Parish Priorities

At our recent meeting we set out a series of priorities which will drive our agenda in the coming year. These include 1. Deliver Safer Roads; 2. Maintain and Enhance our Historic Heritage; 3. Development of the Village Green; 4. Re-opening of Sampford Courtenay Station; 5. Improvement of the Public Toilets; and 6. Supporting Agricultural and Rural Business.

We now seek your input on how best to proceed against two of these priorities – both of which involve making choices about how best to direct our limited financial resources.

Development of the Village Green

Currently, the Village Green features an area of cut grass where games (football, cricket etc.) can be played, a set of swings and a climbing frame. All of these need regular maintenance. The equipment is nearing the end of its life, so the opportunity exists to either repair, rejuvenate or dismantle the current facilities. *If we were to pursue the medium or high-cost routes, money would need to be raised from a combination of grants, parish council funds and local fund raising*.

Improvement of the Public Toilets

The public toilets up by the Village Hall were built in the late 1980s and have since been improved and redecorated. Compliance with the Disability Discrimination Act of 1999, requires a fundamental redesign of the current facilities to enable access for those with disabilities. A plan has now been drawn up and costed and we need to find out how you would like us to proceed.
