the year.

But something caught my eye recently. Something that husband was failing to incorporate into his ground preparation. According to Monty Don, when it's time to plant potatoes, the soil must be dry and not cold to touch. Sounds reasonable – but how can we check? Easy. Drop your trousers and sit bare-cheeked on the soil. Any 'farmer of old' would know this (and I'm sure would be more than happy to demonstrate.) Thank you, Monty. I have shared this vital gardening tip with husband. His look of disbelief was priceless. He seems to think that it's probably the farmer's wife that performs the soil temperature test as she would have more sensitive skin. I wish I'd never mentioned it. Myths and legends. There must be some linked to the spud (see above) but there are a lot more linked to Dartmoor. Marilyn Bishop, our Zoom speaker, was brimming with them. Some of them were familiar – the story of Jay's Grave, a young unmarried housemaid who was betrayed by her lover and took her own life. She was buried near Manaton in unconsecrated ground and at a crossroads so her spirit could not find it's way back to the parish. Fresh flowers are regularly laid on her grave but who puts these flowers there? Nobody knows.

Marilyn had plenty to say about pixies and their mischievous antics at Ockery clapper bridge near Princetown and how about the legend of The Hairy Hands? A pair of disembodied hands that suddenly appear and grab the steering wheel when you're driving at night on the road between Postbridge and Two Bridges. You want witches? Dartmoor has them too. How about Vixana, who lived at the foot of Vixen Tor and would conjure up thick swirling mists to confuse unwary travellers who would lose their way and fall into nearby mires and bogs. Marilyn skipped (like a pixie) from one myth to another – you could say we were spellbound.





Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus June Monthly Challenge - Enjoy and reflect By now, you should have done quite a bit to change what you do within your household that will make things better. Hopefully, you can enjoy the Summer and feel good about this ... as well as reviewing your New Year's resolutions from January to see how you're doing. If you didn't see these or can't remember them then please look on the S.C. Website where you'll find them together with a lot of other information about wildlife and climate issues. How much and how often are you using your lawnmower this year? Remember that using your lawnmower for an hour produces the same emissions as driving a car for a hundred miles. Worth leaving that wildflower strip uncut for lots of reasons - save time, money and the planet ... all at the same time! If you see wildlife in your garden or in meadows and other habitats within Devon during the month you could record it on the Devon Wildlife Trust website. Here you will find the 'Devon Biodiversity Record Centre' and they're carrying out a census-type survey of wildlife in the County (just like we did for ourselves in March!). Interestingly, people are more likely to use their system to record less usual wildlife so the current records, for example, suggests that there are more hedgehogs in Devon than brown rats... maybe we just don't like owning up to having rats. Anyway, it would be good if more of us could support them by recording what we see throughout the year. Use natural heat – the final part of this month's challenge is to ban the use of the tumble drier! Get organised with your laundry situation and watch the weather forecast to make best use of the fine, dry weather to dry most/all of your washing ... and to continue this from now on whenever you can!



I am very fortunate to take on the leadership of North Tawton Community Primary School. The school is in a wonderful location, with brilliantly committed staff and fabulous pupils. In my early weeks I have enjoyed getting to know children by visiting them in their classes hard at work, speaking with them during our assemblies and at lunch and playtimes. I have met some parents through our Friends of North Tawton meetings and I have tried to meet and greet as many as possible at the gate in the morning.

The staff are working hard to ensure all children are making progress and enjoying their learning. Life at school is slowly getting back to normal. We have been delighted to welcome back Rev Weldon and Wes Cutler to lead assemblies, our brilliant music tutors are resuming instrument lessons and we hope to have our Little Seedings toddlers group back soon.
