

From The Rectory

How are you feeling? Which of these quotes do you most identify with today?

Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth.
Worship the LORD with gladness;
come before him with joyful songs.
(Psalm 100:1-2)
My soul is in deep anguish.
How long, LORD, how long?
(Psalm 6:3)

This summer in our services we are looking at the Psalms – the song book of the Bible. It's an easy part of the Bible to find – it's the long book right near the middle. In it there are 150 poems – each a song or a prayer to God. Some are short – Psalm 117 is just five lines long. Some are epic – Psalm 119 is a 2,500 word acrostic poem about the writer's delight in the messages which God has spoken to his people! But the most amazing thing about the Psalms is the breadth of emotions which are expressed in them. There are many psalms of joy (Psalm 100), the word 'joy' appears 57 times – but there are also psalms that describe great depression (Psalm 88). There are so many cries from the heart – some of them come from great anger (Psalm 77), some from fear (Psalm 56), others from sorrowful lament (Psalm 102). Many psalms contain great cries for justice (Psalm 5). Still others are deep cries of praise (Psalm 148) or thankfulness (Psalm 136 reminds us 26 times – "His love endures forever"!). There are many desperate questions – that question "How long...?" is asked 22 times – mostly of God. There is a psalm for every emotion and season of life.

The wonderful truth expressed by the Psalms is that God invites us to bring our trials and troubles and our joys and thankfulness to him. God created us and is not surprised by our emotions, and he wants us to be honest with him about how we are feeling – even when that is anger at him. He has put all these songs in the Bible – giving us permission to express ourselves to him and giving us the words to do so when words fail us. But

the key to the Psalms and expressing these emotions, is that they are spoken within a relationship of trust and dependence on God. We might be angry at God, we might have doubts, we might be afraid – but we bring all these and more *to* God because even in the anger, doubts and fears we recognise who God is and that he is the one we need to address these prayers, complaints and questions to.

The book of Psalms, however, is not static – there is a journey from sorrow to joy. At the start psalms of lament expressing sorrow and anger are more dominant. But as the book goes on the joyful, praise psalms begin to outnumber the lament psalms and the book ends with five great psalms of praise. This change is also reflected in many of the individual psalms too. As our cries and questions are brought to God, there is a change of heart and a recognition that God indeed is at work and will save us – and in the end there will be joyful thanks and praise to God. As Jesus died on the cross, he quoted from the Psalms some suggest he was praying his way through all of them as he himself suffered. Most famously he quoted the first line of Psalm 22 – "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?". This psalm is an amazing prediction of what Jesus would suffer. The Psalm then goes on to the hope of rescue and new life. Our first reaction to the Psalm might be to dismiss it as optimism and positive thinking, but it is not. Christians believe that Jesus suffered and died but then was raised to new life – and this power will one day transform all this world from sorrow to joy. The reason the Psalms can lead us from lament to joy is because Jesus lived through the very worst of human experience and so unlocked joy and rescue and delight. He blazed a trail through death to new life.

So, however you are feeling today, why not tell God about it? Why not have a look at the Psalms and use these ancient prayers to express how you are feeling to God?



The Council has a legal duty to carry out health and safety inspections of memorials in the Cemetery and closed Churchyard. The Council has appointed an external, qualified Company, to carry out the inspections, which will commence 23rd August 2023. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the Town Clerk.

Clock Tower

Funding operations are under way to raise the additional monies to rebuild the canopy, which will include fund raising and donations. Please see our full-page advert on page 17 for details. A booklet has been produced and is available to download from the Council website or an email edition can be sent to you on request.

Memorial Park

Some of the play equipment in the park is coming to or has come to the end of its life. The Council will have to decommission some items and use s.106 monies and council reserves and seek some additional grant funding for replacement. Please take the time to consider what equipment you and your children would like to see in the park and contact the Clerk with suggestions and pictures if possible.

