
SAMPFORD COURTENAY.

The funeral of Mr. J. H. Snell, yeoman, of Dornaford, has taken place. Deceased, who had been ill for some time, had been a little better for a few weeks, but suddenly collapsed. He was a staunch Unionist and used to take the Chair at political meetings. For a number of years he was a member of the old School Board. The Rev. H. B. Burnaby officiated at the funeral. The hymn "The King of Love, my Shepherd is" was sung, and "O Rest in the Lord" was played on the organ as the mourners left the church. The mourners were Miss E. M. Snell, neice (Redruth), Mr. S. REDRUTH BENEFICIARIES. — Mr. John Huxtable Snell, of Dornaford, Sampford Courtenay, Devon, yeoman, who died on August 14th, left estate of the gross value of £19,168, with net personalty £2,810. Probate of his will has been granted to his cousins, Samuel Snell, retired farmer, of Courtenay House, Redruth, and John Snell, confectioner, of Covecnack, Mount Ambrose, Redruth. He left £2,000 to his niece, Mary Snell, £100 to his cousin, William Snell; his property, Dornaford, with the live and dead stock and implements thereon and his household effects not otherwise bequeathed to his cousin, John Snell, subject to the payment of £500 to his sister Mary Jane Brook; £300 to the vicar and churchwardens of Sampford Courtenay for the upkeep of the graveyard; and, subject to some smaller legacies, the residue of the property equally between Samuel Snell, Edith Snell, and Mary Snell.


