From The Rectory

The onset of winter and the thought of cloudy, rainy, chilly days do not warm the heart. But the wonderful news that our family in Singapore is able to come and spend Christmas and New Year with us, together with the rest of our family, certainly gives me more than a glow! It has been two and a half years since we have all been able to get together and at long last Singapore has relaxed the restrictions on leaving and entering the country.

Just like everyone else, the Covid-19 pandemic was a bit of a rollercoaster for the Bullworthy family. We had big plans for 2020 – visiting our family in Singapore and going on to Western Australia for a holiday with them. But it was not to be. There were lots of very serious things about Covid, but in terms of our mental health, not being able to be close and be together was one of the worst.

On one particular gloomy day, when I was feeling down and doing some essential shopping, I was greeted at the entrance of the supermarket by a display of sunflowers. They immediately made me smile, my spirits lifted, and since then I've been thinking a lot about sunflowers. Now don't mock pondering plants! In 1 Kings 4:33 we read that King Solomon 'spoke about plant life, from the cedar of Lebanon to the hyssop that grows out of walls'. (Incidentally, he couldn't have spoken about sunflowers because they originated in South America and were only brought to Europe in the sixteenth century.) Jesus himself took the garden mustard plant and created a parable (Matthew 13:31–32) and in Luke 12:27 Jesus said, 'Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these'. But sunflowers are especially appealing, and it didn't take me long to think of four aspects of them that spoke to me.

First, sunflowers are *cheerful*. There's something about that disc of brilliant primary colour yellow that lifts the spirits. Possibly it's because sunflowers look like the sun – or at least every child's drawing of the sun – and I suspect quite a few of us need sunlight to lift our spirits. Indeed, we can quite understand why the depressive artist Vincent van Gogh was drawn to painting them. Of course, it's not always easy being cheerful but we can choose to be cheerful, happy and optimistic instead of grumpy, gloomy, miserable and pessimistic. Let us try and be sunflowers, not weeping willows!

Second, sunflowers are *conspicuous*. It's not just the colour of sunflowers that makes them so striking; it's the fact that they can easily be tall enough to tower over you. Most flowers you look down on;

sunflowers you look up to. In fact if you grow sunflowers you may end up not simply blessing your own garden but your neighbours' too! I think there's another lesson here: it's all too easy to stay concealed. We may not reach the height that some sunflowers do but, short or tall, it's important that we let our light shine. Remember: even short people can stand tall (and I have first-hand experience of that!). Let's learn from the sunflower to stand up and let what we stand for be seen.

Third, sunflowers are *considerate*. You may think of sunflowers as an ornament for a garden but of course they are a major crop plant. Sunflowers provide seeds for food and vitamins, oil for cooking and I'm told you can even make insulation out of those enormous stalks. In thinking about the use of sunflowers, let's remember it's not only humans who benefit from them but birds and insects too. Sunflowers are not just bold and big; they are also a blessing. Let us be a blessing to others as well.

Finally, sunflowers *centre on the sun*. They have the remarkable ability – absent from most other plants – of being able to move. Their flowers and upper leaves track the sun, and when the sun sets in the evening they rotate their heads back to face the east to await the warmth of the morning sun's rays. It's clever stuff! Sunflowers soak up all of the sun's rays for warmth and light. They depend on the sun to make their food so they can keep growing. But what about those cloudy days? Get this: sunflowers will turn and face another sunflower! Looking to each other for support until they can once again see the sun.

There's a lesson here for us. We should be those who, at the start of the day, are found facing towards God the Son – Jesus – and who during the course of the day continue to keep our eyes fixed on him (Hebrews 12:2). And on those cloudy days look to each other for support and encouragement but remember, as St Francis of Assisi prayed, 'In giving we receive.'

Rain or shine, may you, like me, be inspired by sunflowers and may we all continue to look at the Son.

