

FROM THE FAR EAST...

Well, not quite. But Seaton, where I live, does seem a long way from North Tawton and the other three villages in the group of churches where I am doing my bit to help out during this period between Vicars.

Many readers know me, and there are a few whom I have known for decades, so I don't feel like an outsider. But many will not know my name, and I have never written for "Roundabout" before. So very briefly: I am a retired Church of England priest. With my late wife we moved to Devon, where we already had friends, over ten years ago. Since being here, I have contributed my small service to several churches, when needed, and thoroughly enjoy meeting and spending time with the people who welcome me in.

The last two years have been turbulent, to say the least, for us all. For some they have been sad, even tragic. For many they have been hugely stressful - for individuals struggling to keep their job, for families unable to enjoy the times together which they had been used to, for businesses wondering whether they would survive... the list could go on. For our churches the initial prohibition to meet at all, and then the strict limitations on what we were permitted to do, were very, very painful.

And the disappointments! Last December we were planning a Christmas together in families. Yes, there were some limitations, but we looked forward to a few days of together-time. In church, we managed some carol

services, radically re-shaped from the traditional, but still a celebration of the birth of Jesus. And then the door was slammed, and mostly the family plans had to be scrapped at short notice.

As you read this, we are moving into another December, with family plans, church plans, personal plans and hopes. And (as I write this in mid-November) it does seem that the plans might actually come to pass. All the churches will have their carol services. Families will come together and enjoy food, fellowship and gifts. Rejoice! It will be a great mid-winter celebration.

But for many of us, it will be more than a celebration of a return to normality. We may have a lot of questions about the details of the story, but we will celebrate the simple fact that a baby, to be named Jesus (which means "God rescues"), was born, and that he grew up to be just about the most influential and life-changing man ever to walk the planet. I shall be doing my bit to help that celebration over the weeks. And in my heart praying that some people, who have maybe been hurting over these past two years, will find a new sense of peace and purpose.

May God's rich blessings be yours this Christmas and New Year!

Cemetery – Remembrance Day Poppies and Christmas Wreaths

May I please remind residents of the following item within the NT Cemetery Regulations: "Remembrance Day poppies and traditional Christmas wreaths may be laid, and these should be removed after a period of not more than two months." This means that if Christmas Wreaths are not removed by the end of February 2022, they will be removed by the Council, as they will have faded by this time. Any poppies or poppy wreaths will be removed at the same time. The Council wants to move towards having the Cemetery plastic free, and the Regulations will be amended to reflect this in due course. Meanwhile, we ask residents to try to obtain Christmas Wreaths that do not contain plastic, thank you.

NTTC Climate Working Group

At its ordinary meeting in September, the Council agreed to form a Climate Working Group. The former NTTC Nature Group has now been changed to be an outside independent group. However, it was considered that a small working group is still needed to progress NTTC climate initiatives, and three councillors volunteered for this. The group has held its first meeting and will be working to determine the carbon footprint of the Council as an initial task.

'A Winter like no other' - contacting the NHS

The NHS is encouraging the public to use NHS 111 online to get urgent medical advice quickly – in addition to existing services – ahead of what England's top doctor says will be a 'winter like no other'. More people are predicted to suffer from 'flu this year and hospitals are already treating an increased number of COVID-19 patients - NHS 111 offers an alternative way to get immediate medical advice. Dial 111 from your phone or go online – type 111.nhs.uk into your browser to access the online form.

EMERGENCIES – don't go via 111 but dial 999 for life-threatening medical emergencies.

Community Assets – necessary repair works

NTTC has a legal responsibility to maintain the community assets of the Town Centre Carpark, Cemetery and St. Peter's Churchyard. A structural survey was carried out in July 2021, and a number of high priority repairs and maintenance issues were identified.

(Copies of the surveys are available from the Clerks upon request.)

At its meeting on 2nd November 2021, following a tender exercise to obtain quotes for works identified by the survey, NTTC approved the appointment of suitably qualified contractors to carry out the works in the Spring of 2022 using monies held in Council reserves.

