

Not from The Rectory

We are spoilt for choice nowadays by the choice of programmes we can access on our televisions, but there are few which excite a sense of anticipation in me. One which does is "The Repair Shop". In a Sussex barn a group of highly skilled craft workers can be seen at their business. They have a wide variety of skills. The "Bear Ladies" (which sounds badly on the voice-over until you realise they specialise in repairing dolls) are happy to receive teddy bears. There is Steve with the mechanical insights from being a clock repairer, but always happy to be faced with anything mechanical, especially if he has never seen an object like it before. Steve's sister, Susie, works with leather and relishes restoring old briefcases, saddles and upholstery for chairs. There is Will who makes battered and broken wooden articles look like new and there are other workmates who it seems can be imported to repair and restore any unusual item brought into the barn requiring their specialist treatment.

The counter balance to this haven of skills is provided by members of the public who bring in their broken belongings to leave for repair. These items are usually not of great value in themselves, but they have immense sentimental value for their owners. Often they have associations with childhood memories or are mementos of a loved relative now deceased. Some are family heirlooms it is hoped to pass on to children or grandchildren after repair.

When the repair is done, the owner returns to collect the treasured item. Seeing the repair is an emotional moment. Tears are not unusual. Gratitude is heartfelt.

So where is the attraction in watching this routine being followed, programme after programme?

First, there is the privilege of watching at work the skilled hands of so many different crafts people. Second, the care with which the owner of each item is treated; the team of repairers wants to understand what is the reason the item means so much to the owner and also to know

how the owner would like the repair to be done. It is not always important to make it look as new. An old teddy bear may need repair, but it needs to retain the same look it had in the childhood of its now elderly owner. Third, the occupants of the Repair Shop often need to work together, combining their different skills to complete one repair. This co-operation is given in a friendly spirit with obvious admiration expressed for the special skills they admire in each other's work. Fourth, the team members regard as an honoured trust each item left by an owner. The art of what the team does is not to restore an item for an open market; it is to restore an item because of the love felt for it by its owner. The team regards it as a privilege to have a share in restoring the item and in sharing the love the owner feels for the item. In brief, the team loves the work it does.

Jesus Christ (remember his father was a carpenter) gave a new commandment in two parts: we should love God and love our neighbours as ourselves. Of course, I have no idea if the occupants of the Repair Shop have a religious outlook of any kind. Thus I have no idea if they love God. Yet it seems to me that they give a striking example of loving their neighbours as themselves. I wish the behaviour they show towards each other and their visitors in the Repair Shop was more widely followed in the world outside it; at a time when we are told an increasing number of people are feeling isolated, unloved and in need of mental support, it seems to me that the loving care and consideration shown to the strangers who walk into the Repair Shop offers an example which could be more widely followed elsewhere too.



Council Tax - North Tawton Parish Precept for 2022-23

We're pleased to tell you that there is no increase in the North Tawton budget for the coming financial year – in fact our residents will pay a little bit less for their town council services.

Cllr. Jean Trewhitt, Chair of North Tawton Town Council, said: 'We are a small town, with a relatively small population, but we have many properties that we are responsible for. We maintain the Memorial Park, the cemetery, churchyard (because it is a closed churchyard), car parks, public toilets, our office and even the Grade II listed clock tower.

'We try to keep the costs down, but this is still a huge commitment which our residents pay for – grass cutting alone is just under £20k per annum for example.'

Cllr. Steve Whiteley, Chair of North Tawton Town Council's finance committee, said: 'I'm delighted that despite a rise in inflation we have actually been able to reduce our budget requirement a little. We worked hard to identify savings and reductions which could be made – so a property in council tax Band D will pay 0.79% (£1.53) less than the current year, a total of £191.92 a year towards the parish precept (the town council's portion of the council tax), equating to only £3.69 a week.

North Tawton Town Clerks – upcoming vacancy for Assistant Clerk

I retire from my job as Town Clerk in May – I'll say my goodbyes to residents in due course, but meanwhile I'm happy to tell you on behalf of the Council that the current Assistant Clerk, Mel Bickell, has been promoted to Town Clerk following a formal interview with the Council's Personnel Committee. Mel will take up her new post when I leave, so we are advertising for an Assistant Clerk - if you are interested check the local newspapers and our website and noticeboard.

