



News from the Moor

Hi everyone

My daily rain dance doesn't seem to be making any difference as yet. It is a rare thing to have so many people desperately hoping for rain – especially on Dartmoor when we usually have plenty! Thank you to everyone who is doing their bit to spread the word about low river levels and the high risk of wild fire. It all helps to protect this wonderful place.

Although most of our gardens are struggling, there are a few plants in the garden at Drogo that are loving this heat. One example is Coreopsis verticillata 'Zagreb'. It's a stunning herbaceous perennial that loves the sun and has a long flowering season. The foliage is light and feathery, so it is an attractive plant even when not in flower, and it prefers full sun and well drained conditions so is thriving at the moment.

For those who are mostly hiding under trees reading books in this heat (or is that just me?), we will be having a pop-up second hand bookshop at Finch Foundry for a month starting from Wednesday 31st August. Please do pop along to have a rummage or drop off any books you would like to donate. The bookshop will be open from 11 until 3 when Finch Foundry is open (closed on Mondays and Tuesdays).

Plans are also underway for Heritage Open Day. This is when we celebrate our wonderful heritage sites and open for free. There are 4 different options for you all. Lydford Gorge is taking part on Saturday 10th September, Finch Foundry on Sunday 11th September (please book via the website), and the hydro turbine house by the river at Drogo will also be open on Sunday 11th September. Castle Drogo itself is taking part on Thursday 15 September.

Finally, I am delighted to let you know that St. Clements Day will once again be celebrated at Finch Foundry on Saturday 19th November, 10am until 4pm. Finch will be ringing with the sound of local blacksmiths marking the day of their patron saint with displays, demonstrations and competitions. Cogs and Wheels Morris will also be performing. Everyone is welcome to join us so please pop it in your diary – it is a wonderful event.

Councillor Vacancy

North Tawton Town Council welcomes Leanne Mathis (Merry go Round), who was co-opted to the Council in August, and we look forward to working with Leanne. The Council is now up to full strength of 12 Councillors.

Criminal Damage to Toilets

On 30th July the public toilets on Market Street were extensively damaged between 4 and 5 p.m., which has resulted in the Council having to close the toilets whilst we seek an insurance claim to repair and reopen. Bonfires

During this time of drought, please carefully consider if it is wise and necessary to light a bonfire. North Tawton has several thatched properties and embers/sparks from a neighbour's bonfire can cause a thatch fire. This is a real source of high anxiety and fear for many residents. We are lucky to be in a rural location, but there is an additional risk of a wildfire spreading from very dry fields through embers and sparks. Taw Bridge Foot bridge project by Mrs. Carol Hughes and Mrs. Sue Knott

Taw Bridge is a Grade II listed 15th Century medieval road bridge on the western approach to North Tawton and is the only western route into the town. There are no public footpaths over the bridge, however there is a white painted 'virtual footway' which a representative from DCC Highways has confirmed does not comply with current legislation and therefore has no legal status. Due to the narrow width of the bridge, pedestrians and cyclists are not afforded safe passage when vehicles are crossing the bridge. The concept of a pedestrian footbridge, to be placed adjacent to the road bridge between the Rugby Club grounds and the Diana Memorial Garden', has been comprehensively investigated. DCC Highways, WDBC Conservation Officer and the Environment Agency have all been consulted and broadly support the idea. The Trustees of the Rugby Club are broadly supportive of the idea, but despite every effort taken on all available searches, public notices, DCC Highways consultation and legal advice, the ownership of the 'Diana Memorial Garden' has not been resolved. A pre-application submission to WDBC was made in early June by David Grabham, an architect with Dunn Marino Associates. If this proposal reaches approval, a public meeting will be held to ascertain public desire for a bridge and consideration of approved designs. If there is sufficient public support, fund-raising will commence to raise the costs required to build and install the bridge. If applicable at this stage, s106 funding arising from any development of the Old Woollen Mill and any other housing sites in North Tawton will be sought. Once built, a request will be submitted to the Town Council regarding their possible ownership and maintenance of the bridge. The Council have a loan repayment ending in March 2023 of approximately £1500 per year. The request would be that after this period a similar figure would be set aside annually to accrue for maintenance and repairs of the footbridge.

New Street Lights Town Centre

County Cllr. James McInnes will be attending a public forum on Tuesday 6th September commencing 7 p.m. in North Tawton Rugby Club, to explain the decision by Devon County Council to replace the lamp posts and the fitting of white LED lamps which are excessively bright for a rural historic town and causing disturbance to residents at night. Please come along and voice your opinion.

Community Land Trust

The Council will be holding a public meeting soon to gain opinion, support, and membership to form a Community Land Trust for the Parish. Community land trusts – or CLTs – are democratic, non-profit organisations which own and develop land for the benefit of the community. They typically provide affordable homes, community gardens, civic buildings, pubs, shops, shared workspace, energy schemes and conservation landscapes. They are community organisations run by ordinary people who want to make a difference to their local community, putting control of assets into the hands of local people. They can be set up by the community or a landowner, a developer, or a council, protecting community assets for ever. They can ensure that homes are permanently and genuinely affordable. CLTs act as long-term stewards of land and the assets on it. They ensure that it is put to the benefit of the local community, not just for now but for every future occupier.

Clean up after your dog

Residents are reminded that it is an offence to not clear up after your dog. Please respect the open spaces, verges and pathways within the Parish, as well as your neighbour's property. 

