



# **From The Rectory**

Where did the year go? It is already December and Christmas is just around the corner. For many of us it is a busy time – presents to buy, rooms to decorate, meals to prepare, family to visit, guests to welcome and parties to go to. One of the most stressful things I find is buying presents, getting just the right present for each person. Fortunately for me, in recent years my wife has decided to buy her own presents and leave them in little heaps around my office. I wonder where you are with your preparations for the festive season?

It can seem like we need to prepare so much so that we can have that perfect Christmas. It was like that too for God on that very first Christmas. He had to send angels to Mary, to the shepherds in the fields and to John the Baptist's father to invite them to take their part. A census needed to be organised so that Mary and Joseph were in the right place. He had two miraculous births to organise, Jesus' own and his cousin too. Wise men needed prepping and a special star needed to be there newly shining brightly just at the right time.

Some get frustrated when we see the shops already filling their shelves and displays with Christmas things in October. Thinking that Christmas should remain special and not last half the year. However, God's preparations for that first Christmas started thousands of years previously. The first promise given by God which pointed to the baby Jesus was in the creation story at the very start of the Bible. Then through the intervening centuries God slowly removed little bits of the wrapping, revealing a little bit more about this promised gift.

A gift promised for millennia, a birth stage managed with the full resources of heaven and at the centre of it a newly born baby in a manger. What was so special about this baby that God prepared so spectacularly? God wasn't announcing the birth of any new baby but of his own Son, the one who was God come in human form. One who by his words and actions revealed who God was and what he was like. But even at this stage, when Jesus was still a helpless baby, depending on Mary for everything, we discover an amazing and fundamental thing about God. That God is not far off, keeping his hands clean in heaven, but loves us and this world so much that he would give up the glory of heaven to come and live with us, eat with us, laugh with us, cry with us, even die with us.

God came to earth as the baby Jesus to start a new chapter in his relationships with humans. One of the names given to Jesus was 'Immanuel' or 'God is with us'. God still holds out that gift of his loving presence with us. All we need to do is to receive that gift from God.



### Fuel, Energy & Bills allowances

If you are in receipt of Government financial assistance this winter and do not need it, please consider donating it to the Warm Space Fund for North Tawton – any donations will only be used for this purpose and can be anonymous. Separate accounts will be kept for inspection. Payment can be made to North Tawton Town Council by cheque or BAC's – Unity Trust Bank, a/c 20387318 sort code 60-83-01

### **Memorial Park Shelter**

Following installation of the concrete base, the new shelter will be installed beginning of December.

# **Electric Vehicle Charging North Tawton**

The Council is liaising with DCC regarding the provision of on-street charge points and we are investigating viable options to install EV charge points in our carpark. The Council is also investigating 'Co-Charger' scheme (www.Co-Charger.com) where private householders with a charging point can rent out their parking space and vehicle charging point to EV drivers with no charging facility of their own. 'Hosts' who have registered with Co-Charger as being willing to provide charging facilities can set their own terms and conditions, together with the price, generally per hour, although Co-Charger provides some guidance on this (and takes a 12% commission). If you would like more information or wish to register your interest in a Co-Charger scheme, please contact the Town Clerk.

#### Dog Mess

There have been recent incidents of persons allowing their dogs to foul in the Memorial Park and within the Children's play area. This is a significant health hazard. Please clean up after your pet. The area is being monitored and any persons failing to clear up after their pet anywhere in the parish, or entering areas where dogs are not permitted will be reported to the Dog Warden for further action to be taken which could be a financial fixed penalty.

# North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

## Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Definition of 'to glance'? 'To take a brief or hurried look'. It could also mean 'to hit something at an angle and bounce off obliquely'. (I'm sure he didn't mean that did he?) Flicking through the November edition of Roundabout I was dismayed to read that Danny Semorad had 'glanced' at the W.I. Ramblings. Did he pour over every word? Did he read each paragraph at a leisurely pace not wanting to miss a single syllable? No. He 'glanced' at it. Definition of 'disconsolate'? To be very unhappy and unable to be comforted. That's me.

Jenny Reynolds was here to tell us about Ripple Effect – and the first thing to be aware of was the charity's change of name. It had previously been called 'Send a Cow' but this was causing increasing confusion, as they were continually having to explain that they didn't actually send cows, but instead aimed to provide a range of sustainable anti-poverty solutions, that could eventually transform the lives of the farming families that they worked alongside. Ripple Effect currently has programmes in Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi and Zambia – parts of rural Africa where there is extreme poverty. Their work involves bringing farmers together with community trainers and experienced peer farmers to share ideas and to learn new skills. The focus is on practical approaches that will help them to learn more, grow more and then sell more, helping them to invest in their farms and their families' futures. Every farmer they work with will directly benefit three more – hence the Ripple Effect. Jenny went on to explain that the majority of people they work with are women and girls as they carry most of the responsibility for domestic tasks -65 per cent of the people they work with are women, and 50 per cent of these are widows. To date, they have reached 2.5 million people and their aim is to reach 5 million by 2030. Examples of skills to be learnt include how to compost, how to build a small but productive garden, how to make a hygienic drying rack and a fuel saving stove, and how to make a 'tip tap' – a water tap that pours out just enough water to wash your hands. They can also learn money management, saving and credit skills, business skills and how to form small co-operatives. Jenny had some examples of farmers the programme has helped, including Aderi – who now grows much bigger and better bananas, and Caroline – whose field of nutritious cassava crops has replaced what were once unproductive shrubs. Real examples of how this charity has helped transform difficult lives into productive and fulfilling ones.

