





Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Let's get this out of the way. I've been told (by a weather station worshipper that gazes at his weather station a lot more than he gazes at me) that you all want to know how much rainfall we had in March this year compared to last year. So pay attention please – the total rainfall for March 2024 was 162 mm. – and the total rainfall for March 2025 was.......(I think a drumroll feels appropriate)a meagre 3.6 mm. Shocking, isn't it? You've had to put down your mug of coffee/piece of toast/copy of Roundabout and look for a pen so you can write it in your diary. If you've got a diary that is. Husband has. It's full of weathery stuff and statistics of course. No notes of a certain persons birthday or any other significant dates like a wedding anniversary. Just saying....

Our speaker for March was Grahame Flynn from 'Devon in Sight'. A charity that, I'm fairly sure, not many of us were familiar with. Devon in Sight is a sight loss charity providing incredible support for those with no sight, partial sight, their families, friends and carers with it's main aim being to make Devon a sight loss friendly county. Grahame's talk was packed with interesting facts and information so here are just a few of the points that he shared with us.

There are over two million people in the UK living with sight loss severe enough to have an impact on their daily living – with an estimated 51,000 people with sight loss living in Devon. The most common reason for a hospital outpatient appointment is because of eye health and the most common cause of sight loss in the over 50's is age related macular degeneration. We could potentially prevent 50% of sight loss cases in the UK just by getting our eyes tested. Our eyes require four times the light needed as a teenager, once we are 70, in order to read.

Following an explanation of how our eyes work, Grahame talked about common eye conditions including uncorrected refractive error – which could be corrected by simply wearing appropriately prescribed glasses. Devon in Sight is committed to providing accurate information, advice and guidance and has a variety of easily accessible resources including a sight loss helpline, a very informative website, their 'In Vision' magazine, a Health and Wellbeing Service and an Independent Living Service that aims to ensure that people have access to equipment and training to maintain a safe level of independence. They have recently created a new service called 'Works for Me' which is an employment hub dedicated to supporting visually impaired people with looking for work or a change in career.

The charity can arrange for you to have weekly supportive 'ChitChat' telephone calls, free fire safety home visits, formal counselling sessions and can refer people in to cutting edge clinical trials and research. Grahame's enthusiasm and passion for this charity left us in no doubt that, under his leadership – and with his dedicated team of staff and volunteers, Devon in Sight will continue to go from strength to strength.



There will be a display in the library containing books on the topic of Dementia and come in to chat to staff about our Reading Well collections to find out more about what they offer.


Citizens Advice Bureau & Healthwatch Information Stand

News from North Tawton School



Adolescence



There has been much talk about the Netflix drama 'Adolescence,' a four-part drama about the radicalisation of a 13-year-old boy. If you haven't watched it, I highly recommend it. The acting is superb, and the filming is innovative as it is all one take, including the use of a drone. While it is a fictional piece, it has caused a media storm due to schools, agencies and individuals recognising the themes raised in the story as ones they are experiencing in real life.

It will not spoil the story to say that the child commits a heinous crime for which he shows little remorse due to the brainwashing he has experienced online. As the story unfolds, we, the viewer, are shocked as he does not deny the crime, simply states he has done 'nothing wrong.'

The protagonist is a boy from a white working family. His upbringing is not at all extraordinary. He lives in a house in a typical town, with his mum, dad and sister, with contact to his extended family. He is bright and doing well in school. In other words, he is a 'normal kid' from a 'normal family.' This is uncomfortable for those who may have thought this story could only apply to a child with learning, family or social barriers.

In the drama, there are some irritating tropes about secondary school. I can assure you our local secondaries are not like this, but it does portray the gulf between younger and older people. We adults are not always aware of the culture our children are living. While this may have always been the case in terms of music and fashion, arguably as it should be, this drama highlights the language our youngsters are using, specifically emojis, can have a deep and dark meaning we adults are unaware of, and this therefore impedes our ability to safeguard them.

Schools have long been warning parents of the dangers online, but our focus has very much been warning of predators who are seeking out children to meet and harm in real life. The threat of radicalisation is more subtle and harder to detect. Internet users do not have to seek it out, it will find them through Tik Tok, memes and gaming.

While the internet remains a fantastic resource, it can be powerful and dangerous if not understood and manged with skill. Next term, the staff at North Tawton will be looking closely at how we can continue to improve our work in safeguarding children from radicalisation. We will look at how we can further enhance our work in raising a pupil's self-esteem, teaching critical reading and thinking skills as well as healthy use of internet and safe online behaviour. As always, I ask that our families monitor their children's use of the internet and do not give unlimited unsupervised access. It is also important for all of us as adults to remain open to learning about new things, reaching out to our young people by talking to them and asking about their lives and always modelling healthy and respectful behaviours. 

Our President welcomed everyone, and introduced Angela Dodd-Compton, who gave a talk about The Italian Garden at Great Ambrook, a hidden garden that was discovered by accident near Ipplepen in 1988, and since then it has been uncovered to reveal an incredible garden.

