

From The Rectory

Yet again the winter and the festive season is upon us! Where did the year go? As a family, we are looking forward to our second Christmas in Devon. Last year everything was new and fresh, this year it is beginning to feel like tradition! We are already looking forward to the Santa's grotto in Sampford Courtenay village hall, the Christmas Eve nativity where everyone joins in outside St. Peter's church and the day when we have three carol services one after the other including the unique experiences of the Bondleigh Barn Band playing at Bondleigh church and Carols by candlelight in Honeychurch.

I wonder what traditions you associate with Christmas and what makes it special for you? It might not be Santa's grotto, carol singing or nativities. It might be special times and meals with family. The present giving on Christmas morning, or whenever you give gifts. It might be the Christmas party at work or kicking back on Boxing Day with nothing on the agenda.

When we think of the story of the first Christmas we often think of the crazy, unexpected and unique things which happened. Angels and angelic choirs, dreams from God, a manger as a cot, visits from Shepherds and strangers from a far off land and the virgin birth. But part of the power of the Christmas story is actually the ordinariness of it all. There are two accounts of Jesus' birth in the Bible and they contain all sorts of ordinary details. We read about an old couple struggling with childlessness. We read about a young couple looking forward to their wedding day. We read about family visits to relations. We read

about registering for taxes. We read about the traditions of Jesus' people – circumcision, naming and purification offerings.

Part of the point of the Christmas story is the ordinariness. The baby Jesus was born into an ordinary community, an ordinary family, to people just like us. Jesus was God come to live with us – 'Emmanuel' as he is announced to Joseph his adopted father. But he was not born in a palace or to a priest, but into the ordinary life of his people – Joseph was a carpenter and likely Jesus joined in with the family business. God came to be with us, to experience life with us so he know what our lives are like. He even knows the toughest bits too – Jesus himself was a refugee far from home, hunted by a despotic king set on killing him. God knows the pains of being human.

There's a verse later in the Bible which says:

But when the right time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, ... so that he could adopt us as his very own children.

God's own Son came to earth that first Christmas as the baby Jesus to be one of us so that in the end God could invite us to become his children too. God still holds out that invitation to join his family today. All we need to do is say yes to God.



Vehicle Speed Activation Sign

The Town Council approved the funding for a vehicle speed activation sign in the proximity of De Batheway Estate, to be budgeted for and installed 2024. The Transport Committee has been asked to consider an additional sign in Fore Street.

Christmas display competition

The Town Council is holding a competition with 3 categories.

Best Home window display, Best Business window display, Best Outdoor display.

To meet H&S and insurance requirements, only displays within the 30 m.p.h. limit of the Town will be considered. Judging will take place week commencing 18th December. Please register your entry at the Merry Go Round shop or directly to the Town Clerk/Council office by 10th December. All areas will be visited by the judges. Winners will be announced at Carols in the Square, Christmas Morning.

Clock Tower rebuild

The Town Council has applied for a Certificate of Lawfulness for additional maintenance to the masonry, which is now holding up completion of the canopy rebuild. This is on the instruction of Listed Building Control of WDBC and is out of the hands of the Town Council.

Electric Vehicle Charge Points

The Council is obtaining quotes to install EV charge points in the Town Centre carpark and is working with the Rugby Club and Hembury Homes to provide additional charge points around the Town for public use. A fully funded option is no longer available, and the costs may have to be partially met by the taxpayers of the Parish alongside any available grant funding.

Cemetery Extension Planning Permission

The planning permission for the cemetery extension has been refused due to lack of information. Our planning consultant intends to resubmit the application with the requested information.

Warm Space and Community Fridge/Larder/Freezer

Thanks to grant funding from WDBC, the Town Council is able to continue to fund the warm space initiatives and Jens Café and Merry Go Round. The Community fridge has been expanded to include a freezer and food items donated by local residents are now available from the community fridge. This initiative is to help residents who are struggling to keep warm and need a warm space and a cuppa, get a cheap hot meal, or help themselves to food items that have been donated.

Notice of vacancy

Following the resignation of Cllr. Bath, there is one vacancy on North Tawton Town Council.

A by-election to fill the vacancies will be held if within 14 days of the date of this Notice [10th November 2023] (excluding Saturdays, Sundays, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Day and Bank Holidays) ten electors from the Town give notice in writing to the Returning Officer requiring that such an election be held.

The address of the Returning Officer is West Devon Borough Council, Kilworthy Park, Drake Road, Tavistock, Devon PL19 0BZ. A request for an election can also be scanned and emailed to elections@westdevon.gov.uk, but the document must contain "wet ink" signatures.

If no such notice is given, the Town Council will fill the vacancies through co-option.

Alternatively, we have 2 periods during the meeting when the public can attend and raise matters for the Council to consider, however, unless the matter is already on the agenda, the Council will not be able to offer an immediate response but would carry the item to the next agenda for a formal reply if this is required.





Hi everyone

I hope that you are all keeping well, dodging the wind and rain when it comes and enjoying the rare sunny days.

Before we know it, Christmas will be here (it's already arrived in most shops near me!). The team at Parke will be hosting a local Christmas tree grower at weekends from the end of November who will be selling lovely local Christmas trees. It's a perfect excuse to take a stroll by the river and warm up in Home Farm café.

Castle Drogo will be decorated in a traditional style ready for Christmas. We are fortunate to have lots of photos, letters and diaries which tell us how the Drewe family decorated the castle and we try to match their style as much as possible. We will also be welcoming local choirs, musicians and singers who will perform for us. With the backdrop of the gorgeous architecture, it makes for a little piece of magic. The castle is open every Friday, Saturday and Sunday in the run up to Christmas in December but please check the website for full opening times. There are rumours that a jolly chap in a red coat with a big beard will be visiting us too!



Curriculum requirements have risen, and we have less funding and resources to meet the content and depth the timetable demands. National funding has decreased for all children, and it is harder than it was previously to meet the requirements to obtain additional funding for children with additional needs. Post covid we have seen a rise in children and families with social, emotional and mental health needs (SEMH) which is impacting on the focus of our work in schools. Teaching assistants are taking on increasingly more responsibility in the classroom and more than ever, we are relying on volunteers to support our day-to-day school activities. School staff really do not work 9-4 and switch off for the evenings and weekends as is still sometimes thought and posted on social media. Why do we do it?

Because we love our job and our school community!

Working with children is hugely rewarding. It is a pleasure and a privilege to be part of their learning and development. We get so much joy from being instigator and witness to our children growing in independence and maturity. We celebrate their successes and are there to guide and encourage when they find things challenging. Seeing them learn a new skill, master a tricky problem, develop empathy and compassion is a daily joy for all who work in our school. We are also privileged to work with a great team of colleagues in such a vibrant and supportive community.

This time of year is particularly busy but also hugely rewarding as we learn about and celebrate Christmas. Year 6 will be leading our Christingle service, our younger children will be performing the Nativity, and we will all be making decorations and singing Christmas carols. Our wonderful chefs will be making us a Christmas dinner and our staff will be planning Christmas themed activities for their classes. Our Friends of North Tawton School group (FONTS) are busy organising our Christmas Fair for Friday 24th November, we invite you all to come along and support our school. Please do see our school website to follow our blogs where you will see our news and photos of our learning and celebrations.

On behalf of the staff and children at our school, I wish everyone in our community, and friends and families near and far, a very merry Christmas and very best wishes for the New Year.
