

From The Rectory

I urge you, brothers and sisters, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit,

to join me in my struggle by praying to God for me. (Romans 15:30)

As I write, we are just emerging from our first experience of exams as a family. Not only a chance for children to get stressed, but parents too. Many of us have had children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews sitting exams in the past months – we may even have had the delight to be sitting them ourselves! For me it was an opportunity to be shocked at "how things have changed since I was a kid" and to hear the stories of those who sat exams even further back in the past. It is a communal rite of passage – particularly if like me you were a clueless teenage boy when you sat your GCSEs and little idea they were important. When I did realise it was a fast introduction into taking responsibility for myself!

But even with exams, as with all we face in life, we don't need to face such trials and responsibilities alone. We can share our stresses and worries with others around us – a problem shared is a problem halved. It makes such a difference and gives us a better perspective when we share our problems whether with a friend, family member or counsellor.

Prayer gives us an opportunity to also share our worries and stresses with God – the Bible tells us:

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God,

which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7)

What an encouraging promise! I have certainly known that peace from Jesus when I have brought the stresses I have been facing to God in prayer.

But there's one other level to this – we can pray for each other. When we hear from others about the trials or stresses they are facing our instinctive reaction is to want to solve their problems. But so often in reality there is little we can do, and that can be frustrating. But as Paul wrote in the Bible quote I began with, we can *join them in their struggles* by praying to God for them.

Try Praying is simply a seven day practical introduction on how to pray to God and how it can change your life. It is aimed at anyone – whether you've tried praying before or not. Why



North Tawton Afternoon W.I.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

The anticipation is unbearable. Expectations are high, Disappointment may be lurking. Could these be the opening phrases from a best-selling crime novel? That would be a 'no'. Just the usual feelings husband has prior to the first dig of his spuds. Everything above the ground is looking good – but is there anything waiting below? I stand nervously holding the basket – as the 'teddy digger' is carefully pulled through the soil I wonder if Alison Hernandez, Police and Crime Commissioner for Devon and Cornwall, grows her own spuds? Forgot to ask her the other day when she came to our group meeting. And what an incredibly interesting talk she gave us. Alison started by talking about her early career with Plymouth City Council and how, with mentorship from the Police, she was supported to 'get things done' and how she learnt the importance of the Police working hand in hand with the Community. She explained that although Plymouth has won numerous awards for it's 'City Vision' over the past 20 years, they have also had their fair share of tragedies and bad news such as the Keyham mass shooting tragedy. A large part of her role is holding the Police to account over their actions and setting the strategic direction and priorities for Devon and Cornwall police through the police and crime plan. This includes setting the police budget and the local police precept. One of her success stories was the organisation and management of policing for the G7 summit which was held in Cornwall in 2021 – it went 'very smoothly with no angry protests' – (although there would have been a very angry protest if Joe Biden had put the jam and cream on his scone in the wrong order)

When it comes to crime, Devon and Cornwall has been top of the table for the lowest crime ratings – currently we are ninth. Alison explained that, unfortunately, violent crime (with or without injury) forms the bulk of crimes committed in Devon and Cornwall with much linked to drug dependency. Many cases are taking as long as two years to get to court and, because of this, it is really difficult to keep victims engaged in the process. Alison went on to talk about the 'Prisoners Building Homes' programme which is being led by the five South West Police and Crime Commissioners – this was set up to enable prisoners to be employed and trained by modular housing providers to build low carbon modular homes for local communities and vulnerable people. It provides an opportunity for prisoners to learn new and useful skills which could lead to secure employment on their release from prison. Alison concluded her talk by asking us to please report any crimes that we see – as the criminal justice system can only work effectively if members of the public help by reporting anything that we think is suspicious.