Free Business Directory for all businesses and organisations in North Tawton

The Council has secured grant funding to set up a Business Directory on our website. This will eventually be published as an A5 booklet, which will also include the local Emergency Plan, and will be distributed to all households within the Parish. Entries are completely free of charge, please note that we can only accept applications for entry from organisations within the Parish of North Tawton.

What you need to do:

- Compose your entry for the Directory – this can be up to 250 words. Think about what you want people to know – e.g. if you are a club, are there criteria for joining and what is the cost, if you are a shop what are your opening times, what do you sell, is there something really special about your business that you want to tell people about? Include your contact details; there is space for two alternative phone numbers, plus a mobile number, email address, and website or social media address.
- There is also a space for your organisation's logo if you have one, or for a photo.
- Once you have everything ready, go to the Council's website, northtawtontowncouncil@gov.uk, where there is a link from the front page to the business directory page. Choose which category your organisation fits into, and you can then enter all your information and details. When your application has been submitted, it is automatically emailed to the Town Clerks for approval and publication on the website. You can notify us of changes at any time and we can edit your entry.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to advertise free of charge on our website and eventually to reach every household in North Tawton when the Directory is published as a booklet and distributed. If you have any queries or problems with submitting your entry, please contact the Town Clerks.

Durant Trust

There will be a meeting of the Durant Trust at the end of November, at which time the Trustees will consider applications from organisations for projects which will benefit the residents of North Tawton. Application forms are available on our website, there is a link from the homepage, or by contacting the Town Clerks. The deadline for applications is Friday 19th November 2021. The forms must be completed in full and submitted with all the required supporting information.

Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for year ending 31 March 2021

Each year the Council's finances and procedures are examined by an internal auditor. A report and relevant information is then sent to an external auditor appointed by the government. All relevant information is examined and a report is then issued. The Conclusion of Audit report for the year in question was satisfactory and the auditors did not identify any items requiring further action. The accounts and associated documents are all published on our website. Local Government electors in the parish of North Tawton can obtain or view copies of the AGAR, please contact the Assistant Clerk/ RFO, Mrs M Bickell.

Council Vacancies

At the time of writing (13 October) we have 3 vacancies on the Council. Applications for co-option to the first of these will be on the agenda for our November meeting. We will be advertising for applications for co-option to the other two vacancies – check our noticeboard and website for more information. Are you interested in local issues, do you want to get involved in your community, can you spare a few hours a month? If so, please consider applying – you don't need any special qualifications, all relevant training is provided free of charge (which at the moment is all done online via Zoom) and you will get all the support you need from existing members of the Council, and from the Clerks.



North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Right then – let’s get this over with.

Q. Where would you weigh a whale?

A. In a ‘whale-weigh’ station

That had nothing to do with me. I’ll give you just one guess as to who is responsible for that. And as a matter of fact, he’s still laughing. I’ve had to put up with this since our W.I. meeting, which was three days ago. Can you feel my pain?

Calling Iceland. Come in Iceland. And aided by the miracle of technology he was there. On the wall of the rugby club. Looking straight back at us. Karl O’Neill is the son of Maria (one of our members) and he works for Laki tours as a tour guide and for the next hour he held us spellbound as he talked us through the different species of whale you might encounter when you experience a Laki tour. Accompanied by beautiful photographs, Karl gave us stunningly detailed descriptions of minke whales, humpback whales, sperm whales and killer whales not just in terms of how they look but also how they behave. Karl explained that the Snaefellsnes peninsula, on the western side of Iceland, is one of the best areas for whale watching and they regularly see several species of whale on a single tour.

Back to the detail – did you know that individual killer whales can be identified by the pattern of notches on their dorsal fin? And by sharing the identifying photographs globally it has been possible to track a whale and see where it goes. It was as a result of dorsal fin identification that they were able to tell that one particular killer whale was spending its summer holiday off the coast of Scotland. Moving on to sperm whales (average length 16 metres) – they are incredible divers. A sperm whale can hold its breath for up to 90 minutes and can dive to depths of up to 3km. A similar method of identification can be used by recording photographs of the ridges and ragged edges of their tail line. One particular sperm whale was recorded as being last seen in Iceland in 2017 only to turn up off the Caribbean Island of Martinique – probably there to breed.

