Open Forum ideas/suggestions for SCPC to consider

- PC Additional Salt Box on Franklyn Hill This has been completed
- JM A chlorine test to see if leaking water is Mains or spring water. Not deemed necessary following work of Highways to channel water away from the road
- VM Add Franklyn Hill to list for meeting with Highways etc. Now in the Parish Action Plan
- RR Re-establishing a Sunday Rail Service from SC Station would ease isolation felt by some residents at The Beeches. Has not been possible with ongoing negotiations and was voted by Oke Rail not to support will continue to consider options for the future
- RR 20mph limit from New Inn to Langdale (20's Plenty Campaign) DBP- State of roads with pot holes etc Request for information regarding the 20's plenty campaign have been responded to but would need co-operation of whole village due to conservation area as well as planning advice due to listed building restrictions
- DBP when utilities close the roads can they signpost where exactly the road is closed. Report It website. https://www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/report-a-problem/
- RW Parked cars in the parish make it difficult for emergency vehicles to pass. Has been reiterated again in the Chairs recent letter
- ATG more maintenance of Parish footpaths & more dog waste bins. Maintenance is ongoing iss ue of dog poo has been raised in recent Chairs letter
- NC Official signs throughout Parish to ask visitors and parishioners to pick up after their dog. DBP Notices to remind dog owners to keep dogs on a lead across fields with stock in them. See Chairs letter
- JM would like to see the wider farming businesses included in the parish priorities. Has been added as a priority and farmers were supported during spate of sheep worrying
- CC Encourage Natural environment preservation in the parish.
- PC DCC "Red Post" scheme for no cut areas on verges.
- VM History Project to include Farming, Prayer Book Rebellion, Courtenay Family and 1925 sale of properties by King's College, Cambridge. Veronica is in fact speaking at up coming Prayerbook Rebellion event
- DBP better signage and promotion of parish amenities eg Village Green, Prayer Book Rebellion display in church etc.
- LP A parish history timeline Started as part of the steering group for the Prayerbook Rebellion Event
- LP Priority re new housing in the parish (eg to include affordable homes) Is addressed through Planning Policy and review and response to every application reported
- LP Carbon reduction plan does the parish need an Electric recharging point? Discussion and research show that this is being considered at community locations in the Parish
- LP Cost of Living is this an issue for the parish and how could this be supported? Information and literature is circulated and distributed through the Parish Groups via different media sources of support available particularly from DCC and WDBC