It's time. The anticipation is palpable. Husband is almost giddy with excitement. The thought of Christmas shopping is beyond thrilling and he is desperate to tramp the streets looking for the perfect present(s). Good job I've saved him a seat on our W.I. coach trip to Clarks Village, in Street, that has 'Over 90 Designer and High Street Brands'. I've just told him that he's coming with us. His face has taken on this slightly pale/mottled/terrified appearance. I think he's looking forward to it. It will give him a break from obsessing over the weather station. If there are any other 'husbands' out there who are desperate to share in his giddy excitement, please let me know. I can reserve a seat just for you.

Go on – you know you want to.





Citizens Advice – 03444 111444 – can offer advise on paying your bills this winter and where to get financial help.

**Help for Households** – <u>www.helpforhouseholds.campaign.gov.uk</u> – Household support fund funding to help residents who are struggling to afford to pay for their gas, electricity or water usage, buy food or other essential items.

West Devon Borough Council – <a href="www.westdoven.gov.uk/support-directory">www.westdoven.gov.uk/support-directory</a> - Income Support, Energy bills, household costs, transport costs, council tax.

Fuel, Energy & Bills - If you're in dept to your energy supplier, you might be able to get a grant from a charitable trust to help pay it off.

**Energy pre-payment meters -** Citizens Advice Devon – is managing an Energy Relief scheme for those using pre-payment meters and who are struggling to meet their energy needs.

**British Gas Energy Trust** – offers grants and schemes that are open to anyone – you don't have to be a customer.

**Scottish Power Hardship Fund** – offers grants for customers.

Ovo Debt and anergy assistance – offers grants for customers.

**E.on Energy Fund** – offers grants for customers.

**EDF Energy Customer Support Fund** – offers grants for customers.

**Bulb Energy Fund** – offers grants for customers.

**WaterSure** – scheme which helps some people with their water bills – to apply you must be receiving benefits and need to use a lot of water for either medical reasons or because your household has a number of school-age children.

**Social Broadband and Phone Tariffs** – can provide a safety net for customers who might be struggling to afford their broadband or phone services – Ofgem have produced a list of broadband and mobile services for which you may be eligible.

WHY DO WE NEED CONTEMPORARY ART?

It's easy to think that art is periphery, an unnecessary luxury, that it is unhelpful, it doesn't do anything, and that it's a downright waste of money. Consciously or subconsciously this seemingly logical conclusion is reached by many, but here's what they miss:

Art is 'useful' on many levels. It unites, it mobilises, it inspires, it documents, it questions, it critiques. However, I would go further to say that art is necessary, and it is necessary precisely because it is unnecessary. Call me a dreamer, but is there not more to life than keeping warm, dry and fed? If that makes you suspicious of me sounding like an overly comfortable slug, unsympathetic to those who are only just holding on, then consider how the greatest art movements have been born out of the deepest struggles. Maybe this shows how much more important art is in times of dire need, and less meaningful to those who have it all. Art plugs us into what it is to be human and creates a space in which to share the full breadth of this experience. The gallery Aleph Contemporary's homage to the writer, bell hooks, at London Art Fair this year pondered how the subjective realm of feeling is a universal language shared by all. Being human is so much more than survival and the accumulation of possessions. It is about experiences of joy, connection, love, sorrow, peace, fear, anger and compassion.

Contemporary Art is an expression of this human experience in relation to the here and now. It breaks through utilitarian biases and connects us in an open and free-thinking way to the present, involving us in a dialogue in which we can partake. This makes it empowering and therefore dangerous to power structures. It is no wonder that authoritarian regimes have historically clamped down on 'degenerate' art. Art is a protest against this and proclaims freedom.

Contemporary Art is relevant, current, exciting, important and engages us in what it is to be human now. We make history, which is why we must participate in the present.

# WALKING BETWEEN THE LINES

Olga Brereton at Ruth Smith Gallery, 15 November - 4 December Mondays and Fridays 10.30-4, and by appointment via Ruth on 07810590954

Olga Brereton infuses her work with light and air. You can almost walk between the layers of brushstrokes in the landscapes and wriggle your hands through the stems of her botanical drawings, with their sinuous yet hesitant and careful winding lines. Despite their meandering quality it is clear that their drawer knows about plants and their individual structures. The 'structure within anarchy' as she described, and the free handling of ink and paint coming together to create a cohesive whole is testament.

Olga as a child would play with her grandfather's gold chain, lowering it onto the tabletop to create infinite configurations. It seems that there her fascination with line began. The ability of line to mean something has fascinated us for millennia, and its potential to create an idea of space on a flat surface has been central to art since it began. Olga's paintings and drawings are an equal marriage between the flat abstract quality of the marks, and the sense of space and subject that they depict. One can flit freely between enjoying the formal design of the work to the flowers and landscapes they describe.

Olga's work goes further still. Not only can one enjoy the slippage between abstract and figurative, but it also feels as though one can slip between the marks themselves. Olga makes use of the white ground, be it paper or canvas, to shine through thin layers of paint and line drawings to create a light airiness to her work. It is possible to imagine the marks sliding off their support, like the gold chain off the table, and to be able to walk between the lines.