And another little-known fact? The arctic fox is the only indigenous mammal in Iceland – (it must like it there as it’s hung around since the last Ice Age). Sadly, it was time to wave goodbye to Karl, but it was very clear that his audience had enjoyed every minute – we’d had a whale of a time. (feel free to groan – I did)

Our November speaker will be talking about a subject that is pretty important to everyone – recycling. I’m also hoping for inspiration on how to deal with ‘decluttering’. And, more importantly, how to deal with a husband whose favourite catchphrase is “ ‘ang on to that, it might come in ‘andy”.

And finally. We’re having a snack in an Exeter hostelry. Just a quick snack whilst I brace myself for a visit to Machine Mart (new racking for one of his sheds) and Screwfix (an impact driver) and he leans towards me, points at the food and whispers in my ear – ‘this would’ve been much cheaper at ‘ome’. I know, I think it was meant to be a compliment about my cooking – wasn’t it?

OKEHAMPTON BEE KEEPERS

Okehampton Beekeepers are running a Beekeeping Training Course of eight evening sessions. These will be at Whiddon Down Village Hall, from 7 to 9 p.m. on Alternate Wednesday evenings from January 19th through to April 27th next year (2022). The course costs £100, payable in advance at the initial session on January 19th. This includes a free copy of the excellent BBKA textbook, The BBKA Guide to Beekeeping (normally costs £18.99) plus one year's (2022) Registered (Full) membership of DBKA (which would cost £39), including Bee Disease Insurance for up to 3 colonies and monthly copies of the Devon Beekeepers' magazine, 'Beekeeping' and also monthly delivery of BBKA News. The course will follow the syllabus required for the BBKA Basic Assessment and course students are encouraged to take the Basic Assessment once they have completed the course and have kept bees for their first year.

Course session dates are fortnightly, on alternate Wednesdays, as follows: January 19th, February 2nd, February 16th, March 2nd, March 16th, March 30th, April 13th and April 27th. A number of informal follow-up practical sessions in May and June will give the opportunity to handle and inspect colonies of bees, putting into practice knowledge learnt during the course. Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestions – November

None of us can have escaped the **need for urgent action by us all** – at global, country, community, household and individual level - to do something to help the environmental and climate change situation. We hear about global warming, the loss of habitats and named species, the disposal of waste (particularly plastic and its effect on landfill sites and our oceans)... the list goes on. Can we, hand on heart, say that we're doing as much as we can to protect things for future generations? This isn't the place for a lengthy list of things to do and it could very quickly become political but, at the very least, we all need to do some soul searching to make sure that we are comfortable about the carbon footprint that we are creating.... and leaving for others. Take some time this month to find out more about the situation and identify practical steps that you and those around you can take. The United **Nations Climate Change Conference (COP26)** will take place in Glasgow between the 1st and 12th of this month. What is decided there is critical to keep the goal of global warming at 1.5C within reach. Watch and listen to what comes from the Conference and decide what you can do to play your part. It's all too easy to leave it to others. The time to effect the necessary change really is running out.

Single-use plastics. Many of you will be aware that this has been a focus of one of our SCEnSus displays recently. Can you avoid buying any 'unnecessary' plastic items for the remainder of this year (Christmas decorations included!) and can you buy things in re-usable or compostable packaging wherever possible?

Thinking ahead to Christmas, if you are the 'Crafty' sort, could you make some **Christmas decorations** using recycled or left-over materials to sell on the Stall in the Square or on the SCEnSus stall at the 'Come, buy and chat' event on Saturday 20th November in the Village Hall.

