### Not from The Rectory

Long Lost Families

Most of us, of course, know who our mothers are, but some children don't. They are those who were separated from their mothers a few days or weeks after birth. They were adopted by other adults and sometimes reached adulthood before discovering that the parents with whom they grew up were not their natural parents. Learning that must have been a shock and you can understand how many of them wondered both why they were put up for adoption and what had happened to their natural parents? During my lifetime and for a considerable time before that, there was a social stigma attached to a woman having a child out of wedlock. If the father of the child was unable or unwilling to marry, young women might look to their family for help. The social stigma was such that the mother-to-be could be discreetly hidden from public notice until after the birth, when, with the social stigma avoided by the adoption of her child, she might return to her normal family life. Until quite recently, the law covering adoption prevented the child from finding out who was the natural mother. Even now, there are understandable safeguards about seeking information. If a natural mother can be located, the existence of a child unknown of in her present family circle has the potential to be embarrassing. For contact to take place between child and the natural mother, the wishes of both have to be obtained. There will need to be consideration of how relationships with their current families may be affected and also how relations with the adopted parents can be managed. Until quite recently, the law also prevented a mother tracing her adopted child. There are mothers who must have wondered for years if the decision to have a child

adopted was the right thing for that child. How harrowing to be prevented from knowing how the child has fared. How worrying too, the thought that the child, if contacted, will harbour feelings of rejection for love to flow. The world has need of both. the natural mother. What a burden of stress for a

mother to carry – often for the rest of her life. Unravelling separations between mothers and adopted children requires much delicate negotiation. Some insight into the successful process is featured in the television programme "Long Lost Families". Mothers now in their sixties and seventies have been shown meeting the child they last saw aged six or eight weeks. Adopted children, now with families of their own, have been able to meet a natural mother, if she is still alive, or, failing that, discover they have "new" half brothers and sisters and their families. Sometimes it has meant travelling half way round the world for a meeting. Sometimes, they have lived within walking distance without knowing.

We do not know how many mothers and children, when offered the chance to meet each other years later in their lives, have chosen not to, preferring not to know. They do not figure in the television programme. Their preference not to know must be respected. But the programme does show how reconciling for both mother and child it can be to unlock the burden of not knowing. Those willing to take the risk of finding out why it happened to them and to share it with each other can find relief. Love, cut short in the first weeks after birth, can be rekindled despite the passage of time. First meetings, even on camera, show immediate embraces and often tears of reconciliation. In our March edition, I praised the televised team of "The Repair Shop" for dealing so sympathetically with each other and the strangers who take items into their barn for repair. It seems to me that here, in "Long Lost Families", is another television programme where the presenters also show an example of a similar worth. It is in keeping with the second new commandment given by Jesus Christ (quoted in March) that we should show love to our neighbours in the same way we wish to have love shown to us by them.

Love has the power to reconcile. Reconciling allows

#### North Tawton Annual Town Meeting – Thursday 28 April 2022, 7.30 pm, North Tawton Town Hall

The Annual Town Meeting will be held in the Town Hall on 28 April. Residents will recall that we had an informal Town Meeting in September. We were unable to hold the usual meeting earlier in the year due to Covid restrictions. For those who are not aware I advise that this is NOT a Town Council meeting (we just organise it for you) it is a meeting for all residents of the parish. You're invited to come along and find out more information about various issues. You can ask questions, and there will be consultations on some proposed initiatives. I'll publish the full agenda in due course, but I can advise that our new local D.C.C. Highways Officer will be attending. He is very keen to meet residents and find out what is important to you. Please come along if you can – it's as informal as possible, and tea/coffee and biscuits will be provided on arrival.

#### North Tawton Housing Needs Survey

A huge thank you to everyone who returned a completed survey form – we had an excellent response rate. The forms are being analysed by our contractor. The aim is to identify trends to help us do what we can in influencing future housing policy and responding effectively to planning consultations. We had a number of enquiries about workshop/storage units. We'll issue information in due course in response to this. A number of residents expressed concerns as to the use of first-class stamps on the reply envelopes – we wanted to pay for the replies as this encourages a greater response, which has proved to be the case; we used first class as second-class post is unreliable, and finally <u>I advise that the cost of the printing and postage of surveys has been funded by an external organisation, not by NTTC.</u> We will inform residents of the results of the survey in due course and thank you again for your co-operation with this project.