North Tawton Town Council Housing Needs Survey 2022

All households should have received a survey form and reply envelope – this survey will help us to determine housing need in the parish. We can then respond better to planning consultations for example. The closing date for return of the forms is 6 March 2022 so if you have not returned the form there is still time – thank you to all residents for helping us with this survey.

North Tawton Community Speedwatch - Volunteers needed

Community Speedwatch (CSW) is a national initiative where, in partnership with the police, members of communities use detection devices to monitor local vehicle speeds. The volunteers report drivers exceeding the speed limit to the police with the aim of educating drivers to slow down.

If the data proves a driver is ignoring repeated warnings police can prosecute them. The aim is to:

- reduce death and injury on the roads
- improve the quality of life for local communities
- reduce the speed of vehicles to the speed limit
- increase public awareness of inappropriate speed

We know that many residents have huge concerns about speeding traffic within the town, if anyone would like to volunteer for this initiative to try to address the problem please contact the Town Clerks.

Area of Council owned land at Strawberry Fields – adjacent to mini-roundabout

I'm delighted to say that we have been awarded a grant from West Devon Borough Council, which in turn came from Government funding to aid communities post-covid. We applied for help to clear and replant the area of land at the entrance to Strawberry Fields and the grant will cover all the costs. This is the main entrance to our town and the proposed work will make this area much more attractive and welcoming for visitors as well as for our residents. It's an opportunity for a lower maintenance planting scheme which will also incorporate wildlife friendly plants and flowers. You'll see this work progressing over the coming weeks. Sarah Say



Sampford Courtenay SCEnSus Seasonal Suggestion - March

If you've been reading our 'monthly challenges' and 'seasonal suggestions' over the last year or so you'll quickly realise that this one is a bit different. Rather than things that you might want to do, this one's very much about thinking, particularly as we (hopefully) get warmer weather and start to think about seasonal changes to what we wear. So, here's the 'food for thought'.



Did you know...

- 1. About 30% of clothing donated to charity shops is re-sold? Much is faulty, worn out or soiled and can't be sold on.
- 2. About 10% of charity clothing donations are sent to textile recycling centres. Oxfam alone estimate 12,000 tonnes of textiles a year are recycled 35million garments since 2008 recycled and not sent to landfill. The big challenge is separating mixed fibres for recycling and removing labels, buttons, zips etc.
- 3. A lot of what is left is exported. The UK is the second largest exporter of clothes in the World. Big bales of it are shipped and go to second hand markets for sale, including in West Africa. What's left is burnt or dumped there.
- 4. Inevitably, the rest of our donations end up in landfill, about 30% that's an estimated 350,000 tonnes or around £140m worth of clothes. The pace of fast fashion, seasonal changes and 'wanting a change' means that many of us have more clothing around than we actually 'need'.
- 5. It's estimated that 10% of all greenhouse gas emissions globally come from the fashion industry 1.2 billion tonnes from textile production. 20% of global waste water is from the fashion industry.
- 6. Apparently 60% of households say they have unwanted clothing in their homes, some new and unworn.
- 7. The average consumer buys 60% more clothing than they did 15 years ago, more than 2 tonnes are bought each minute in the UK, more than any other country in Europe.

As I said, food for thought!

Each day I look out at the faces who stand before my image. I listen to those who know of me and my work; those who on their trip here, stopped by the gift shop and bought their guide. I hear time and time again the story of my life- of how in a world where some women were often seen as simply objects or worse, not seen at all, I accomplished so much.

The gallery viewers who stop before me discuss my portrait in hushed tones. There are those who see a warrior, proud and defiant, whilst others talk of martyrdom and sainthood. Those who are curious take time to read the passage printed below the frame. My life, fixed in a short paragraph between two dates; a momentary interest sparked before passing on.

My story is one that has been told many times and by many women who, like me were used to gratify another's lust. Although I fought back, although I survived, if you look carefully into my eyes, you will see it all reflected there.

Many will never see, knowing nothing of me. They pass by my image on their way to other rooms in the gallery to marvel at famous images by artists more famous than me. My face is not one to entice some people and my modest pose and robe holds no titillation for those seeking suchlike.


