

## **From The Rectory**

See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. (Isaiah 43:19)

What is God doing in Devon? This was the title of an event I recently attended – and what an encouragement it was to hear all the positive things which are going on in Devon. We heard of churches growing with new people joining – mostly younger people. We heard about new initiatives and the ways in which God is transforming lives in Devon. It felt like the words of that quote above from Isaiah 43 – God is doing a new thing among us. What an encouragement to match the beautiful sun of a May bank holiday weekend! But actually, this is not just a Devon thing. The Christian publisher SPCK on their blog from 20<sup>th</sup> March reported that Bible sales have grown by 87% over the past four years. They wrote:

> Gen Z is driving a surge in Bible sales, seeking meaning, mental well-being, and faith through Scripture like never before.

Likewise, the Bible society's report A Quiet Revival - based on a survey of 19,000 adults by YouGov suggested there has been a 56% rise in monthly church attendance since 2018 particularly among 18-24 year old men where 21% of them claim to attend church at least once a month. And the research showed that God seemed to be doing something important through this. The report comments:

With much of the population, in particular young people, struggling with mental health, loneliness

and a loss of meaning in life, Church appears to be offering an answer. We found that churchgoers are more likely than non-churchgoers to report higher life satisfaction and a greater feeling of connection to their community than non-churchgoers. They are also less likely to report frequently feeling anxious or depressed – particularly young women.

The report makes for fascinating reading. As I write we are still in the season of Easter, which celebrates the new life that Jesus brings through rising from the dead – both spiritually but also physically. It is great to perceive a "spiritual Spring" in the air to match the Spring weather we have been enjoying (at least by the time I am writing!!). **Try Praying** 

If are interesting in what these people had found in God, why not check out 'Try Praying'. These are little booklets available free online (trypraying.org/try-it) or as paper booklets from our churches. Try Praying is simply a seven day practical introduction on how to pray to God and how it can change your life. It is aimed at anyone - whether you've tried praying before or not. Why not try praying?

Our President Cherry welcomed Sue Kershaw from the Bude Lifeboat station to our May meeting. Sue went on to explain the work of the RNLI and how brave volunteers have been saving lives at sea for over 200 years. How there are 238 lifeboat stations around the UK and Ireland, which house 441 lifeboats and 7 hovercrafts.

She went on to tell us first hand stories from our rocky coastline, rough surf and riptides from our own coastal waters, talking about the crew that are bravely on call 24 hours a day, from Summerlease Beach in North Cornwall which results in many call outs.

Members were given a chance to try on some of the equipment that the crew wear. She explained that as volunteers raise awareness to try and keep people safe, she was now going into schools to educate children on water safety.

Of course, none of this is possible without our donations, for the boats, kit, and the training crews need to stay safe and save lives. The RNLI is a charity and is independent of the government.

She was thanked by Annie who felt that people need to know just how important it is to learn about the dangers of the sea and our coastline, and what to do in a situation.

Members are now looking forward to a visit to Bude Lifeboat station.

The winner of flower of the month was Gilian, with Doris winning the sea competition.

Members recently enjoyed a beautiful sunny walk with local historian Paul Rendell through the bluebell woods near Meldon, looking at the local history.

We recently held a very successful coffee morning and plant sale, also providing tea and cakes at the VE celebrations at Exbourne playing field.

Our June 10th meeting in the evening at Exbourne Hall, will be Neil and Kerry Littleales talking about the National Open Garden Scheme. Come along and see what the WI has to offer, you might like to join us.



As this service has been discontinued, how might we encourage reading and the love of good book, rather than those appearing on a screen? There is nothing wrong with reading from a screen, but for so many of us holding a book and turning its pages is part of the reading experience. For this reason, the Town Council would like to announce the start of a free book swap at the Town Council Office. Reading covers so many topics. Locally here in the Town, everything from allotment life, baking, languages, travel and the environment are all current trends, as are novels, and of course the poetry of the late Ted Hughes, who lived here and continues to inspire many. Children's literature is integral to the education provided by our primary school and young adults are encouraged to read a range of genres through schools, and there are no end of interests from which we can all be inspired to read.

Our team would like to get you started with ideas from books we have recently read, which include the following:

The Edible Garden by Alys Fowler, on how to grow a garden you can eat and become more self-sufficient. North Woods by Daniel Mason, an interesting historical tale told from the perspective of a house through the centuries.

Private Rogue by James Patterson, where a missing person's case turns out to be something else entirely. The Golden Road by William Dalrymple, on how ancient India transformed the world.

The Elephant Whisperer by Lawrence Anthony, which is a story of a couple who unexpectedly inherited a herd of elephants.

The night circus by Erin Morgenstern, a fantasy read of a magical kind.

A Lover of Unreason Yehuda Koren and Eilat Negev, A biography of Assia Wevill.

## **Okehampton & District Local History Society**

Our next talk will be given by Professor Jon Lawrence, on 'The Search for Community in Post-war England'. Wednesday, 11th June - 7.30 p.m.

The Ockment Centre, Okehampton.

All welcome. Visitors £3.00.

In his talk for the Okehampton and District Local History Society, Professor Lawrence will explore how the meaning and experience of community has changed over the past eighty years (using local research through the eyes of ordinary people), how we should understand the growth of individualism, and what we can learn from this history to help us build stronger communities for the future.

Jon Lawrence is Professor of Modern British History at the University of Exeter. He works on modern British social, cultural and political history from the 1840s to the present. He has published extensively on the history of popular politics, electioneering and social class in modern Britain. His latest book, Me, Me, Me? The Search for Community in Post-war England (Oxford paperback 2023) uses personal testimony collected by social scientists since the 1940s to challenge conventional accounts of the death of community and relentless rise of selfish individualism. His previous books include Speaking for the People: Party, Language and Popular Politics in England, 1867-1914 (Cambridge 1998), and Electing Our Masters: the Hustings in British Politics from Hogarth to Blair (Oxford 2009).

## **BONDLEIGH RAINFALL**

April was another interesting month! After the exceptionally dry March, April was the wettest April since 2012. You may be surprised to read this because most of the month was mainly dry. However, on the night of the 14th there was 62.6mm making a total of 90.9mm for the month. This compares to 70.9mm last year and a massive 158.7mm in 2012. This not only made April a wet month, but the 14th was the wettest 24hr period since I starting measuring rainfall in 1996. We seem to be getting one record after another at the moment. Climate Changel?

On a different, but connected, matter, I read the Ramblings of a N.T W.I. member with some concern. It was the flippant nature with which Mrs. Knott referred to her husband's rainfall readings. I was certainly interested to read that his reading for March was even lower than mine and I know that a lot of other people (men) would be too. This shows just how localised our weather is. 

## North Tawton Bowling Club


North Tawton Bowling Club win their first trophy of the season.

Regular readers of this part of "Roundabout" will have seen how recently it has drawn attention to local opportunities to take part in Lino Printing, Open mic festival, Acting and Movement workshop, visiting artist demonstrations and exhibitions, all designed to encourage interest and participation in local events by bringing them closer to your doorstep. Now comes another musical event to Sampford Courtenay where, in 2018 and 2019 a programme of choral and orchestral music was given, the proceeds from which were passed to local charities.

There will be a broad selection of music from 16<sup>th</sup> century to the present day and we hope for as good an audience as we had in 2018 and 2019 so that we can offer support to two deserving local charities from the efforts of local musicians.