NTTC will budget for the ongoing associated high maintenance costs of these Community Assets and the Memorial Park each year, to ensure provision for future identified maintenance in accordance with an inspection regime and risk assessment.

Tree Survey and Tree Works

If you get your "Roundabout" in time – tree works will take place in the Memorial Park over the weekend of 27-28 November. An up-to-date survey has recently been undertaken for all trees for which the Council is responsible, and it is likely that further works will be necessary at various locations during 2022 – we'll keep you informed.

Snow Wardens and Grit Bins

We will assume that all existing Snow Wardens will continue to volunteer unless we hear otherwise, and we do thank you for all your help. If any of you, or indeed any resident, sees that salt is needed in any of the grit bins please contact the Town Council – thank you.

Christmas Waste and Recycling Collections

We'll put the details on our website and on our town centre noticeboard.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

And the award for 'Inspirational Speaker Who Talked About Recycling, Decluttering and a Journey to Zero Waste' (sorry – bit of a clunky title) – goes to Louise Thurlbeck. Yes, <u>you</u> Louise. It was brilliant. Simply brilliant. We are still talking about it. I am now the proud owner of a tea strainery thingy that sits perfectly in a mug alongside my tea caddy of <u>loose-leaf</u> tea. I am saving my 'stretchy' plastic and biscuit wrappers (of course I only buy one or two packets of biscuits a year) in preparation for a trip to the Co-Op in Okie. And – I am looking in to 'soap nuts' and 'eco eggs' Are you impressed? Husband thinks we're going to save loadsa money. I haven't told him (yet) that his underwear drawer is soon to be decluttered. I'm saving that for a day when he's really busy. I don't think he would share my eagerness in scattering the contents over the carpet and sorting items into a pile to keep and a pile to go. No. He needs to be heavily occupied with his impact driver/ post knocker/rotavator on that particular day.

Back to Louise. Her journey to zero waste took her through every room in the house looking at how she could do things differently thereby reducing waste – with an emphasis on avoiding plastic. Starting in the kitchen – she uses Pyrex containers with lids for freezing and reheating food. The family will also take a container to buy their takeaway food thus avoiding the need to bring home polystyrene/plastic boxes. Want to cut down on the amount of kitchen roll you use? Louise puts hers at the back of a cupboard so it's difficult to get at – and uses a washable cloth instead. She now buys ONE kitchen roll a year. She lines her cake tins with re-usable liner – wipe it clean after baking and, like Louise's, it could last you five years. Use inner packets from cereal boxes to freeze food rather than buying freezer bags. Moving into the bathroom – Louise uses shampoo bars, 'naked soap' and natural or crystal deodorants. Cleaning products consist of white vinegar, lemon juice or bicarbonate of soda. All simple swops that are reducing plastic and waste.

Couldn't not mention Christmas as even the festive celebration hasn't escaped Louise's journey to zero waste. For Louise it's all about home made edibles and drinks, wrapped in brown paper, tissue paper or a pretty scarf that can then be used by the recipient. A quick look at decluttering – using the contents of President Jan's sock drawer for demonstration purposes – brought our inspirational session to a close. Want to know more? Get a copy of 'Spark Joy' by Marie Kondo – An Illustrated Master Class on the Art of Organizing and Tidying Up. Not sure if it covers sheds full of 'that'll come in 'andy' stuff.

Apparently our W.I. Christmas party is looming. It only feels like a couple of months since the last one. I think someone nicked August and September when I wasn't looking. Time to dig out my compilation of mince pie recipes. I have 32. You may well ask if 32 different recipes are really necessary and I would look at you in a scornful and disdainful way and say 'yes they are'. I would then put the oven on and bake another dozen just to make a point. Husband would then sigh and tell me that he'll help me out by eating a few every day as he cannot bear to see me looking scornful and disdainful. (I don't think he knows what 'disdainful' means but that's irrelevant).