The Clerk has a consultation with the planning department at West Devon on 8th August, as the park is in the conservation area, to determine if any planning permissions will be required as the council is looking to move away from wooden structures to galvanised steel which may not fall within the terms of 'like for like'. The trampoline should be repaired towards end of July or early August. The Swing set by the trampoline needs an urgent repair to the top beam and therefore, we have had to remove the swings for safety reasons. The Estates Committee will be considering whether to replace the entire structure or just this beam when it meets on 7th August. The Trustees of the park will be making grant applications to Denbrook Community Fund and Durant Trust for match funding to replace items in the park over the next 12 months.

Town Centre Carpark

The Transport Committee has received a quote to provide 3 electric vehicle charging points in the carpark. The committee will consider the quote on 18th July and make recommendations for full council on 1st August, to progress. We are also liaising with the Rugby Club and the same company to provide EV charging at the bottom of town.

Suds Pond next to Strawberry Fields

The fencing around the pond to keep the animal stock out has become deteriorated, and the Estates Committee will consider quotes for repairs at their meeting on 7th August

Council Meeting.

Our next council meeting will be on Tuesday 1st August. Our regular meetings are on the first Tuesday of every month, and we have an open forum between 7.15 and 7.30, if you wish to make a presentation to the council and residents. To book this slot, please contact the Clerk at least 8 days before the meeting. At the Council public forum on 5th September, we have Tara Penny, Head Teacher from the Primary School, 3rd October Inspector Conway Devon & Cornwall Police, 5th December Andy Cattermole – Allison Homes development Weavers Place. Alternatively, we have 2 periods during the meeting when the public can attend and raise matters for the Council to consider, however, unless the matter is already on the agenda, the Council will not be able to offer an immediate response but would carry the item to the next agenda for a formal reply if this is required.

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member


Just in case you were concerned for my safety – I coped admirably with our Gin Tasting afternoon, and negotiated the 200 yards 'ome from the Copper Key without a wobble or a stagger. I could say that it was purely educational. It wasn't. In my defence we heard about the history and differing varieties of gin and the origins of quinine (did you know that the quinine in your tonic water was extracted from the bark of the fever tree – and was used as a fever remedy back in the early 17th century?) however I'm fairly sure that most of us were there to sample. And we did. It was lovely. Even when we found ourselves adding a bit of freshly ground black pepper and a few chilli flakes to our glass. Don't knock it before you try it. One of the best things? Listening to and watching 16 ladies laughing, chatting, laughing a lot more (might have something to do with the gin) and having a fabulous time. Job done.

Derek and Jane (from the South West Lindy Hoppers) know how to have a fabulous time. They put on a 'Swing' style record and do the 'Lindy Hop'. And whether you're doing it or watching it it'll put a smile on your face. The Lindy Hop was given its name in 1927 and originated in 1920's and 30's Harlem, New York. The Lindy Hop style of dance mixes together components from tap dancing and the Charleston plus steps from much older dances such as the Texas Tommy and the Cakewalk. There were numerous dance venues in New York but the Savov Ballroom was by far the largest. It had a sprung dance floor that could take 3,000 dancers and a bandstand at either end which saw the likes of Count Basie and Duke Ellington playing there. The Savoy was so popular with dancers that the floor would need replacing every three years – it was also home to regular dance competitions and the 'Battle of the Bands' with dancers choosing the best band. Frankie Manning was a second-generation Lindy Hopper who devised the 'Aerial' or air step and would go on to become a choreographer and tour the world with his own dance troupe. Talking of dance troupes – it was time to form our very own North Tawton W.I. Lindy Hopping version. Derek and Jane needed volunteers. Willing volunteers. President Jan shot off her chair along with her band of W.I. sisters and in no time they were 'knee slapping', 'shimmying', 'shoe shining' and doing the 'crazy legs'. (I think there may be photos and a video out there somewhere).

