



From The Rectory

Leaving Devon

"Why on earth would you want to leave Devon?" This was the question I was asked recently. "There are some other nice places too," I replied. Interestingly, the question came from someone in my new parish in Oxfordshire. As some of you will know, the Weldon family are off to pastures new in September. After 10 years here, we are moving to Marcham near Abingdon.

Devon is lovely as we all know, and despite the showery August we've had, it is particularly lovely to see the harvest coming in and the corn stooks standing in the fields. We will really miss Devon. However, we all know that behind the picture-postcard idyll there is a huge amount of work and stress for those for whom the west country is their home and workplace rather than their holiday destination. Despite the question, I'm sure my new parishioners up country are well aware of that, for much of Oxfordshire is farmland too. Indeed, the county now has its own farming champion in the wonderful Kaleb Cooper, the real star of Clarkson's Farm – the Amazon Prime TV show set on Jeremy Clarkson's farm.

Nevertheless, I have asked myself a few times since getting the job as Vicar of Marcham... "why am I leaving Devon?" We're moving for multiple small reasons that add up to enough, I think (?) They include: feeling God's call to a new challenge; it feels like the right time to go; moving now will be less costly on the children than in a couple of years' time; 10 years is a decent stretch for a first Vicar job; all of our wider family now live up country; our churches here are in good health and in need of fresh blood with a fresh vision. Adding them up, we are sure we are doing the right thing. Ultimately, trusting in God's providence, we felt we had to push the door to see if it opened. And it did. So while we feel we have the energy and the passion for a new challenge, we've got to go. I can well imagine we may be back one day. We'll really miss the beach.

Much has changed since we moved here in July 2011. We came with a toddler and a baby. Samuel is now nearly a teenager, Emily finishes primary school next year and Olivia is, well... big(ish). Jane has done one round of maternity leave and worked at two local GP practices. We've seen a few changes of church wardens and treasurers across our four churches, but nothing like the number of changes that some churches have gone through in the last decade. And all four churches are open and thriving, as is the case in many rural communities across the UK. Don't

believe the hype about the imminent death of the rural church! It is tough, and there are huge challenges, but God is building his church.

Since July 2011, I have taken 52 weddings, 43 baptisms and 140 funerals, some in particularly tragic circumstances. And this is my 91st article in Roundabout. In that time, we've had about 1500 Sunday services, numerous midweek activities and meetings; and, praise the Lord (!) we have seen lots of people grow in faith and a few come to faith in Christ too. We have sent two people into full-time ministry, and a dozen young people presented for Confirmation. I came eager to serve this community with the gospel of Christ, and in his strength alongside lots of other people, especially my wonderful clergy colleague Rita Bullworthy, we have been enabled to do that with fruitful results. Covid has hugely affected the final stretch of my time here, and that has been really difficult. But overall, I think the four churches are in good heart. Incidentally, we have been given assurances by Exeter Diocese that I will be replaced with a full-time minister in due course. The vacancy will last at least a year, so please do give your full support to Revd's Rita and John, parish worker Wez, the churchwardens, and all who serve in our parish churches. In that way, they will be able to continue to serve you throughout the vacancy and beyond.

We will treasure so many happy memories from our time in this community (and not a few surprises too) ... lots of wonderful friends of all ages and backgrounds who have been so kind to us; lots of fun on farms in and out of tractors, combines, quad bikes and even a tank once; a double wedding; various garden fetes, Nanny Knight's Revels, nativity plays and services; Oke rugby fixtures; North Tawton football fixtures and cup finals; pony days; beach trips to Bude; climbing tors on Dartmoor; school assemblies and sports days; Exeter Chiefs matches; countless bikes rides, runs and walks around the lanes; and, of course, four fantastic musicals in church... Joseph, Another Story Begins, Oliver and Jesus Christ Superstar. It's been great fun. We have loved our time amongst you. So why am I leaving? Too late now. Just don't ask me what I found once in St Peter's Church vestry!

God be with you till we meet again. Bye for now.



Would you like to join North Tawton Town Council as one of our Councillors?

At the time of writing there are 3 vacancies on the Council. We will be considering co-option of one applicant at our September meeting – there will still be 2 vacancies to be filled by co-option (as no-one requested an election).

Why become a Town Councillor?

Town Councillors are elected representatives who volunteer their time to work on behalf of local residents. By becoming a parish councillor you can be a voice for your community, somebody to whom residents will look for help, guidance and support. You will be involved in local decision making and strategic planning to benefit the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of decisions you have helped make, can give you a huge sense of achievement and pride.

These are just some of the roles and responsibilities of a Town Councillor:

- A North Tawton Town Councillor is one of 12 individuals, supported by the Town Clerks, who represent residents within the Town to help ensure their views are heard and considered.
- As a Member of the Council you will help to make decisions regarding the finances involved in delivering local services.
- You'll be helping us to protect and improve the built and natural environment of North Tawton. This may involve contributing to long term policy development or being part of the team that assesses and comments on local planning applications.
- Liaising and working in partnership with other organisations, agencies or neighbouring parish councils where necessary.

How much time does being a councillor take?

How much time you are able to commit will be up to you and what level of involvement you are hoping for. You'll be expected to attend the monthly Town Council meetings and any extra meetings that are necessary. You need to be free to attend meetings of Committees or working groups you join.

For more information, eligibility criteria, and an application form please go to our website, there is a link from the front page. Alternatively, contact the Town Clerk. We can arrange for you to speak to one of our existing Councillors for an insight into the role if you wish.

Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestion – Autumn
Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestion – September

1. Come to the Village Green and Church Rooms on Saturday
18th September at 2.30pm for the Bug Hotel Workshop and Seed Bomb
event together with Childrens' games, Storytelling and Cream teas. If
you've donated plastic bottle tops and milk containers you can see what's
happened to them. It won't solve the climate crisis but it might make us

think differently about plastics and finding new uses rather than buying new.

- 2. See if you can **create your own Wildflower and Wildlife area** somewhere garden or verge, it doesn't matter. This is the right time of year to start cut the grass as short as you can and rake off the cuttings. You're aiming to take as many nutrients off the ground as possible scarify or 'rough up' the turf as much as you can and spread a light covering of sand if you've got some. Then, before the end of September, scatter the wildflower seeds and water them in to settle the soil. Roll or tread them in if you can. You'll need to do something to protect the seeds from birds until they germinate take care if you use netting that it doesn't trap them underneath. You can also string, old cassette or video tape between bamboo canes or use recycled foil containers tied so that they flap in the wind to discourage birds.
- 3. During the Autumn, why not **think about food miles** again like we did last year? How far does the food on your plate travel before it gets there? Can you have <u>at least</u> one main meal a week where <u>all</u> of the ingredients have been bought (and preferably grown) locally at least within 15 miles of your home? During the rest of the month, read the labels on packaging and find out where your regular food items come from. We should all do as much as we can to reduce our food air miles.
- 4. If you want extra food based activities Do you know which of the foods you eat are organic? Could you eat more organic foods? Could you grow more of your own next year? Use the longer evenings to look through those seed catalogues. Work out your vegetable rotations for next year to help your garden soil structure and to avoid certain pests reducing the need for both fertiliser and chemicals.
- 5. and finally, How's your Carburettor? Did you know that there will be more ethanol in UK unleaded fuel from this month and that this might affect our cars as well as, for example, garden machinery? The ethanol content in unleaded petrol will increase from 5% to 10% (labelled as E5 or E10 at the pumps) as part of a move to cut greenhouse gas emissions. The Government estimates that the change will reduce CO2 emissions by 750,000 tonnes a year, the equivalent of taking 350,000 cars off the road. For cars built after 2011 this might mean a slight (1%) reduction in miles to the gallon due to ethanol's lower energy content. For petrol-powered garden equipment it could lead to an increase in carburettor issues as storing petrol with a higher ethanol content over extended periods can cause increased corrosion because ethanol absorbs moisture and the fuel becomes thicker and 'gunks up' (technical term!) the fuel lines. It's always been recommended that we drain the fuel from garden equipment if it won't be used for two weeks or longer to prevent 'stale fuel' issues. Equipment that won't be used over the Winter months can be 'flushed through' with special products to prevent starting problems next year. Premium quality 'Super' unleaded fuel will continue to contain 5% or less ethanol.

What Do Children Learn at School These Days?

This month, while the staff and children are enjoying the summer holiday, I thought I'd answer the question – 'What do children learn at school these days?'

Our youngest children are introduced to learning thorough lots of play activities, carefully set up and presented to give them opportunities to discover and explore the world around them. For example a tray of water and different containers soon gives rise to children exploring the concepts 'empty', 'full', 'more than', 'less than,' and by presenting children with measuring jugs with scales and numbers in this real context, they begin to notice and talk about how much water they have and need and *voila*, the children are learning about capacity! In Nursery, most of the leaning is self-directed, meaning the children choose their activities. While it can look like children are just 'playing' the Early Years Framework is carefully constructed to give children experiences to develop skills and knowledge. As the children progress through to Reception Class, there are more times throughout the day when the children are directed to take part in a staff-led activity and come together for more frequent whole class sessions, sitting on the carpet together with the teacher reading a story, modelling a skill or explaining a concept. In Year One and upwards the children follow the National Curriculum, a set of learning objectives which build on subject-specific skills and knowledge year on year. More often, the children sit at allocated tables working in groups, and at times independently on set pieces of work.

While of course we teach the traditional 'Three Rs' (reading, 'riting and 'rithmetic) the children enjoy a balanced curriculum which also includes music, history, geography, art and design, technology, science, PSHE (personal, social, health and economics), religious education, physical education and computing. The older children also learn French. We have a timetable for each class so that we make sure the children have received a balance of the subjects over the week, term and year.

Sometimes a subject area will be blocked, for example when undertaking a design project, it is sometimes more practical to do this over consecutive days rather than an hour a week over several weeks.

Most of the time, classrooms are lively places with discussions, collaborative work, discoveries and debates. However, there are also times where the children are quiet and reflective, spending time studying or completing independent work.

Our staff has very good knowledge of the subjects they teach and work hard to present knowledge and skills in exciting ways. They make use of outdoor opportunities, multimedia (e.g. photography, videos, YouTube clips, computer programmes) and a wide range of quality literature. Staff set up investigations, problems to solve and projects which motivate the children and foster a love of learning. Where it is possible and relevant, they combine subject areas. For example, it makes a lot of sense when we learn about rivers in geography that we link this to learning about the water cycle in science. We also make use of the local environment, for example visiting our local river as well as learning about rivers in the classroom.

Children use their writing skills to present what they have learnt in exciting and creative ways. for example writing a diary entry in role of a person experiencing The Great Fire of London, writing poetry about the changing environment because of climate change or producing a Power Point of researched facts about a country they have been studying.

The children really enjoy their work and always speak enthusiastically about what they are learning. Please see the class blogs on our school website to see what the children are learning each week.

I do hope that after two school years disrupted by Covid restrictions, we can once again enjoy having visits and visitors, concerts, sports matches, 'live' celebration assemblies, music and dance festivals. Using 'on line' platforms has served its purpose well, but I do look forward to being in spaces with the school community. Next month I will share more news from the children, and photos too!