#### **Clock Tower**

The Clock Tower is due to be cleaned at some time in the next couple of months. We hope this will be done before the Platinum Jubilee weekend as we will be putting a new plaque on the base of the tower to commemorate the Jubilee.

**Please Note** – the cleaning project will involve putting up scaffolding around the tower. This will obviously mean the seats won't be available for a couple of days, but the bus stop will remain clear. We may have to ask residents to leave the car parking spaces clear as well, and I do apologise for any inconvenience this will cause – again, it will only be for a couple of days at the most. Hopefully we will then see the tower in all its original glory!

#### Street lights and Car Park lights – some information

I've had several queries about the lighting column at the junction of Butts Way and Gostwyck Close, which was removed some time ago – D.C C. has advised this is due to be replaced, no timescale, I'm afraid.

Town Centre car park lights – ongoing problems since the storms, I apologise but our electrician is doing his best and I'm confident it will all be back in working order soon.

The vintage style lighting columns around The Square are due to be completely replaced by the D.C.C. lighting team at some point in the new financial year. They have apparently come to the end of their life and are not worth repainting.

#### **Strawberry Fields Shrub Beds**

At the time of writing most of the work is now complete, there are some more plants to go in when they arrive and we are also looking at improvements to the small grass triangle adjacent to the pavement as you go into Strawberry Fields. I drove past this morning and thought it looked great, and most certainly a huge improvement – I hope residents will be pleased, particularly as this project was paid for entirely from external grant aid.

#### Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestion – April

Life certainly has it's challenges at the moment and there's plenty to get up tight about. Growing your own food has many positive points – the 'therapy' of planting in the first place, watching your seeds sprout and grow, the thrill of harvesting produce and all whilst saving money along the way – especially if some of what you grow will produce extra seeds or tubers (e.g. potatoes) that you can use to grow another crop next year. How's that for both value for money and forward thinking?

April is a busy month for gardeners of all kinds – those with heated propagators or greenhouses will be well underway potting up seedlings that started to grow a while ago. For everyone else and, importantly, for beginners, April is the ideal month to get started and to plant seeds in pots outside your home, on your window sill or even straight into the ground as the weather warms up – but remember to protect your tender plants if we're likely to get an overnight frost.

If you haven't grown anything much before but want to have a go, here are a few suggestions: Try big 'pots' (recycled buckets or any large container with drainage holes filled with compost) by your doorway or in a yard with a couple of garden canes and plant some runner beans, Swiss/ 'Rainbow' chard, beetroot, salad leaves or nasturtiums (add the flowers to a salad) for a useful as well as colourful display. Make sure the beans and nasturtiums 'climb' by training them around the canes, tying them with string at intervals if necessary. Remember that you'll need to water them daily once they're growing and when (if?) we get continuous hot weather.

Plant hanging baskets with trailing tomatoes or strawberries for an edible and colourful alternative to flowers.

Grow peas and beans (broad, runner or french beans) – grow more than you need and save some at the end of the season and dry them to be used next year. Plant them in a container or directly in the soil in a sunny place against a wall or trellis.

Get together with some friends and share the cost of buying seeds; ask keen gardeners for any spare home-saved seeds or surplus young plants that they might have that you can grow.

Enjoy researching what you can grow that you know you'll enjoy preparing and eating.

If you're into old wives tales, traditions and/or superstitions, find out why potatoes are (were?) believed to be best planted on Good Friday ... and maybe put a couple in the ground or in a pot for yourself on Friday April 15<sup>th</sup> and see what happens.

Get competitive – with your children, friends, neighbours ... anyone! Who can grow the tallest bean, the heaviest potato or tomato, the largest or longest whatever ... consider entering the Sampford Courtenay Produce Show (see page 31 for a list of classes).

So, April's here .... get going .... and get growing!

The recent withdrawal from a concert programme in Wales of a Symphony by Tchaikovsky has drawn criticism in the national press. Perhaps the concert promoters feared loss of income from concert goers. Whatever the reason, it seems a strange thing to do. It is difficult to associate Tchaikovsky (1840 –1893) with the action of a Russian government whose "military exercises" have spilled across the border into Ukraine in 2022. Celia Olsson (see page 21) argues the case for realising the Orthodox Church is not only to be associated with what we may think of as the Russian Orthodox Church. It is a mistake to assume that everyone in Russia supports the current Russian policy in Ukraine. Among those who don't may lie the future of a very different foreign policy in Russia. For that we may hope.