Husband is reading a book of Devon words and dialects. He has just told me that 'at least I didn't come home with the key of the market' after our gin tasting afternoon. I have no idea what that means. Can't even guess. Translation? To be drunk. Here's another. Ever heard of 'Tiverton rain'? It's rain on a North East wind which means it will rain for 48 hours. Why pick on Tiverton? Moving on. He wants me to give you a spud update. A couple of weeks ago he had a spuddle under the first earlies – we held our breath. Would they be big enough? Would they be riddled with slug holes? Would he be laughed out of North Tawton? Have a little faith. There they were – glinting at us. Crying out to be lightly steamed and smothered in butter. All was well.

And finally – I hope he doesn't get 'mascols' on his cabbages.

Hi everyone

I hope those of you who love the sun are enjoying the weather, and those who don't have found plenty of shade under lovely trees.

It has been a hive of activity across our many sites over the past month with Great Big Green Week events taking place, community volunteering days and thank you events as part of Volunteers Week and visits from our partners at Devon Carers during Carers Week. June is always so busy! It has been such a privilege to be able to celebrate these special weeks and say thank you.

We are now starting to look ahead planning our stand for the Chagford Show which will take place on Thursday 17th August. Our theme will be the different habitats of the Teign Valley so please pop along to say hello. I thought that we would have a little focus on the West side of the moor this month with a virtual visit to Lydford Gorge.

Did you know that Lydford Gorge is a temperate rainforest? I treated myself to a walk down to the Devil's Cauldron the other day and it felt like walking through a jungle - with mosses, ferns, lichens, and liverworts covering nearly every surface. Temperate rainforest habitat is globally rare, covering less than 1% of the planet, and is thought to be more scarce than tropical rainforests. In the UK they are only found in the west of the country, and the mild, humid conditions found in Lydford Gorge are what they need to thrive. As the River Lyd and Whitelady Waterfall crash through the gorge they release moisture into the air which helps to keep it lush and green.


We are incredibly fortunate to have such a precious habitat local to us so I do hope you are tempted to come along to explore for yourself. This summer holidays, there will be a free family trail (normal admission prices apply) where you will travel through time to learn how the gorge was formed. The second hand bookshop at Lydford is doing incredibly well so huge thanks to everyone who has supported this by either donating or buying books. All money raised in the bookshop goes directly to helping us to care for the gorge.







This month's Art Box is written by Jane Vincent, artist in residence at Ruth Smith Gallery 24th June – 9th July 2023.



A hot, steep, uphill walk through a field of rattle clattering at my heels to the tune of birdsong brought me to Ashridge Great Barn, already humming with excited conversation and filled with art works. I'd arrived at Red Mud Arts' exhibition. On two levels, large and small artworks were displayed prompting admiration and earnest discussion about techniques, skills and topics. Refreshments and cake contributions fuelled the talk as friends and strangers mingled, drawn in by a common interest in arts. 'How do you work with green?' 'Why don't you sign your paintings?' were among the questions after each artist had spoken about their work and I left with my head buzzing with ideas and feeling good about the two weeks ahead of me. I am in North Tawton as the first of three Summer Artists in Residence awarded by the Ruth Smith Gallery. Creating new opportunities for artists like me, and those in Red Mud Arts, often begins with a few like-minded individuals discovering each other and recognising shared aims. Supporting each other, developing friendships and building networks of contacts establishes a presence in your local community but it doesn't need to stop there. Too often ownership of 'The Arts' is claimed exclusively by establishment institutions and organisations but the reality of art is that it is everywhere, created and generated by us within our communities; we make art part of our everyday lives, often without realising we are doing it. The carefully chosen hand painted signs above our shops & premises, the things we have in our homes, the sewing and crafting we do together in pub rooms and community halls and the gathering of like-minded folk sharing in the successes of others at exhibitions, open mic nights and performances. Sharing what you can do, learning from others, reaching out beyond your boundaries, is rewarding and making work alongside and in the company of others makes for happy lives. Thank you Ruth and Noah, and North Tawton for your friendly welcome and making my visit so fulfilling – my story of the town in stained glass will be full of joyous memories. 