Sampford Courtenay Environment and Sustainability (SCEnSus)



Seasonal Suggestion – September

This Summer's record breaking temperatures and long spells without rain have certainly prompted lots of conversations about climate change and what it might mean for us all. These include plans to increase rainwater storage for garden and other use; how to reduce domestic water use and increasing the thickness of roof insulation - not just to keep heat in during cold weather but to keep houses cooler in these extreme Summer temperatures. Someone was talking about getting thermal curtain linings on single glazed windows for the same reason. It's quite clear that weather patterns have changed and that we all need to do what we can to keep things manageable. What else have you been thinking of doing?

Now is the time of year to think about next year's growing season and the seeds that our gardens have produced that we can save for ourselves or to share with others. If you've got surplus beans (of any sort), sweet pea or lupin seeds, nasturtiums etc., why not dry and save them now and bring them along to one of the SCEnSus events next month to pass on to others? – recycled paper envelopes (clearly labelled and sealed!) are ideal to portion them up for someone else. There's a SCEnSus Open meeting on the 18th October and a Coffee Morning on Saturday 22nd October – bring your seeds along to either event to share or swap them with other folks. You can also put them on the SCEnSus Plant Stall in the New Inn car park along with anything else that other people might like – plants, surplus produce or any other 'garden goodies' sold in aid of our Village Green developments.

September is a good time to establish or extend your wildflower strip or meadow. You could make seed bombs and spread seeds randomly for a natural look. Why not make some spare seed bombs and bring them to the SCEnSus events next month?


strength and increase our flexibility and have some time to rest and relax, you are looking after yourself, which is so very

COME AND SING



ACE Archaeology Club

I expect that by the time you read this the hot summer will be but a distant memory.

We started our annual dig at Moistown on the 16th of July, the then hottest weekend of the summer. We have calculated that whatever the temperature is in Winkleigh it is at least a degree or three warmer at our site at Moistown. Winkleigh was forecast for over 30 degrees. So, for the first weekend there were few of us and we only worked for half the day. On the Monday, when temperatures were forecast to reach 40, we didn't work at all as we had already reached that on the site on the days before!

Normally we are complaining that rain stops us digging, but not this time.

We had the usual complement of finds from ancient to modern pottery, nails and large items of rust. One interesting find that needed a little research was a large coin or medallion. When cleaned up a little on site the reverse showed '40' and the obverse seemed to show a sunburst. We thought at first that it might be a commemorative medallion but research didn't find anything much worth commemorating for the date on the coin of 1857, or of 40 years earlier either. A little more gentle cleaning showed some of the writing and looking at it under artificial light and angling the light so as to show up the relief, we could make out, 'republic' and 'centi'. Back to the internet. Turned out to be a 40 centimos coin from the Republic of Uruguay. How on earth did that find itself in a house in the middle of Devon?? I think we will never know.

A note to anyone thinking of doing any illegal metal detecting on site, don't. It won't be worth your while and the site is monitored.

In addition to the dig, we also have our ACE days out and about. Last Saturday, 6th August, found us exploring the Roman sites around North Tawton and looking at Bronze Age ring barrows in the same area. So good to look at local history.

We have had some new members joining lately but always ready to welcome more.



What happens at school during the summer holidays?

Certainly one of the perks of working in a school is that we have regular holidays. The summer holiday in particular is always a welcomed break from the hectic term time work pattern and a fabulous opportunity to spend quality time with family, friends, and enjoy the sunny season. People in other industries will often comment on how lucky we are, which of course we are, however I do remind them that our holidays are dictated and are at the busiest and most expensive times to get away! Unlike some journalists would like you to believe, the staff are not all sitting on empty beaches in the Seychelles for six weeks! In fact, a lot happens behind the scenes during the holiday periods.

This summer at North Tawton a group of our staff attended two days of training to qualify as paediatric first aiders. The course covered many aspects of first aid including management of bites and stings and how to respond to emergencies including seizures, choking and external bleeding. The staff practiced delivery of CPR and their bandaging techniques - see the photographic evidence! They all passed with flying colours which means we continue to have more than the required amount of people trained to ensure pupil and staff safety at school.

Our cleaning staff uses the holiday periods to undertake a deep clean of the buildings, and our maintenance staff complete safety checks such as checking all the fire extinguishers and servicing our boilers. This summer we have had new receptors installed so we have stronger WiFi across the school and we have some new kitchen equipment delivered.

Early in August, we hosted a four day HAF programme for children across the Trust to attend. This is a government funded holiday activity and food provision for children who have free school meals in term time or have additional needs. We were inundated with applications so expanded our 30 places to 60! School staff accompanied children travelling in by bus from local schools, and worked with Okehampton Community and Recreation Association (OCRA) staff who led activities including football, dance, cricket, athletics, curling, tag rugby, arts and crafts. Our kitchen staff cooked healthy and nutritious meals and we encouraged children to enjoy a wide variety of fruit for snacks including melon, strawberries, frozen oranges and red, orange and yellow pepper strips with dips.

Teachers have been in to school throughout the holiday setting up their classrooms, planning with job shares, and preparing for the new school year.

I have had meetings throughout the holiday with family support workers and social services to make sure children and families are supported throughout he summer, attended leadership training with fellow Trust leaders and popped in to school regularly to water the plants!

At the beginning of September, after spending quality time with family, friends and hopefully some rest, recuperation and self care, the school staff has two days of in service training (INSET.) During these INSET days, staff will complete annual safeguarding training, refreshing our knowledge of this vital part of our job. We are all responsible for ensuring our children are safe so we all need to have regular training and always be up to date with the latest advice and legislation. This year we are also focusing INSET time on working with our Three Hares partner schools looking at how we can even better meet the needs of our children with additional needs. We are also have valuable time together as a school team to look at our own priorities and to plan for the year ahead.

By Wednesday 8th September, we will be ready to welcome back our children and their families to start our exciting new school year.