Many people have a **bonfire** at this time of year, either for Bonfire night or just to tidy up the garden. Burning releases carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. Can you avoid having one this year? Maybe make a '**dead hedge**' within your garden rather than burn any woody material? More details and photographs are on the SCEnSus website. Black History Month at North Tawton School

October is the month in which schools all over the country focus specifically on sharing the lives, experiences and achievements of people from black and ethnic minority cultures and traditions. This is something we have done and shall continue to make more prolific in our curriculum at North Tawton Primary School throughout the year. It is particularly important in an area such as North Tawton, where there is less diversity in our community, to make sure that the children are intentionally taught about the lives of people similar to and different from themselves. At the beginning of October, I told the children we would be learning about important people who have changed the world for the better. I asked the children to draw what an important person who has made history might look like. The children had some time to think about this and draw what they might look like. I then asked what kind of person they had drawn: male or female: older than me or younger than me; a person from a very long time ago, or someone living now, and if their person had light skin like mine or darker? The vast majority of children drew very old, white men from long ago. While there are many white men from long ago who have been important people in history, I told them that this month we would be learning about lots of different kinds of people who have contributed to world history. This was an interesting activity as it showed us that even with a diverse curriculum, certain stereotypes and assumptions exist, even in our youngest children. We have more work to do! Across the school, the staff have been making sure we select books and resources which feature a wide range of people both from long ago and from recent times too. Specifically, we have made sure we feature successful women and people from black and minority groups.

In our school assemblies and class lessons this term, we have shared the stories of civil rights leaders Nelson Mandela and Martin Luther King, learnt about Barack Obama and Michelle Obama, and admired the sporting prowess of Simone Biles, Usain Bolt and Mo Farah. I read a book by one of my childhood favourites Floella Benjamin which tells the story of her immigration from Trinidad to England to meeting the Queen!

Throughout their time at North Tawton Primary School, the children will be learning about women and men from different cultures, countries and traditions and the contributions they have made to the world. Two of my heroes are Yvonne Conolly who became Britain's first female black head teacher in 1969 and Betty Campbell the first Welsh black head teacher who began the Black History Month tradition. I look to these two leaders for strength and inspiration as I champion equality, diversity and inclusion at North Tawton and across all of my work as a Dartmoor Trust leader.





At Finch Foundry, the guided tours have been going really well but we then, like so many places, hit some staff shortages and had to close for a few days. Thankfully, as Finch is staying on the booking system, we were able to let people know in advance and those who turned up were still able to enjoy the outside spaces and take advantage of the very excellent local walks, shop, café and pub.

The unexpected highlight and star of the show at Lydford Gorge is the second hand bookshop which opened in April. It is proving to be a big hit with locals and visitors alike and we are very grateful to the lovely people who have turned up with donations of books. The team there is also loving sharing tales of the huge variety of wildlife that call Lydford home and I joined them at the Meldon Wildlife Festival recently which was such a joy to be part of.

Finally, to Castle Drogo. It was a bit of a shock to be so busy again! It took us a bit of time to get used to seeing so many people. I would like to say a big thank you to all our neighbours for their patience on the lanes and directing people who have trusted their Sat Nav instead of the evidence before their eyes. Thanks to some very patient people giving directions, visitors have found their way to us and it has brought a lot of joy to be able to share this wonderful place again.

You will soon notice the return of an old friend to Drogo when a section of scaffolding goes up on the south west side of the castle this Autumn. As part of the monitoring checks of the work completed during the 8 year project, we discovered a section of pointing that hadn't cured as required and subsequently couldn't stand up to the Dartmoor weather. Beginning this autumn, a team of Stonemasons will undertake the repairs of this section. The remedial work comprises the raking out of the joints in the defective areas to a depth of 75mm and then repointing in two coats of hydraulic lime mortar. It is projected to take 8 – 12 weeks to complete and extra care will be taken over the cure of the mortar after it is placed to ensure the issue isn't repeated. Access to the inside of the Castle will not be affected and we will remain open throughout October.


