From The Rectory

People were also bringing babies to Jesus for him to place his hands on them. When the disciples saw this, they rebuked them. Jesus called the children to him and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." (Luke 18:15-17)

"Jesus loves the little children" – I remember singing at Sunday School – and how true we see that is in this little incident from Jesus' life. Jesus welcomes the children to come to him. His followers thought Jesus was too important and busy to give time to babies and children, but Jesus not only welcomed them, but said that we can actually learn from children.

Jesus tells us that we need to receive the kingdom of God like a child. The kingdom of God here is short for all the good things God wants to give us – help, healing, hope and forgiveness. And Jesus tells us we need to receive it as a child. Now as a parent I know that sometimes children receive gifts in a grabby and greedy way – but that's not what Jesus has in mind here. He is thinking about the complete trust that children naturally have. Children know they are utterly dependant on others and are open in their trust of the adults in their lives.

Here is how Jesus teaches us to relate to our heavenly

Father too. With complete trust in his loving goodness, recognizing that we are dependent completely on him for every good thing. And that is hard for most of us adults! This is reflected in the Lord's Prayer (here the shorter version that Luke records) – notice how it is all about us coming to God with that child-like trust and dependence.

'Father,

hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come.

Give us each day our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins,

for we also forgive everyone who sins against

And lead us not into temptation.'

North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Did somebody say 'General Election'? Does it feel like no one is talking about anything else? I can safely say that the subject has come up more than once or twice, over the morning porridge, as husband and I start the day. But what if things were a bit different? What if you could vote for a real alternative? What if the W.I. were to appear on the ballot paper?? Has that made you say 'at last — a bunch of sensible (!), practical, no-nonsense people who will sort things out properly'. Would it have Rishi and Keir quaking in their boots/running for the hills/staying at home and not even bothering to produce an election manifesto? Sometimes I wonder if the initials W.I. should stand for 'Women with Initiative' or 'Women with Ideas'. Husband has a suggestion. This should be interesting. I'll save it for the bottom paragraph.

Rosemary Griggs was our June speaker – cunningly disguised as 'Bessie' an Elizabethan servant. Rosemary's first visit to us, a few years ago, was as Lady Katherine Champernowne – the mother of Sir Walter Raleigh. Rosemary not only gave us a detailed history of Lady Katherine but was dressed head to foot in full authentic costume from the 16th century. This time she was dressed in servants clothing complete with a woollen cap made from 'good Devon wool'. Rosemary started her talk in character, as Bessie, and then reverted to herself to tell us more about Bessie's life and experiences – from losing her parents to 'the pestilence', then being taken to 'the big house at Modbury' where she learnt to sew and help with the mending. She also spent time working in the laundry, the kitchens and the still room where she would use a pestle and mortar to grind locally gathered herbs to make potions. Bessie then became a lady's maid, moving away from Modbury to Ottery where she worked for Lady Katherine. Rosemary makes all the costumes she wears to portray her characters and tries to use authentic materials (i.e. wool and linen. She has also learnt the different stitching required, such as blackwork embroidery, so the finished outfits are as close as possible to those worn during the period. Being passionate about Tudor times and using her research into the forgotten women of history has led Rosemary to write two novels, 'A Woman of Noble Wit' and 'The Dartington Bride' both set in Devon. Together with her love of theatre, re-enactment and her creation of 16th century clothing she has often been called a Devonian Time Traveller – a very fitting description.

If we have returned safely from our Mystery Trip, we can look forward to a Wine Tasting event at Ten Acres Vineyard at Winkleigh. I think it involves tasting five wines including a sparkling wine. Did you know there is such a thing as wine tasting etiquette? I've just read it on-line. It's hilarious. Talks about avoiding 'backsplash'.

Back to husband's suggestion for an alternative meaning for W.I. 'Women who do Ironing' Does he have any idea how much trouble he might be in?

Friday evening was a profuse buffet supper at the Bowling Club in North Tawton followed by a very competitive quiz and a raffle. Many thanks to all those who contributed food to fill the tables and prizes for the bi-lingual quiz. The balcony overlooking the green provided a wonderful sunny spot for the whole group photograph.



Saturday's trip was to the Taw Brewery to admire the medieval house with its Tudor features and the traditional brewery in the threshing barn with the tower that may once have been a cider press. The spring that the brewery uses is in a 400 year old structure, listed at Grade 2*. It has never run dry and nor did the ales and ciders that were happily sampled in beautiful sunshine.



The Sculpture School... a DECADE in Devon

The Sculpture School – the UK's only venue for realist sculpture training – is celebrating its 10th anniversary in Devon. To mark this milestone, it will be holding a major exhibition from 24th June to 7th July showcasing a DECADE of talent.

With its unique and innovative method of producing modern realist sculpture in simple steps, the school attracts students from all over the world. Under the inspirational leadership of husband-and-wife team, Master sculptor Andrew Sinclair, MRSS, and Diane Coates-Sinclair, the North Tawton venue has become a sculpture sanctuary with school, gallery, workshop, luxury accommodation and sculpture garden.

Courses run from a one-day taster, through four-day in-depth animal and human sculpture, to a one-year curriculum. Enthusiastic amateurs, professional sculptors and artists, school leavers, retirees – and even plastic surgeons – have all visited this Devon centre of sculpting expertise.