Over the last 20 years Angela has been instrumental in finding out that the house of Great Ambrook and the 4 acre garden was owned by Arthur Smith-Graham who inherited a great wealth from his wealthy tea merchant family and bought the house and adjacent farm in 1899 at the age of 28, and commissioned T.H. Lyon to design the garden with Lewis Bearne building it, who also built Castle Drogo and Bovey Castle. Arthur Smith-Graham died in 1928 aged 56, who as a homosexual commissioned the garden as a secret retreat from society for his Oxbridge friends, leaving behind the beautiful Italian Garden, consisting of a tennis court, plunge pool, swimming pool, summer house and a hot house. In the 1960's after the estate had been sold numerous times, the walled garden became forgotten, and overgrown. It was down to Angela and through her work of discovery that the garden secured Grade II listed status with English Heritage. Members were left feeling totally immersed in the story of discovery that Angela told and thoroughly enjoyed her amazing voyage into the life of Arthur Smith-Graham.

Ten members enjoyed a visit to The Red Earth Group meeting hosted by Morchard Bishop WI, with a talk from wildlife photographer Stephen Powles, followed by a lovely supper.

Our Coffee and Cake morning, including a plant stall is organised for Saturday 10th May at Exbourne Hall 10-12. Hopefully this will be supported and enjoyed by everyone in the area.

Den Brook Community Fund -Investing in our Local Communities

Background:


The Den Brook Community Fund was established in 2017 by the wind farm owners and is administered by Renewal Energy Systems Ltd. It provides grant funding for charities, not-for-profit organisations and social clubs based in the parishes of Bow, North Tawton, South Tawton, Spreyton and Zeal Monachorum. The Fund Committee is made up of two Parish Councillors from each of the Parish Council's who meet twice a year to vote on grant applications for Capital-funded project proposals received over a six month period.

Local Investment of over £400,000:

Over the last eight years, the Committee have approved **78 grants** totalling **£418,385.33**. The grant amounts ranged from £250.00 to £20,000 and have included provision of toys for a toddler group and camping equipment for the Scouts and Guides, up to contributions toward large building restoration projects. The Cost/Benefit scoring system together with other key assessment criteria enable the Committee to assess project proposals on a consistent basis.

Spread of Investment by Parish:

The Service Level Agreement signed by the Parishes in 2015 defined the formula (based partly on parish populations) by which the total fund is shared by each parish. The chart below illustrates how that has worked in practice over the last eight years.




Benefits to the Local Community:

THE ART BOX – May 2025

I couldn't decide which to write about for this month's Art Box, there's so much that's on or has happened this month, so hold on to your seats as I'm going to try and mention everything!

We've recently said goodbye to our Australian artist in residence, Damon Kowarsky, who has been drawing in and around North Tawton in order to turn them into his exquisite etchings and aquatints. He's hoping to have a show of the finished works next year, so do keep an eye out for that! My uncle, Neil Musson, is working on an art installation at Exeter Cathedral, based on their collection of medieval wax votive offerings (the only remaining in the UK!). His art duo, Musson + Retallick, have been running workshops inviting people to mould something they're grateful for out of wax blanks they've cast from 100kg of Devon beeswax! (I found it a surprisingly meditative process, and by the sounds of it it's been pretty profound for a lot of people). The finished installation 'From The Vow Made', will include suspending these 1000 objects moulded by 1000 people in the cathedral nave, opening on the 31st May for a few days. Do check it out!

A day trip to St. Ives meant a compulsory visit to the Tate gallery, where there's an exhibition of Ithell Colquhoun's work. She was interested in mysticism, the subconscious and surrealism, and the works were a really interesting balance of allowing the painting materials to lead the picture-making process, whilst also demonstrating a huge amount of care and attention to detail. A trip to Anima Mundi (a wonderful contemporary gallery with beautiful exhibitions in the middle of St. Ives) was almost a sad moment as the sign on the door read 'closed for installing new exhibition', but at the perfect moment Jamie, who works there, walked past and said we could have a sneaky peek mid-install. The show, called Murmurations, is based on how in a murmuration each starling only considers the placement of around seven of its nearest neighbours, not the entire flock. Quite a timely idea to consider I think- both as a warning but also a hopeful and important message of our own individual empowerment.

The Red Mud Arts Critique Group has been developing an exhibition, 'Dreams of Togetherness', for 25th April – 7th May at Manor Street Galleries in Plymouth. The title conjures positive feelings of closeness and love, but also painful feelings of distance and a deep longing for something that has broken down or never was. What is clear from the artists' interpretation though, is that we are wired to desire connection and harmony. This has been expressed through the lens of mental health, sustainability, politics, and more personal connections. We hope you can make it! The opening event is 25th April, and there'll be a themed open mic event on 2nd May.

On the 10th May, 10-5 at Crediton Arts Centre Shivdev has organised a clowning workshop with international clown and yogi, Annie Lockerbie Newton. Annie writes: 'In this unsettled and confusing world, there has never been a better time to embrace the absurd art of clowning! In this workshop, we explore how to embrace failure and chaos, re-learn how to play, and experience a different way of looking at the world - through the eyes of a ridiculous, innocent clown! We so often take things far too seriously, but clowning reminds us of the lightness and absurdity in life.' It sounds like it's going to be a great laugh! Finally, it's a good time to say I'm having an exhibition in the gallery at the beginning of June so do come up to North Tawton's Square at some point to see it! More details to follow.


