From The Rectory

Last month's "From the Rectory" ended with a question to which your editors felt there should be an answer. So they asked for it and here it is under the heading of

The "stranger within thy gates"

(Historically, churches have been places where sanctuary could be found by those who needed it. Here are two modern tales where shelter was sought at a church). Tale one:

Once upon a time there was a homeless man who came to a small West Devon town with all his worldly possessions. After sleeping on the town hall steps for a few days, and gratefully receiving the kindness of the town's inhabitants, he found better digs in the porch of the church. There he stayed for about two weeks, with his two suitcases and a sleeping bag. His favourite meal was fish and chips.

As time went by the Vicar and church warden grew concerned about an upcoming wedding. Although they had welcomed the man with open arms (often full of fish and chips) they really felt the bride would not wish to clamber over the man and his two suitcases in her wedding dress.

After another two weeks or so, the Vicar decided to move the suitcases into his garage while final attempts to trace his sister were made. Eventually contact was made and she phoned the Vicar. After a long conversation about the man's life, it was decided that the Vicar should open the suitcases and dispose of the contents. The sister had not seen her brother for over twenty years.

So the first suitcase was opened, and dealt with easily. There's only one place a load of smelly clothes should go. Black bag, ready for the tip.

The Vicar proceeded to open the second much heavier suitcases only to find something that immediately sent him into a crisis of shock and moral dilemma. He was very glad his wife was at work and children were at school. The suitcase was full of pornographic DVDs. Some looked rather, let's say, homemade. There was even a DVD player in there too.

The Vicar did not know what to do. "So this has been in my vestry for six weeks and in my house for another two!" he thought. He went home feeling very relieved that his ministry, his marriage and his parenting were intact, for now. That night, he waited until the children went to bed, and then he confessed to his wife, not that he had really done anything wrong. She was a little shocked that the items had been in possession at the church and rectory for so long, but after hearing the story she said, "you should hear what came into my surgery today."

Tale two:

A modern church in London had along its outer western edge a covered way where, partly sheltered by bushes, a tramp made his sleeping quarters. Let us call him Jimmy (not his real name). He was a friendly soul and he received kindnesses from parishioners as was right and proper in a Christian community. He enjoyed choir practices on Friday evenings. ("thy stranger within thy gates" appears in the King James Bible In Exodus 20, verse 10 and Deuteronomy 5, verse 14. Modern editions have translated "stranger" as "alien". That is a pity. A stranger does not have to be an alien. Our country is about to receive thousands of strangers from Afghanistan, not, we hope, to be received as aliens.)

North Tawton Cemetery – former proposal to flatten grave mounds

Some time ago the Council publicised a proposal to flatten grave mounds in the cemetery to aid the grass cutting. A number of residents contacted us as they were not happy to have their relatives graves flattened out in this way. The Council was informed about residents' concerns, and Members immediately voted unanimously to leave all existing mounds as they are. I hope this reassures affected residents. If anyone has any concerns about the management of the cemetery at any time, please contact the Town Clerks.

Forthcoming inspection of memorials/headstones in St. Peter's Churchyard and North Tawton Cemetery

Residents are advised that in accordance with its legal responsibilities NTTC will undertake a formal inspection of the churchyard and cemetery. This will take place between 4th and 15th October 2021 and will be done in accordance with the Institute of Cemetery and Crematoria Management (ICCM) training and standards.

Legislation requires Burial Authorities to carry out a range of works to memorials; however, **H&S legislation regarding dangerous memorials requires immediate action. Any memorial that is deemed a risk category 1 and therefore in danger of toppling will be immediately laid flat. This is a temporary measure.**

The Council will contact the next-of-kin regarding the memorials affected or will resolve an appropriate permanent action where no next-of-kin can be traced. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the Town Clerks.

Criminal Damage to North Tawton Memorial Park

All residents will agree as to how fortunate we are to have the Memorial Park. We were equally fortunate to have a considerable sum of money granted via local housing developments, which paid for many improvements to the park in recent years. Our skate park is well known and envied across Devon, our MUGA is a wonderful asset for a town of our size. Sadly, over a recent weekend, criminal damage was caused by a small group of teenagers who were out at 3 a.m. on a Sunday morning. They deliberately damaged a new litter bin, more seriously they broke beer bottles and spread the broken glass over the surface of the MUGA as well as other areas of the park. At the time of writing, I have not been able to find a way of clearing up all the glass, the MUGA has had to be closed and is not available for our children and young people to play on due to the very selfish actions of those responsible. The costs of sorting all this out will be in the hundreds of pounds, money which is not granted from central government, neither does it grow on trees – it comes directly out of the pockets of our hard-working residents in the form of the local council tax precept. I leave it to your imaginations as to the many other things this money could have been spent on. I have no doubt that there are those who know who was responsible. It must be of concern that four young people aged about 14, including a young girl, were out and about at 3 a.m.. If you have any information, please contact the Town Clerks.

Meanwhile, I can only apologise to those affected by the closure of the MUGA. We will re-open again as soon as we can.



Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestion – Autumn

Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestions – October

1. See if you can **create your own Wildflower and Wildlife area** somewhere - garden or verge, it doesn't matter. This is the right time of year to start if you haven't done so already. Cut the grass as short as you can and rake off the cuttings. You're aiming to take as many nutrients off the ground as possible - scarify or 'rough up' the turf as much as you can and spread a light covering of sand if you've got some. Then scatter the wildflower seeds and water them in to settle the soil – this is your last chance to do it this year (after now and it will be too cold for the seeds to germinate). Roll or tread them in if you can. You'll need to do something to protect the seeds from birds until they germinate - take care if you use netting that it doesn't trap them underneath. You can also string old cassette or video tape between bamboo canes or use recycled foil containers tied so that they flap in the wind to discourage birds.
2. During the Autumn, why not **think about food miles** again like we did last year? How far does the food on your plate travel before it gets there? Can you have at least one main meal a week where all of the ingredients have been bought (and preferably grown) locally – at least within 15 miles of your home? During the rest of the month, read the labels on packaging and find out where your regular food items come from. We should all do as much as we can to reduce our food air miles. Some family members could get a map of the World and mark on it where important food items come from.
3. If you want extra food-based activities, do you know **which of the foods you eat are organic**? Could you eat more organic foods? Could you grow more of your own next year? Use the longer evenings to look through those seed catalogues. Work out your vegetable rotations for next year to help your garden soil structure and to avoid certain pests - reducing the need for both fertiliser and chemicals.
4. When tidying your garden at the end of the season, try to compost as much as you can. Can you avoid having a bonfire this year? Maybe make a '**dead hedge**' within your garden rather than burn any woody material? More details and photographs are on the SCEnSus website.
5. Pumpkins are in season now – carve your own for Halloween and display them for the Sampford Courtenay Pumpkin Trail at the end of the month. Dry and save the seeds to grow on next year or use them in the kitchen in salads, bread or as a healthy snack. Use the Pumpkin flesh to make soup and compost what you don't use.
6. Talking of Halloween (and thinking ahead for Christmas), the shops have decorations and masks etc. for sale. Do we really need to buy them? Many are cheap, plastic items that might be fun but just add to the unnecessary plastic waste we create. Can we have as much fun making our own with bits and pieces that we have already? We can save money and do our bit to save the planet at the same time!
7. This is the ideal time of year to take hardwood cuttings of hedging plants and shrubs. They'll be slow to develop roots and shoots but it's a no-cost way to get more plants for yourself or to swap with your friends and neighbours.