Time for something more uplifting. Gently competitive, but fun. Anyone for bowls? So one recent sunny afternoon saw a group of WI ladies in the stunning surroundings of North Tawton Bowls Club attempting to learn how to send their bowl smoothly over the beautifully manicured green in the direction of the jack. As anticipated, it's not as easy as it might look when a seasoned bowler does it – but it was a lot of fun. And some of our novice bowlers produced some pretty reasonable results. And the cake was perfect. Oh ves – there was tea and cake to round off a fabulous afternoon.

Our Mystery Trip is just around the corner. I've checked the weather forecast and it's all looking good at the moment. It's a bit of a lottery tho' isn't it? A leap of faith. Piling on to a coach with no idea where you're going. I mean, what do you wear? Should I wear walking shoes/boots or strappy sandals/flip flops? Do I take a coat just in case? What about snacks? Will I have time to write postcards? So many questions. Back to the teddy digger. Was it a hit or a miss? Well lovely readers – it was a HIT!! The soil fell away and there they were. Beaming back at him. Everyone relax – we have spuds and all is well with the world. By the way. Bet you didn't know that May 30th was International Potato Day. Husband didn't. BONDLEIGH RAINFALL

May was another 'dry' month with only 34.9mm. Much of it falling in small amounts at the end of the month. This compared to 111.5mm last year.



As well as spending time developing their 3-year-old ³/₄ acre garden including building ornamental ponds, and a waterfall, at Mowhay, Merton, Neil also has the role as social media for the NGS, and Kerry is the assistant county organiser for North West Devon. She has an enthusiastic passion for gardening and has designed and planned their own garden. Kerry's journey into the Nation Garden Scheme, started some eight years ago, living in Hampshire when she convinced the county organiser to include their small suburban garden into the Scheme. The scheme has raised over £70 million, since it began and now opens over 3,500 gardens a year. Since 1948 and the creation of the NHS it has changed the nature of the support it gives, now supporting Marie Curie, Macmillan, Hospice UK, and many others.

Finding My Voice: From Therapy Room to Local Pages

Before my husband and I retired and moved to beautiful North Tawton, I spent many years as a psychotherapist and counsellor. It was a career that profoundly shaped how I see the world, and indeed, how I write. I vividly remember my tutor once telling me that clients will keep telling their story until they truly feel it has been heard. I think, in a way, that's precisely why I write — to give voice to observations and experiences, and hopefully, to be heard. People, and perhaps even more so, the intricate relationships between them, have always fascinated me. In my professional life, I was given the incredible privilege of stepping into other people's lives, often at their most vulnerable moments — when they were feeling depressed, anxious, or facing overwhelming emotional challenges. Being with someone as they wrestled with a problem often meant that my most important role was simply to listen and observe. This is where I truly learned the value of noticing the smallest things; the tiny, often overlooked details in people's everyday lives. It's often this very detail, the seemingly mundane rhythm of daily existence, that I find myself drawn to writing about.

There's something deeply connecting about sharing our own vulnerabilities, especially when we're with someone who is feeling vulnerable themselves. I believe it's a powerful way we can feel truly connected to one another. So, many of the pieces I write explore things that have genuinely affected me over the years.

I'm a passionate advocate for the strength and resourcefulness of women, particularly older women. As many of you know, I'm an active member of our local WI. It's no secret that both older women and organisations like the WI are sometimes unfairly seen as boring or outdated. I have a real ambition to overturn that idea! Being the age I am, with the wealth of life experience I've accumulated, offers me an endless supply of material from which to draw. There are so many stories to tell, so much wisdom to share.

I wouldn't necessarily consider myself a "writer" in the grand sense, although I suppose anyone who puts words on paper technically is! While I harbour a secret dream of one day writing a novel, I'm content for now with my current path. The pieces I typically create are usually brief and observational. I write about relationships, the world I see around me, my internal thoughts, and the multifaceted experience of being a woman. Sometimes, I draw from my professional life, given that I've worked with thousands of people over the years — each with their own unique and fascinating story worthy of being told.