Long established works of Art and forms of Christian worship which have come out of Russia are likely to outlive the present Russian government (or indeed any government anywhere else). Let us recognise their value to the international community by keeping faith with their contributions to the world, even if our interest in them is not direct and even if they are under attack elsewhere. *Richard Edwards*

**Storm Eunice** – SCPC support for parishioners left without power, and lessons learnt for the future. – Cllr. Wilson (9 feedback replies to date) Cllr. Wilson – thanked all Councillors and volunteers who had helped support parishioners during the extended Power Outage during Storm Eunice. She also thanked the Village Hall for allowing its use as a "warm" haven, and place to recharge batteries etc. Free of Charge. #### **Facing our Fears**

The news from the Ukraine is not good, but neither should we be shocked by it. It has been developing for a long time, for we have known of Putin's style and intention for years. With economic trouble at home in Russia he needs a diversion away from domestic problems, in the same way that the president of Argentine, General Leopoldo Galtieri used diversionary tactics from his problems when he invaded the Falklands.

Western democracies have shied away from positive action for too long, but whatever our future action there must be a moral basis for British foreign policy. It is important to recall what Winston Churchill said the House of Commons at the outbreak of war on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 1939.

"This moral conviction alone affords that ever-fresh resilience which renews the strength and energy of people in long, doubtful, and dark days. Outside, the storms of war may blow and the lands may be lashed with the fury of its gales, but in our own hearts this Sunday morning there is peace. Our hands may be active, but our consciences are at rest."

Admittedly, we are not at war with Russia, (yet) but it is a fact of human existence that there are wars and there will be wars. Let me quote someone else:

"You will hear of wars and rumours of wars but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginnings of birth pains."

Jesus of Nazareth (Matthew 24:6-8)

It is not for God's people to speculate and find answers to every problem which challenges our daily lives. We may discuss, argue, or lobby those who carry the burden of decision making, but no matter how terrifying the vision, the first step towards lasting faith is not to become overwhelmed or paralysed by fear. Rather, we need to face our difficulties in belief and confront our nagging doubts. Because if we allow them to stay in our peripheral vision, they become shadowy "bogeymen" and end up gnawing away at our faith.

If, on the other hand, we turn to face our doubts and fears, and do so with humble prayer, then something truly miraculous happens – God works within us, purging us of fear and bringing us through integrity to a fuller, deeper, more peaceful faith.

More Truth offered to the parishioners of St. Goran and St. Michael, Caerhayes in the Diocese of Truro.

The first casualty of war is truth. Before a shot is fired, a bomb dropped, or a tank moved, truth disappears out of the window. We have recently witnessed President Putin trying to justify his war by false accusations, fabrications and lies about the conditions of the Ukrainian people.

When facing execution Jesus said he was witness to the truth. Pontius Pilate the politician said, "What is truth?" More with sneering contempt than a question.

Truth is always costly because it involves sacrifice, pain and at least some discomfort. It is there with suffering. Dishonesty is always closely involved with temptation because it offers a quick fix to most demanding and difficult problems. This is why so many people easily slide into a sort of deceitful behaviour without any careful thought, a knee-jerk reaction involving self-preservation. Yet sticking to the truth will often involve a short period of pain and sacrifice, or at least some inconvenience and loss of face before truth will eventually win.

We say and believe that 'God is Truth.' The bible uses the word 'truth' 228 times (my New International Version) which highlights its importance. Surely truth matters to individuals as well as the whole of a society, country, or world. Being truthful means that everyone can grow and mature, learning from their mistakes. It means for a society, a country or world truthfulness makes social bonds, whereas lying and hypocrisy break them.

A church community has to set an example and model for others. Traditionally Lent has been a season of self-examination, discipline and growth, but these days it would be better to think about what is happening outside church walls and clearly make a stand for truth and holiness. It will be costly, as it was for Jesus, but then we are called to follow. Aren't we?

So, if God is truth, then we must have the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. Anything less is blasphemy.
