Sampford Courtenay Environment and Sustainability (SCEnSus) Seasonal Suggestion – May



The news about Climate change and the need to cut global CO2 emissions couldn't be more serious. We're told that by 2025 emissions must start to reduce to stop the worst impacts. Global temperatures are still likely to rise by 3.2C this Century and will still result in more heatwaves, extreme storms and widespread water shortages. To keep temperatures down there must be significant changes to energy production, industry, transport, food production and consumption and, not least, the way we treat nature. Each of us must play our part, changing what we do and (sensitively and appropriately) trying to influence others.

One area where we really can influence things is by looking after our local environment, our flora and fauna - as individuals and with others. Here are some practical suggestions:

Visit the Devon Wildlife Trust website and look for their 'Species of the Month'. Read what they have to say about Nature Recovery – apparently 15% of wildlife is threatened with extinction.

On Saturday 21st May there will be a plant sale in the Sampford Courtenay Village Hall. Come and buy a selection of plants to grow your own vegetables or grow flowers and shrubs which will attract and support our bees and other insects. You can also bring any surplus plants you have or other garden 'stuff' that you no longer need – recycle pots, ornaments etc to reduce waste as well as helping to raise more money towards replacing the local Village Hall roof.

Put the 11th June in your Diary and come and join us for the SC Parish Himalayan balsam clean up. More details later.

See what you can do to help local wildlife – maybe create 'hedgehog tunnels' to allow them to move beyond your garden to your neighbours to increase their territory and food sources. Did you know a hedgehog can travel up to 2 miles in a night?

Many birds will be nesting now, can you put up bird boxes ... or have you considered an owl box or bat boxes?

If you have a pond, be aware of the impact of hotter Summer temperatures on the oxygen concentration. We probably all know that fish and other mammals in ponds need oxygen to survive but so does the bacteria that breaks down the 'sludge' that naturally forms in ponds. Without oxygen the whole balance of the pond is wrong, fish gasp at the surface and algae clouds the water. Bigger ponds have a greater surface area so can 'absorb' more oxygen. Water movement is good – the more it splashes the better! Solar powered pond fountains can really help.

Enjoy and appreciate our local open spaces. The Sampford Courtenay Village Green is looking better than ever – Come and see what the Volunteers have achieved and get involved with the next event. If you're there, have a look at the Bug Hotel and the recently created 'dead hedge'. Maybe choose to come here for picnics and to use the play equipment rather than getting in the car to travel further afield. Please share any other suggestions you might have about ways to improve it further as a valued and useful community space.

It's not too late for the odd frost in May - it can 'cook' delicate plants overnight! What about buying one of the SCEnSus Cold frames made from re-purposed Police Riot Shields? £20 will buy you a good-sized cold frame, easy to assemble and move around your garden. Money raised will allow us to tackle other imaginative SCEnSus projects. Thank you!

Come and join the SCEnSus group. We are, technically, a sub Committee of the SC Parish Council but membership is open to anyone. There aren't many of us but we've been well supported by Volunteers for events and activities and would like to extend this further to raise the issues of environment and sustainability within the Parish and to make a bit of a difference on 'our patch'. Our next meeting is on Tuesday 10th May, 7.00 p.m. in the Village Hall. Why not join us and bring along any interested friends or family members?

Charity begins at home, and at school



I remember from my own primary school days the excitement, and competitiveness, of sponsored walks raising money for the NSPCC. I don't remember how much I raised, but I do remember knocking on doors of my west London neighbours (not something I would recommend) and asking for pennies per lap of our playground. While many parted with their cash, one neighbour shooed me away calling me a cheeky beggar, another asked me why. Why was I doing this walk, why was I raising money? It was a good question, and one I was not able to answer articulately. 'Coz it's charity, init.' was probably my eloquent response. I didn't really know what the NSPCC did or why I was raising money, it was just what we had been told to do. And I wanted to raise more than Nicola.

Times have changed. Our children are far more aware of what charities are, why they are needed and how they operate, than I was at their age. TV adverts show why money is needed and how it is spent. The evening extravaganza TV shows for Children in Need and Comic Relief show stories of individuals and their personal circumstances and how funds are spent to do many things such as fund breaks for young carers, equipment and access for the physically impaired and support groups for the bereaved. Further afield, money is raised for projects such as building wells, providing education, community centres, vaccine programmes and mosquito nets. Raising money for charity has become part of the school cycle of events.

Charity does begin at home, as the adage says. Our Friends of North Tawton School group (FONTS) have worked hard to raise funds for the school through many events including selling doughnuts on Valentine's Day, making and selling Christmas gift tags, online Christmas market and balloon races and the Bag 2 School collection.

While many charities, like our FONTS found ways to be flexible over the past two years, The Charity Commission reports that

Perhaps the most striking finding is that nearly all charities were impacted by the pandemic – over **90%** told us that they have experienced some negative impact from Covid-19, whether on their service delivery, finances, staff, or indeed on staff morale, resulting from the months of frustration and uncertainty. The majority (**60%**) saw a loss of income, and a third (**32%**) said they experienced a shortage of volunteers. <u>https://charitycommission.blog.gov.uk/</u>

At North Tawton Primary, we explain why we are raising money and what that money is used for. This year at Harvest we explained to children why we were collecting goods for the Okehampton Food Bank, we talked about where our money for Children in Need would be going, and we publish our spending of money raised by FONTS. Our brand new veranda and equipment for Nursery was funded by FONTS. We also use our funds to subsidise trips and events.

Back to my neighbour's question; why? Why do we raise money for charities? By bringing our children up to think about other people and go out of their way to raise money is one way of preparing them to be citizens who consider their own family, friends, community and communities further away.

I was moved by the children in Year 4 asking what they could do to help families fleeing Ukraine. By making posters and asking for cake donations, they were able to sell sweet treats and make some money for the Ukraine appeal. The school and the wider trust are welcoming Ukrainian families and working together to enable a network of support for them as they move in to our towns and villages.

There are many ways to support others, from giving to charity, providing food and spiritual as well as emotional and financial support – a long held tradition of our churches, temples, mosques, gurdwaras, community centres and synagogues. 'Every act of kindness is charity,' said Prophet Muhammad.

Our school benefits from the volunteers of our FONTS and governors who make up our Local Stakeholder Board. We had a Saturday morning volunteers gardening session last month and hope to have more over the coming term. As covid restrictions lift, we hope to welcome back in our volunteer readers and look at new and exciting ways to support our own community and others.
