Samuel KNIGHT

Recorded in The Western Times of 9 June 1933:

"We regret to announce the death of an old and much respected inhabitant in the person of Mr Samuel KNIGHT. Born at Hatherleigh he came here as a young man and settled down and carried on the business of village shoemaker. He was Secretary to the Women's Friendly Society for a number of years, also Clerk of the Parish Church for over 40 years. He was a great lover of sport, especially fox hunting. Sam Knight was always among the runners when the hounds met nearby. The funeral took place on Tuesday, the Rector officiating. The Church wardens led the way from the lynch gate to the church and from there to the grave side. Mr Mills, organist, played "O Rest in Lord" as the procession entered the church. The hymn "Thy way, not mine, O Lord" was sung. The grave was lined with ivy and flowers by the Rector and Mrs Burnaby, the Union Jack was flown at half-mast, and a muffled peal was rung after the service.