A current 'One Year' student explains: "Andrew Sinclair has brilliantly developed an organised figurative sculpting method which can only be described as a breakthrough. After a humbling decade of courses with sculptors in Florence, Paris and New York, I had almost lost hope that I would ever be able to design my own sculptures or apply the anatomical importance I wanted in figurative sculpture."

News From North Tawton Community Primary School



Extracurricular Learning at North Tawton Primary School

I hope when you look back upon your school days, you have happy memories. Mine are very mixed, but one aspect of my education I remember clearly and with great fondness are the school trips I went on. I remember the excitement of looking forward to having time out of the classroom, to experience something new and different, to have a break from the routine. At the time, I did not realise how these trips were shaping my future, providing cultural experiences and giving me safe opportunities for developing my independence.

As I look back upon this school year, I am pleased that all our children have had exciting and interesting lessons in school, enhanced by extracurricular experiences facilitated by going on visits, attending events and by having visitors to our school.

Mr. Letch made a huge impact upon our children when he spoke so openly and frankly about living with a disability. He surprised us all with the skills he has developed to overcome his physical limitations and had us really challenge misconceptions and preconceived ideas we may have had about disability. Many children went home and tried to write using their toes to hold a pencil, though we did not recommend trying to peel a potato with their toes – that's for experts like Mr. Letch!

Mr. Fox told Year Six about his memories of the second world war. He was young but remembers clearly surviving a plane crashing into his house! He spoke about his family and what it was like growing up in the aftermath of the war. Day visits to RHS Rosemoor, Paignton Zoo and Plymouth Aquarium enabled our younger pupils to see the living world, learn about life cycles, understand how animals and plants have adapted over time to suit changing environments and learn about conservation.

Anglo-Saxon history was brought to life for Year Four when they visited Escot. They made bread, whittled wood, experienced a blacksmith and etched runes. Year Five and Six learnt more about life in Tudor times when local historians Marion Pratt and David Botting Page taught them about the events which led to the local historical event known as The Prayer Book Rebellion. They also engaged in Tudor crafts making pomanders and quills. Marion and David even dressed up for the part!

To understand more about French culture, use their French language skills and learn more about World War Two, Year Six spent a week in Normandy. This year held even more significance as the class were there during the commemorations for the 80th anniversary of D Day. They saw the landing beaches where soldiers came ashore and this history was brought to life in the 360 degree cinema at Arromanches. Visits to Pegasus Bridge and Saint Mere Eglise told stories of individuals who entered occupied France in gliders or via parachutes in order to liberate the country. A particular highlight for all was attending a ceremony for the 100 year-old veteran Cecil Newton, during which the King and Queen drove past and waved at everyone!


Meanwhile back in North Tawton, our eldest pupils attended the service where the D Day flag was hoisted in our town. Four pupils held the flag as it was blessed, a huge honour and privilege.

I hope that when our pupils look back on their school days, they have fond lasting memories of the experiences they have had both in and out of the classrooms.




SAMPFORD COURTENAY OPEN MEETING 2024



I hope that you are all well. As I write, June has turned in to March with high winds and heavy rain forecast. The weather is certainly keeping us on our toes.

May and June have been packed full of lots of lovely events and activities. We had a visit at Castle Drogo by Exeter University renewable energy students, MED theatre led a drama and creative writing session for local primary schools at Finch Foundry, a Mossy Carpet was created at Parke, Lydford and Drogo, the Disabled Ramblers visited Lydford Gorge and we marked Carers Week by welcoming unpaid carers and the Devon Carers team to our places. It is such a pleasure to be connecting with so many wonderful local groups and organisations and for the places in our care to offer respite, inspiration and joy to so many people.

We also thanked our wonderful team of volunteers in Volunteers Week. We have 300 volunteers across Dartmoor – these are the fantastic people who share stories with you in our buildings, help care for wildlife habitats, keep our gardens beautiful or give you a lift in the buggy. Volunteers are involved in every area of our work and every place in our care. Huge thanks to everyone who gives their time to enable us to share these incredible places with so many people.

Coming up, as we head in to summer, we are hosting work experience students from local secondary schools, providing placements and training for Exeter University students, welcoming group visits by local groups, holding outdoor theatre events and preparing for our stands at various local shows including Chagford Show and Lustleigh Show. I very much hope to see some of you at the shows and let's hope the weather cheers up by August!

Finally, I have an exciting and equally terrifying announcement to share with you. This September, I will be part of a small team of Dartmoor National Trust folks embarking on a challenging 108 mile trek around Dartmoor. Starting on Friday 20th September from Castle Drogo, we are going to walk the whole route of the Dartmoor Way in 8 days – a 108 mile circular route which loops around the National Park.

Our aim is to raise money towards getting a fully accessible Changing Places Toilet on Dartmoor. As well as raising funds, we want to raise awareness that, although there are Changing Places Toilets in Exeter, Plymouth, Tavistock and Bovey Tracey, there isn't currently a Changing Place Toilet with hoist and adult sized changing area on Dartmoor. The difference this provision would have for people is significant.

I know that times are hard for so many people and money is tight, but I would be really grateful for any support.