Having the opportunity to read my words aloud, and then to have others truly listen to what I've written, is possibly one of the most scary, nerve-wracking, yet incredibly exciting things I've ever done. I'm so grateful to Red Mud Arts for allowing me to do this at their open mic nights held right here in town. And I'm thrilled that I've been invited to share some of my work at an event being held at The Bookery in Crediton on July 17th. I hope to see some friendly faces there!

News from Sampford Courtenay Parish Council June 2025

The Council has welcomed a new Part time Clerk and Finance Officer - Alan Matthewman. Alan also holds these roles in Alverdiscott and Huntshaw Parish Council & High Bickington Parish Council.

The Council held its Annual General Parish Meeting at which Michele Wilson was re-elected as Chair and Mike Carpenter was re-elected at Vice Chair.

The meeting was followed by the Annual Parish Meeting which 24 people attended. Mike Carpenter updated the meeting on progress of renewing the footpath leading to and through the village green. This will when completed offer greater accessibility along the Waterpath (from the Square) and onto the green. Further discussion is to take place regarding the equipment on the Green as some of the children's play sites are needing repair or replacement. It is proposed to create a project that will consider the options and the funding for future equipment. The recent survey indicated that residents were happy to apply a medium spend of > £5000 to improving the facilities on the green. Andrew Green gave an update on behalf of the Village Hall on works that had been completed. New events are being planned to meet the needs of the Community but the Trustees continue to promote the very popular food events expanding from the Big Breakfast, and community lunches to the new pop up Indonesian Events. Chris Richards gave an update on behalf of St. Andrew's Church including considerations for the future use of the Church rooms, opportunities for fund raising concerts in the Church and proposed works to upgrade the pathway to the church to improve accessibility. Following on from the Thermal Image Camera Project that took place between February and April, Tamar Energy Community will be bringing more information and presenting Energy saving Opportunities at the Village Fete on 29th June at the Village Hall.

Plus following on from our most recent Defibrillator Training SWAST will also be at the Fete on the 29th providing information and advice on how to save lives and best practice for the use of the defibrillator in the Square

Twinning Visit of Friends of Grainville Langannerie

A group of 15 friends from Lapford and North Tawton have just returned from a visit to their twin town of Grain-ville Langannerie in Normandy.On arrival at their "Salle de Fetes" (Town Hall) they were given a civic reception during which Peter Henshaw, chairman of the English twining committee, and Chantal Lefèvre, his counterpart from Grainville-Langannerie, renewed the charter uniting Lapford and Grainville-Langannerie. This visit celebrated 50 years of Twinning between the two towns.

At the welcoming ceremony Chantal Lefèvre, chairman for 42 years, retraced the history of these exchanges. "Their origins date back to September 9, 1974," she explained. Mr. Potel, then Mayor, had received a circular from Mr. Destors, vice-president of the General Council, proposing a twinning with a town in Devon. This initiative took shape during the conference of English towns in Devon twinned with those in Calvados, which Mr. Potel attended on October 12, 1974. It resulted, in April 1975, in a merger with the town of Lapford, "chosen because of its population of around 700 inhabitants and its agricultural and commercial activities, perfectly suited to Grainville-Langannerie." Since then, Grainvillais and Lapfordiens meet regularly, most often during May half-term, alternating between Lapford and Grainville-Langannerie. "Over the years, the partnership has been enriched by numerous official visits, school exchanges and private meetings between families. These exchanges have strengthened the human and cultural ties between our two nations."

This four-day exchange continued the tradition: with a visit to Bird Hill (Municipal Gardens reclaimed from an ancient landfill site) and the castles of Caen and Vendeuvre; an afternoon of games; and a barbecue evening with dancing, which included an old English favourite of the "Okey Cokey", plus other excursions to places around Caen and the D Day Beaches with our particular hosts.

We sadly had to leave on Sunday. But we hope that our French friends will come and visit us in England next year. If you feel like getting involved and are happy to host some of our French guests next year – please contact Marion Pratt marion 174@btinternet.com


