

#### **From The Rectory**

January, we are told, includes the most depressing day of the year, and this year we face it amid a cost of living crisis.

#### **Clock Tower Roof**

The Council will be considering tenders from contractors to rebuild the roof at their meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2023.

#### **Cemetery Extension**

The council is progressing the planning application for the cemetery extension. The Tier 1 ground water assessment identified a requirement for a Tier 2 assessment (further investigative works) which will commence 25<sup>th</sup> January 2023. The Council has accrued substantial reserves for many years to pay for the cemetery extension which will cover these costs.

We have also recently had a Commonwealth War Grames Plaque fitted on the entrance to the cemetery to commemorate our fallen parishioners from the World Wars who are buried there.

#### **Transport Matters**

Members of the Council met with DCC Highways Community Officer in October, and discussed the removal of some double yellow lines in the Town Centre, the provision of a 7.5t weight limit through the Town, a pedestrian crossing in High Street, Electric Vehicle on-street charging points, altered parking arrangements in the Square (to include vehicle movements, time limits and pavement widening) and the provision of a vehicle speed activation sign at the 30mph limit on approach to the Town towards Batheway Fields. We also discussed the poor state of the roads in the Parish and were informed that the inevitable budget restrictions by DCC meant most reported potholes did not qualify as a safety risk and therefore would not be repaired. We are still awaiting a response to the questions we raised and are continuing to pursue Highways.

We are actively seeking the co-operation of businesses in the town who are willing to consider providing parking space for a public Electric vehicle charging point and will be carrying out a feasibility study of the town centre carpark to consider re-design to accommodate electric vehicle charging without the loss of further parking spaces and also provision of additional regular parking.

We are hoping to identify roads in the Town that would be suitable for a 20mph limit. However, our application will be hindered as we do not have enough volunteers to form an active Community Speed watch group to gather the required data to support the application. If you are interested in joining the speed watch group, please contact the Town Clerk


Have you tried yoga before and thought oh that's not for me?


Or, I'm not bendy enough? Or I'm too old...stop right there.....





Watercolour Investigations: Prussian Blue - Emma at Art Scribe, North Tawton's watercolour makers

The deep midnight colour of Prussian Blue has an interesting story. From dyeing the Prussian army uniform to starring in many iconic works of art from Hokusais' Great Wave to Picassos' Blue Period.

Prussian Blue has always been a much loved colour in my palette. Surprisingly to me, not everyone shares this love. Here are some reactions people gave when I excitedly announced we were adding it to our range of watercolour paints: "It's very staining", "that's a hard colour to work with" and even; "I wouldn't give it the time of day!" Well we did give it the time of day, many hours in fact.

Hand mulling is a traditional paint making process that suspends coloured pigments with a binder. It's a methodical, hands-on approach that allows us to become connected with the unique characteristics of the pigments therefore allowing us to add more colour, tweak the binder or control how much we mull. As Reg mulled Prussian Blue, I became mesmerised by the deep dark blue pigment as it changed from powder to paste then into the paint that flowed out across the glass slab in increasing circular movements. Like a black and magical mirror, the depth of the colour reflected back the room and ourselves, while streaks of brilliant electric blue shone through.


Eagerly I set about exploring what our freshly made Prussian Blue watercolour paint could do. My initial instinct was to work it with minimal dilution and use it over subtle yellows and bright greens to allow them to pop through the midnight blue-black and give contrast. I threw salt crystals upon the wet surface in order for abstract stars to appear. I worked wet on wet, dropping Prussian Blue into pools of Hansa Yellow to watch it creep and blend organically. When diluted with water, Prussian is a pale, cool greeny blue.

I then explored some more deliberate and formal colour mixing. The results were beautifully subtle and delightfully surprising. For the deepest darks you can't go wrong with adding Prussian to the mix. Try mixing Prussian with a Deep Crimson Red for dark shadows. When mixed with yellows and greens your green palette will expand a hundred fold! Depending on the yellow you use, Prussian mixes both vivid and earthy greens perfect for painting foliage. Skies and seascapes become atmospheric with interesting granulating effects when mixed with Graphite Black or Burnt Umber as greys, teals and earthy browns are produced. It's worth going slowly though, Prussian Blue is indeed staining, so it can dominate a palette if you add too much. It can also leave interesting and subtle watermarks if you try to lift it once it's laid down. Bear these factors in mind and Prussian Blue will reward you with a diverse and exciting colour and tonal range.

Prussian Blue will continue to be a favourite in my palette and I recommend exploring its qualities if you haven't already. Finally, I invite the sceptics to give it another go and embrace its (magical) power!

#### **Bondleigh Rainfall**

Although both November and December had long wet periods, the two months were very different. November had rain on most days. This amounted to 179.5 mm. compared to only 53 mm. in 2021. December started dry and this continued until mid month with a particularly cold week. The only precipitation was 9.1mm. which fell as snow. This snow remained on the ground for the following week, reminding us of the old saying 'if snow hangs around it's waiting for more'. We shall see. The rest of the month was wet with rain on most days and this amounted to 121.1 mm. The total rainfall for 2022 was 926.3 mm. A dry year, but we have had many with much less rain. The driest year that I have recorded was 2003 with only 680.9 mm.. I have included data for the last three years, which shows how variable our rainfall is.