And finally. A quick thank you. To our fabulous W.I. You're the best. Happy Christmas to you all. May your fairy lights survive Christmas without so much as a flicker.

Oh – and one more quick thank you. To husband. For being a never-ending source of material for my W.I. Ramblings. Have another mince pie. *Sue Knott*





From the Parish Records

Not many folk climb up into the organ gallery at St. Peter's Church in North Tawton and perhaps even those who do pay no attention to the wooden panel on its northern wall which tells of an ancient act of charity:

"1826. William Clapp of the city of Exeter gentleman by his will dated 27th December 1821 gave to John Blackall Doctor of Physic and Pitman Jones Solicitor the capital stock of 200£ 3% Consolidated Bank Annuities upon Trust for ever yearly on 1st Sunday after Christmas Day to apply the net dividend thereof in purchase of Bread or Fuel or both and to distribute the same amongst such of the poor parishioners of the several parishes of St. Petroc, North Tawton and Monkokehampton (in the proportion of one third to each parish) as the respective vicars curates or other officiating ministers for the time being of the same three parishes should think the fittest and most deserving of charity."

Today, we live in a welfare state which in theory offers support to the poorest of its citizens. It is sobering to think that in 1826 there were citizens so wretchedly placed that their pride would not have stood in the way of accepting this rare seasonal help.

The words "in theory" are a reminder that in our day of the twenty-first century there are those for whom need remains despite the provisions of our welfare state. Many thanks to those who have continued to offer support through the Food Bank operating in Okehampton during the past year. The box in the porch of St. Peter's in North Tawton remains in place for contributions and Christmas is a good time to think of others as William Clapp did in the past. We don't have to wait until we make a will. The food box is there. (see page 32)

William must have had associations with the three parishes mentioned and been a successful "gentleman" to have willed such a sum. £200 was worth a great deal more in 1826 than now. It would be interesting to know for how long his executors were able to continue following his wishes and what happened for the bequest to end. The Vicar at St. Peter's (before he moved to Oxfordshire) assured me he was no longer obliged to pick out the "fittest and most deserving of charity" on the Sunday after Christmas day. He and we can be grateful he was spared that task.



We did dig this year! Although with temperatures now heading down towards the minus mark, our two weeks in the sun seems like a long time ago. Despite being a smaller than usual group we managed to get a surprising amount done. The director was pleased, and that isn't easy!! Nor did we lose any days to the rain. The Health and Safety person did have to exert her authority on one occasion because it was so hot. Had to call a water and shade break on the last day when we were trying to get everything put away and covered up. Packing up is hard to do. Tents need taking down and the trench needs to be covered to discourage weeds and try to prevent damage from deer and other animals over the winter. Now we have finds to sort and all the drawings and photos to sort and the director must write the Interim.

We had fewer finds than usual this year but did find interesting walls.

That is an interesting wall (right) You will have to take my word for it. It has a lot of plaster facing it and it is good to find that still in place.





We also had a mystery object. (left)

This was removed with a lot of soil around it to keep it from breaking up. Later excavation of the soil and metal suggests some sort of mudguard or similar, perhaps from an old tractor. Some digs get chariot burials, we get old tractors.

We also managed an AGM at the beginning of November. Last year we didn't even try but this year a few of us met in person, socially distanced, and we Zoomed the meeting to others. It went very well. We

now have a new Secretary which is great as the last one had done the job for 15 years and needed time to research pottery instead. We planned our work for the year and set dig dates. All this information will be on our website as soon as we can get it there. As an example, we have the Dartmoor National Park archaeologist Andy Crabb as our Archaeology Adviser now, and we hope to be doing some interesting work on Dartmoor under his guidance and working with other groups on the moor. Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Suggestions

By the time you read this, the COP26 Conference outcomes will be known – hopefully with commitments made on a global scale and intending to keep that all-important global warming figure as low as it needs to be. The SCEnSus monthly suggestions have been 'spot on' as the issues that we've all been encouraged to focus on are the same ones that are now being circulated nationally! So, as we move towards Christmas, the suggestions are:



1. **Recycle and Re-use:** In the lead up to Christmas, can you re-use your existing decorations or make new ones using what you've already got... or make your own from recycled materials, including plastics? The challenge is not to buy any new decorations this year! Did you know that tinsel and foil wrapping paper can't be recycled so it's better to use it time and time again rather than throw it away and send it to landfill? *Certainly don't buy any new ones like this!*

2. Is it really better to have a **real tree** ... or an artificial tree that you use year after year? You might want to debate this issue within the family or with your friends! If you have a fresh one, make sure you 'recycle' it – goats love to eat them (apparently!) so watch for details of where and when to drop yours off in Sampford Courtenay in the New Year.

- 3. For December and afterwards, Shop locally where you can save travel miles as well as supporting local businesses
- 4. Shop 'long lasting' and 'natural' clothes, toys, household items, whatever. These are good rules to follow!

5. Woodburner or open fire - If you have one of these, make sure that you have adequate supplies of dry, seasoned wood to burn and try to reduce your use of firelighters. Sweep your chimney regularly to reduce chemicals and particles in the atmosphere as well as to keep your chimney safe.

	Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus - 2022 New Year's Resolution Checklist and Progress Chart Last year we set you the challenge of reviewing what we can all do within our homes to keep our carbon footprint to a minimum. Let's have another look to see how we're doing. If you did the checklist last year, have another look to see where you improved things and what the priorities need to be for 2022. Put this checklist where you can <u>all</u> see it and use it to keep track of your progress. Mark an action Red if you haven't started it or haven't even thought about it yet. A priority for 2022? Mark it Amber if you've started work on this but there's still some way to go Mark it Green if you 've completed this/ been doing it for some time. If so, Well done and keep going. Even if you don't live in Sampford Courtenay, have a go and see how you're doing!	Red/ Amber- Green 2021 Where were we at the start of last year? 1	Do you need better loft insulation or double glazing? There might be grants available to you		
2	Are <u>all</u> the light bulbs in your house low energy?		
3	Can you turn down your heating, even by 2 degrees C and wear those jumpers that you've got lurking in your wardrobe instead? Can you do your washing at 30C rather than 40C?		
4	Can you share your car travel with someone else and reduce the number of car journeys that you make to work or to the shops? Can you 'save' at least one journey each week? Think twice before doing short 'single occupancy' car trips as these are the least fuel efficient journeys. <i>Vehicle transport makes up 25% of UK carbon emissions.</i>		
5	Can you cycle, walk or catch a bus rather than drive a car sometimes – and more than you would usually do? Can you use our new local train service now that we've got it?		
6	How much food do you throw away in your house? If you're tempted by 'Buy one, get one free' offers - do you always use it all? Does <u>all</u> your food waste <u>always</u> go in the compost, not in black bags and end up in landfill and producing lethal methane gas?		
7	Can you buy more organic food to promote soil health – foods grown without use of fertilisers and cultivation methods that break down soil structure and other chemicals (particularly pesticides) which harm wildlife?		
8	Can you stop or reduce the use of chemicals such as bleach, cleaning products and sprays? Do you use microfibre cloths and water to avoid using chemicals and having those hard to recycle containers that they come in?		
9	How can you get everyone in your house to be more 'environmentally aware'? Identify some climate house rules such as closing doors to keep heat in, turning down thermostats in rooms not used very often, not running taps any longer than is necessary, looking at ways to re-use, recycle and re-purpose (particularly if this means not buying something new). Is there someone in your house (preferably the youngest person in the house) who could be the 'climate lookout' or 'chief nagger' when other people forget or get it wrong!		
10	How much of what your family throws away goes to landfill? How many black bags each week? How can you reduce the number of bags that go in the bin lorry? Set a target one less a fortnight by (date)		
11	If you eat out and 'on the go', are the food and drink containers that you had single use and, if so, are they recyclable?		
12	New Year sales – as tempting as they are, buy only what you need!
