# **Matters Arising:**

# **Bookings**:

- There have been two enquiries. One for pickle ball for 90 mins a week- RR will contact regarding this. Also for a weekly collage session but as yet this has gone no further.

It is very positive that more people are showing interest in hiring the Hall.

#### Feedback on events:

- Sunday 29th June Grand Fete: at least 150 people attended and a good number of children. It was a great community event. The band was a definite asset and it proved its worth taking a risk sometimes. The pre-sale of raffle tickets worked really well too and good support was received from local businesses for the prizes. The Church's and the village hall working together well helped with the success of the Fete. Having a good community event is the important thing and money isn't the key. However the Fete was the biggest profit this year.
- Records and administration (exception reporting only):

#### Maintenance schedule:

- The fire doors have been checked.
- The small hall curtain has been fixed.
- The new entrance door is rubbing when shutting- BT will explore this further.
- Hedges need cutting by the steps but this can be tackled on the Garden Tidy day.
- AM is talking to the contractor about the loose slates and a problem with the flat roof.

**Review Accident Book**: Nothing reported. **Smoke alarm check:** tested and working.

#### -AOB:

- -Jon E: there are some big cracks on one corner of the hall. BT explained these were historical and the problem had been dealt with previously. It was agreed that the cracks should be filled in some way to stop water ingress.
- MB asked if a can crusher could be obtained for use by the bar after events. This was agreed and he will obtain one.
- RR: the window cleaner is booked to clean the windows in August.
- RR: Jess from the Chapel will plant Nicotiana plants at the hall and has asked about further gardening at the Hall. ATG suggested wild flowers could be sown on the rough patch of ground and that the Garden day would be the perfect time to do this. It was suggested that Jess be invited to the garden tidy and could take charge of the road edge bed in future.
- The field next to the Hall was discussed and RR will talk to the owners about this.