Despite this, some people do stop as they are drawn in by my gaze and, as I look on them, I hope they see the story I show to them in my pose.

How many of them see that like the wheel I hold, I was broken; made not whole, unable to function as I should. My body was raped, destroyed in a moment where power was concealed in passion and I was left powerless, unable to recapture my innocence even though I fought back with words, then paper, oil and brush.

I did survive as survival is instinctual, but as a survivor I was only half alive, anger and vengeance replacing the joy and hope of my youth.

I am not hard on those who do not see this; I have worked hard to mask my pain and fear and to fight instead. I created a shell within which my pain lies black, and dark and waiting. You might ask for what does it wait?

To be seen and understood; it waits to be heard by those of you out there who too have this pain but a voice much louder than mine and can speak for me. You will see. Those of you who, like me survive abuse, will see. And from where I am captured in my portrait, our eyes will meet in a silent greeting of recognition. For that I wait, for someone to understand that despite all I achieved, despite all I created. I did this with part of me broken.

I hope that you are all keeping well and making the most of the cold and dry winter days we have been seeing in January. I am starting to see little hints of Spring in the garden at Castle Drogo and I am already day-dreaming of swathes of daffodils.

The teams across Dartmoor are turning their attention to re-opening the built places in our care. The deep clean of Drogo is well underway and each time I walk around the castle, there is an extra sparkle to the precious items on display. The garden team has been busy too working on the parking area next to the castle. They are using the historic architectural drawings as inspiration to transform this area into the 'servants garden' Lutyens originally imagined. Two Years On



It has been well documented that children have suffered from the consequences of the past two academic years being disrupted with partial school closures. Delivering lessons on line is not the same as in class where the skilled staff bring learning alive with practical activities, discussions and dynamism so hard to replicate on a screen. In the class setting, the teachers and teaching assistants are able to notice confusions, address misconceptions, and give immediate praise for achievements. It is no wonder that children are not all where they would have been academically had we not had a global pandemic.

Much press coverage has spoken of programmes and funding for children to 'catch up' and to 'keep up.' There has also been some, although less, coverage about the effects the pandemic have had upon children's mental health. This turbulent period with children having less time with friends and family, working in smaller groups, or bubbles as we called them and worrying about health issues has no doubt had an adverse effect on the mind growth of our youngsters. They have had less opportunities to develop their skills in communication, cooperation, and socialisation as they have played so much less than they would have done.

At the beginning of the new school year, my neighbour told me his grandson was in the 'catch up club' every playtime for maths. How terribly sad. At North Tawton Primary we have assessed learning gaps and we are working hard to enable children to make good progress in the essential reading, writing and maths skills they need for further learning and for life, however we are also balancing this with the need for children to enjoy art and music, sport and humanities, science and technology and we are not keeping children away from those very important playtimes!

We reopened our Little Seedlings Baby and Toddler group in the Autumn and I was moved to see our youngest community members exploring the space for the first time, and for our parents, particularly our first time parents, talking to and bonding with other parents in a shared space. Children from babies to teens have missed out on so many of the experiences and opportunities they would usually have.

The staff are realising that our children have much less life experience than usual for their age, for example in a lesson learning about different cultural and traditional wedding ceremonies, it was apparent that very few children had actually attended a wedding themselves. Children have not travelled as much as they would have done, so talks of experiences of journeys was limited in another class. Another class of children were shocked to see crowd scenes on a video (recorded pre 2020) as they could not remember being in a crowded place with people not wearing masks.

Two years is not a long time for us older people, but for some of our children at school it is a quarter, a third or even a half of their life experience. As we approach the second year anniversary of the first lock down in the UK, I cannot help but consider how much life has changed and how different these years have been for our children.

Things are of course improving, but we are not back to normal yet! We have not yet met as a whole school inside for assemblies, we have not had all of our families in school for any events and we continue our regimes of handwashing, additional cleaning, adults wearing masks in shared spaces. We have had a lot of disruption to normal class life with staff and pupils away with covid, we have not yet resumed our volunteer

However, things are looking up! Our clubs after school are well attended and enjoyed, we are planning class trips and we look forward to resuming our welcome to volunteers. We will of course keep finding ways for our children to catch up and keep up with all aspects of their development, learning, socialisation and experiences and enjoyment.


